Dear Sir :

We, the residents of Coral Harbour, wish to express our dissatisfaction with the service we are receiving from the Coral Harbour Post Office.

It would be tedious to enumerate fully the occasions upon which mail has failed to arrive in the settlement for several weeks. C.O.D. parcels have lain there for up to three months before the owner has been notified and more serious delay has occurred when registered mail has been mislaid for periods up to two months.

D.O.T. personnel do not like handling the mail. The turn-over of post-masters is considerable. If we are to have a postal service worthy of the name we should have an office right here in the settlement where more than three hundred people live. There are Eskimos who could carry the responsibility and do the job effectively if given the opportunity.

We trust that we be heard in this matter and that something be done to improve the present situation.
