Report on Construction and Maintenance Allotments  
in the Appropriation Ordinance 1965 - 66.

Introduction.

At its First Session, 1966, Council requested that Sessional Paper No. 17, Report on Construction and Maintenance Allotments in the Appropriation Ordinance 1965-66, be revised to comply with Council's request at the June 1965 Session. This paper includes the information requested updated to January 1, 1966.

CAPITAL ACCOUNTS - MACKENZIE DISTRICT

1. Allotment 1001 - Territorial Share of Construction and Improvement of Federal Schools and Related Buildings.
- 

Cambridge Bay

Construction of thirteen-classroom school and two-hundred-pupil hostel, semi-finished working drawings have been circulated to various interested parties for approval. Site selected, tender call planned for the Spring of 1966.

Fort McPherson

Construction of four-classroom school with gymnasium. Contract was let by D.P.W. to Byrnes and Hall Construction Co. Ltd. Piles were installed but material was delivered too late by barge for the contractor (Byrnes & Hall) to complete the work in 1965-66.

Fort Providence

Planning underway for two-classroom addition to present school. Working drawings are completed. Contract-advertising planned for the Spring of 1966.

Hay River

Consultant being hired to prepare working drawings for new Elementary School. Installation of new heating system in existing school 80% complete. No revisions will be made to the existing building until the new elementary school is in operation.

Inuvik

D.P.W. is preparing working drawings for sixteen-classroom high school. Tender call planned for early 1966.

Pine Point

Four-classroom school complete and operating.

Rae

Construction of fifteen-classroom school and two-hundred-pupil hostel. A consultant has completed feasibility study of the site.

Tuktoyaktuk

A contract let to Yukon Construction for the addition to the school.

Miscellaneous

Eight temporary classrooms purchased. Two are in operation at Hay River; two at Inuvik; one to be erected at Rae and two at Fort Smith. One additional unit to be stored at Hay River for delivery to Inuvik by barge.

2. Allotment 1002 - Territorial Share of Equipment for Federal Schools, Student Residences and Vocational Training.

Fort Providence

Furniture ordered and two temporary classrooms in operation in school basement.

Pine Point

Furniture installed in school.

Tuktoyaktuk

Furnishings for two additional classrooms on hand; no additional furniture ordered.

Miscellaneous Capital Equipment

Playground equipment, audio-visual, etc., ordered as required, Vocational and adult education proceeding as required and applications for individuals requiring training are continuing to be processed.

3. Allotment 1003 - Grant to Yellowknife School District No. 1

New nine-classroom elementary school in operation.

4. Allotment 1006 - Loans to Yellowknife School District No. 1

Done.

5. Allotment 1007 - School Facilities for Retarded Children

Yellowknife

Gravel pad and timbers - completed.  
Building erected during fiscal year 65/66.

6. Allotment 4001 - Construction of local Roads in Settlements Outside Municipalities and Local Improvement Districts

Coppermine

Work was carried out by departmental employees using equipment at the site - 80% - Completed.

Fort Liard

\$3,000 - Contract to Keene Construction. Completed December 1965. Settlement service roads were rough graded and ditched, some temporary and some permanent culverts installed. These roads will require gravelling in the 1966-67 program in order to make them meet minimum all-weather standards. Approximately one mile of settlement road was reconstructed, connecting Blocks A, B, C, D, & E with one road. Also, service roads from this area were constructed to the emergency airstrip.

Fort Providence

Settlement streets gravelled and graded - culverts requisitioned. Expect all funds will be used.

Rae

Materials delivered to construct a walk on the bridge. Work being carried out during the winter months. Material on site for construction of bridge approaches.

Aklavik

A contract for \$7,189 let to D. Storr. Gravel contracted from Roy Hansen at \$3,675. Gravel was delivered to the settlement but used for resurfacing the existing roads in the settlement. No attempt was made by the successful contractor to commence work on the contract although corduroy logs and culverts were available, and borrow fill could be moved more easily in the fall. Contractor stated it was too late to start when contract was awarded.

Fort McPherson

A \$4,940 contract let to Roy Wright to construct a shale-borrow pit is completed. (The only available contractor was tied up on other work; therefore, nothing further could be done on the Territorial program.)

Fort Resolution

Three contracts totalling \$13,200 let to Slave River Construction - work completed.

Fort Norman

Contract for \$2,100 let to J. Hardy - completed.

Fort Good Hope

Contract for \$5,000 let to Roy Corless for work from docking area to the R.C.M.P. Possible to do only a certain amount of work on this project because C.N.T. were working on phone lines at the same time. Work carried out satisfactorily and surface gravelled. (95½ hrs. Cat. time; 643½ cu. yds. gravel; actual cost \$4,995).

Tuktoyaktuk

Contract let to Federal Electric Corporation for rental of a tractor-scraper to spread gravel - work completed.

Arctic Red River

Contract for \$3,000 let to Steinbring Brothers. Only \$900 of work completed owing to the weather. Day labour used in the installation of culverts.

Cambridge Bay

No work carried out. A contract No. M-714-65-T was drawn up with Fred Ross and Associates covering the rental of equipment. As the equipment was committed to other work, Mr. Ross failed to honour the contract, therefore, the contract was cancelled. No work was carried out other than by departmental labour forces.

Spence Bay

Construction of trail and gravel walk through settlement - completed. Work carried out by day labour. Further road work carried out under the Community Assistance Welfare Program.

7. Allotment 4002 - Construction of Sidewalks in Settlements Outside Municipalities and Local Improvement Districts.

Aklavik

All funds expended to purchase lumber from Aklavik Sawmill.

Coppermine

No work carried out. It is the general opinion of the residents that good roads or trails are preferable to sidewalks.

Fort Franklin

Indian Affairs Sawmill will produce materials this winter from local logs.

Fort McPherson

Lumber for sidewalks was purchased from Aklavik to be delivered summer of 1966. Sidewalks were constructed from lumber loaned by Fort McPherson Community Association. We believe there is only one privately owned sawmill, this was used for cutting lumber for federal use.

Fort Providence

Contract let to W. Myren for construction of sidewalks - \$3,000 of work was completed. Expect that remainder of contract will be completed before June of 1966.

Fort Resolution

Area Administrator advises that people of Fort Resolution think sidewalks unnecessary owing to road construction with ditch which precludes installation of sidewalks within road allowance.

Inuvik

Materials purchased from Aklavik Sawmill - prefabrication of sidewalk sections to be carried out this winter.

Spence Bay

Gravel walk completed through settlement. This and item under 4001 combined as one project.

Cambridge Bay

No work carried out. The area Administrators believe that it is a waste of funds to construct sidewalks when access roads are not fully complete. In some settlements, we have used these funds to construct gravel walks in and around the settlement.

8. Allotment 4003 - Fire Protection in Settlements Outside  
Municipalities and Local Improvement Districts

Aklavik

Fire alarm system completed and fire fighting equipment ordered.

Arctic Red River

Storage shed prefabricated in Inuvik and shipped to site - extinguishers requisitioned. Upon completion of the distribution system, 2HP siren will be installed.

Coppermine

Fire protection system completed.

Fort McPherson

A \$16,500 fire truck ordered. Site chosen for fire hall - no materials delivered to site. Fire alarm system completed.

Fort Good Hope

Siren set up.

Cambridge Bay

Work delayed due to planning of D.O.T.'s proposed installation of an annunciator panel. Several memoranda exchanged with Director, Northern Administration Branch on the subject.

Fort Providence

Materials requisitioned.

Fort Norman

Materials amounting to \$1,100 purchased.

Rae

\$1,400 expended for equipment and materials.

Inuvik

Materials requisitioned in accordance with Fire Marshal's recommendations.

Pine Point

Fire truck purchased and delivered. Fire alarm system requisitioned - do not expect installations until Northern Canada Power Commission takes over distribution system. Contract let for construction of fire hall.

9. Allotment 4004 - Construction of Camp Grounds and Picnic  
Grounds

Great Slave Lake

Improvement to camp grounds - completed.

Prelude Lake

Improvement to camp grounds - completed.

10. Allotment 4005 - Street Lighting in Settlements Outside Municipalities and Local Improvement Districts.

Arctic Red River

Purchase of street lights underway - will be installed when electrical distribution system erected.

Cambridge Bay

Material was requisitioned, funds expended. Funds will be included in the 1966-67 Territorial appropriations for installation.

Coppermine

Material on site. Street lighting not installed due to the power shortage at the settlement. 50% completed.

Fort Liard

Six street lights apparently purchased and installed out of 1964-65 funds.

Only one of six street lights provided for in 1965-66 was installed. No others can be located.

This matter being investigated further.

Funds will be included in 1966-67 appropriations for maintenance of 12 street lights.

Fort McPherson

Northern Canada Power Commission requested to install street lights.

Fort Norman

Street lights requisitioned but new distribution system not yet completed.

Inuvik

Fixtures being purchased for installation by Northern Canada Power Commission.

11. Allotment 4006 - Construction and Clearing of Fire Breaks

Fort Good Hope

Contract for \$1,500 let to R. Corless for clearing.

Fort McPherson

Contract for \$2,930 let to Roy Wright to supply shale for grading.

Fort Norman

Contract for \$1,500 let to J. Hardy for grading.

Lac La Martre

Work to be carried out as Winter Works Project - \$4,500 application approved. Work completed.



Snowdrift

\$2,000 of day labour completed - series of Winter Works Projects approved for this work. Work completed.

Jean Marie River

Project N.W.T. 4 - 65/66 = \$900 - completed. Project started mid-February. Existing fire break extended 100 yards, old and new slash burned, firewood salvaged.

Fort Liard

Winter works project N.W.T. 6 = \$1,800.00. 50% approximately completed. Project not started until 1st April, 1966, as trapping has been good. Clearing and burning of old slash area - salvaging of firewood.

Nahanni Butte

Winter works project N.W.T. 8 = \$2,000 - completed. Project started in January - old and new slash cut and burned - firewood salvaged.

Trout Lake

Project N.W.T. 11 = \$3,000 - completed. Firebreak 2,500 feet by 150 feet - slashed and burned. Firewood salvaged.

Rocher River

\$3,000 Winter Works Project on firebreak clearing will be carried out.

Pine Point

\$14,000 will be expended under Winter Works Program for fire break clearing.

Fort Resolution

\$4,000 will be expended on fire break clearing under Winter Works Program.

12. Allotment 4007 - Water and Sewer Systems in Settlements

Aklavik

Some materials delivered to site; work underway. Expect 50% of work will be completed by April, 1966.

Fort Providence

Sewage truck purchased and in use.

Pine Point

Water and sewer installation completed to trailer court and residential block and commercial area serviced.

13. Allotment 4008 - Relocation and Extension - Fort Simpson  
Emergency Landing Strip

Amount allotted 65/66 appropriation = \$4,750.  
\$4,480 service contract let to Simpson Construction. Contract

completed Fall, 1965 but work not sufficient to complete estimated requirements. Winter Works Project N.W.T. 1 for \$9,000 commenced November 15, 1965 with \$3,010 contract to Simpson Construction. This covered stumping old and new slash area and ditching on west side of runway - completed. N.A.N.R. warehouse fence relocated - all slashing for approaches and side clearances, for a 3,000' x 100' runway completed. Firewood and good log material salvaged.

14. Allotment 5005 - Construction of Sidewalks Within Local Improvement Districts

Fort Simpson

Amount allotted - 65/66 appropriations = \$5,200 - completed. Materials purchased early in 65-66. Some construction of panels completed prior to December 1965, balance completed by March, 1966. One-half mile of sidewalk was constructed and laid as soon as snow was gone.

15. Allotment 5006 - Town Planning and Development

Fort Simpson

Completed December 1965. Contracts let to Simpson Construction - preliminary gravelling completed in Lot 5 on subdivision access roads. Grading final ditching, and installation of culverts in Lots 21 and 23 completed. Lot 5 and Lots 21 and 23 subdivisions require more gravel for existing roads.

16. Allotment 5010 - Winter Works Program

30 approved projects proceeding - surplus funds transferred from other allotments to cover cost.

17. Allotment 5013 - Water and Sewer System

Hay River

Work proceeding on intake - contract let to B. G. Linton. Water line supply to new subdivision proceeding under contract to Poole Construction. Incentive feature of the contract is working to advantage.

18. Allotment 6001 - Bombardier Winter Trails

Used by Game Division during winter months for payment of casual labour engaged to provide trails.

19. Allotment 5009 - Water and Sewer Systems in Local Improvement Districts

Fort Simpson

Fluoridation in Water Treatment Plant. Completed March 1966. Fluoridation equipment was installed November 65, operating January 1966. System was not operating until January due to late arrival of test equipment.

Fort Smith

Water and sewer extension on Camsell Street now complete.

20. Allotment 5015 - Water Main Extension to Gaol Site - Yellowknife

Completed.

21. Allotment 8001 - Construction or Acquisition of Buildings,  
Land and Equipment for Liquor System

Working drawings for Hay River Liquor Store completed - contract will be advertised in near future. Inuvik Liquor Store modifications completed. Three-bedroom apartment on top of Inuvik Liquor Store not approved because of structural problems.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES - MACKENZIE DISTRICT

22. Allotment 403 - Maintenance of Local Roads in Settlements  
Outside Municipalities and Local Improvement  
Districts

Aklavik

\$5,650 day labour used on settlement roads. Two contracts let to J.S. Wilson for snow clearance and maintenance of garbage disposal area.

Rae

\$1,000 day labour expended and \$504 contract let to Mrs. V. Kimbell for snow removal.

Tuktoyaktuk

Equipment rented at \$1,100 for maintenance. \$310 spent on day labour.

Enterprise

Road maintenance carried out with Federal maintenance equipment. Journalized entry will be made to cover cost.

Fort Franklin

No expenditures made. A contractor hauling gravel did some road work in the settlement.

Fort Good Hope

Contract for \$1,200 let to R. Corless for road maintenance and garbage disposal. \$230 spent on day labour.

Fort Liard

Service contract to R. J. Keene = \$1,500.  
Rental of motor grader.  
Completed December 1965.  
This contract was used in conjunction with the construction contracts let to Keene during the same period.

Fort McPherson

Contract let to Roy Wright for \$1,800 to carry out road maintenance. Additional \$2,600 spent on day labour and purchase of culverts.

Fort Norman

Contract was let to J. Hardy for gravel and grading.

Fort Providence

Mackenzie Highway maintenance equipment carried out maintenance. Journal entry will be made to cover cost.

Fort Resolution

\$900 spent on road maintenance day labour.

Inuvik

\$7,400 spent to date, using Departmental equipment and day labour.

Pine Point

Arrangements made for Pine Point Mines to carry out present road maintenance; to be paid by Territorial Government.

23. Allotment 408 - Water and Sewer System in Settlements

Fort Providence

Water and sewage system now in operation with two trucks. Contract let for supply of water and removal of sewage in Federal installations. Water and sewage truck handling all other users. Expected that all services in future will be supplied by the two Territorial Government trucks.

Rae

Two trucks in operation for water and sewer services. \$19,000 expended to date.

24. Allotment 410 - Site Investigation for settlement of Rae

Site investigation for new school and hostel. Investigation and planning being carried out. As of January 1, 1966 - 35% completed.

25. Allotment 504 - Maintenance of Local Roads Within Local Improvement Districts

Fort Simpson

Amount \$10,200 voted 65-66 Appropriation.  
Funds at start of fiscal year 65-66 - \$10,200.00

Three contracts to Simpson Construction	\$ 4,810.00
Road oil	2,827.15
Day labour and miscellaneous	2,003.38

Total expended \$9,640.53

26. Allotment 509 - Insect Control and Spring Cleanup in Local Improvement Districts

Insect Control - Insecticides purchased and pellets spread. More insecticides ordered November 2, 1965 - but not yet received.

Spring cleanup - no funds expended Spring 1965. \$296.40 expended in March for a town garbage haul. Completed March 1966.
