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GENERAL INFORMATION

Sales

Sales revenue increased by 15% over the previous year. As indicated in the following table, the average annual increase in sales over the past eight years has been 12% per year. The largest annual increase (17.7%) occurred in 1966-67, to be followed by the lowest increase (1.2% in volume) in 1967-68, which reflects the initial reaction to the selling price being increased by 9% in that year.

Inspections

Licenced premises and stores

The supervision and inspection of stores and licenced premises has been limited in frequency and thoroughness by the lack of adequate inspection staff.

A routine inspection was made of most of the licenced premises by store managers and the assistant accountant. The deficiencies noted and the remedies instituted as result of these inspections emphasize the benefit that would derive from expanding this service and would ensure that the licencees discharge fully their obligations to the public.

Buildings and Equipment

The Liquor System continued to occupy six stores owned by the N.W.T. Government.

Major repairs required to the store in Norman Wells were not carried out satisfactorily necessitating further work in 1969. While these renovations were being carried out temporary accommodation was made available, at no cost to the System, by Imperial Oil Limited.

A failure in the controls of the Yellowknife store steam heating system caused extensive damage to the boiler; the heating system will be converted to hot water during the summer of 1969.

All other buildings required only routine maintenance.

At the year's end seven employees occupied Government accommodation, three in Yellowknife, one in each of Inuvik, Fort Smith, Hay River and Frobisher Bay.

<u>Outlets</u>

One new outlet was opened with the Hudson's Bay Company being appointed Beer Agent in Cambridge Bay.

The beer store in Fort Simpson expanded its services and now handles liquor, wine and beer.

A local option plebiscite was held in Cambridge Bay, as a result of which the previous mentioned Beer Agency was opened.
