Memorandum of Understanding

NORTHWEST TERRITORIES – NUNAVUT

AGREEMENT – LEGISLATION AND REGULATION OF NORTHERN EMPLOYEE BENEFITS SERVICES PENSION PLAN

Between:

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES, as represented by the Minister of Finance (hereinafter referred to as the 'GNWT'),

and

THE GOVERNMENT OF NUNAVUT, as represented by the Minister of Community and Government Services (hereinafter referred to as the 'GN'),

collectively, the 'Parties'.

Whereas the Northern Employee Benefits Services (NEBS) pension plan is considered to be a public sector multi-employer pension plan that currently operates within both the Northwest Territories and Nunavut without the benefit of enabling or supervising legislation; and

Whereas the NEBS Board of Directors has previously requested that both the GNWT and the GN provide NEBS with legislative and regulatory certainty; and

Whereas the GNWT and the GN have agreed to consider a coordinated approach to developing legislation to regulate the NEBS pension plan within their respective territories.

Now Therefore the GNWT and the GN agree as follows:

Purpose

This Agreement is intended to express the commitments of the Parties to develop legislation for introduction in their respective Legislative Assemblies that is designed to legislate and regulate the NEBS pension plan within both territories.

Principles

The following principles have been agreed to by both governments in the spirit of working collaboratively towards a common goal:

- Legislative and regulatory certainty is required for the NEBS pension plan and its members;
- Supporting the goals of healthy communities and self-reliance, both for communities and individuals, is a priority for both governments.

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Work Plan

1. A work plan is established (Appendix A) and agreed to by both Parties that outlines the objectives, activities, responsibilities, outcomes and estimated timelines to guide the development of legislation to be enacted by both Parties.

Consultation

The GNWT and the GN agree that together they will consult with the NEBS Board of Directors concerning NEBS legislation. This consultation commitment will be fulfilled through the development of a working group consisting of representatives from the GNWT, the GN and NEBS.

Financial Matters

3. The parties agree to equally share the cost of any external legal advice required to assist with the research and development of the multi-jurisdictional agreement, legislative proposal and draft legislation referenced in the work plan identified above, such legal advice to be subject to prior approval by both parties.

Effect of the Agreement

- 4. This Agreement is not legally binding, but is an expression and record of the purpose and intent of the Parties, to which each honourably pledge themselves.
- Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to affect the jurisdictional responsibility of either Party.

Amendments

6. This Agreement, and the work plan referenced in Appendix A, may be reviewed and amended based on mutual agreement by both Parties.
