Program Components, Description, Eligibility and Maximum Funding

The Federal/Provincial/Territorial Growing Forward Agreement signed in the Fall 2009 sets out the general framework for investments to be made in agriculture and agri-foods in Canada.

The Canada/Northwest Territories Growing Forward Agreement offers investment in the agriculture sector in the Northwest Territories on a 60 - 40 percent (Canada - NWT respectively) cost-shared basis. The term for the Growing Forward Agreement is April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2013.

Growing Forward offers support in eight different program areas. The purpose and eligibility for each type of support is shown in the chart below.
