TERRITORIAL FLAG

The approach of Centennial Year, and the accompanying interest and activity generated in the history, tradition, culture, and emblems of Canadian life, reminds us that as yet the Northwest Territories lacks an emblem suitable for widespread public display. Several rejuests for the use of a Territorial flag, and a number of others scaking its design for display purposes have been received from associations and the general public.

A banner bearing the Territorial shield on a white background has been flying for some time at Malton Airport in Toronto. Much favourable comment has been received by the administration on this particular design, and it is recommended that Council adopt it as the official Territorial flag.

Because a number of requests for use of the flag are awaiting replies, it is urged that Council approve this design now so that the Northwest Territories may be represented by it in Centennial celebrations. A detailed set of regulations and directions for the manufacture and use of the flag will be prepared as soon as possible.

Recommendations

The Commissioner therefore recommends that Council adopt the flag described above as the Territorial flag.
