to Langton bay and slowly around the 20s moved to Darnly bay (Letty Harbour and finaly in 1935 to Paulatuk where we are now.

In 1957 attracted by the monster DEW LINE the population moved to Cape-Parry but just for more security, communication, dector facilities.... as it is natural for the poor to look at the rich. But in 1965 when modern facilities become available to us by housing program we moved

back to Baulatuk decided to live from the land and organized our life

by ourselves. We are firmly determined to stay here just wishing for more trappers and hunters to come as the country can support a bigger popuzition

lation. If we write these few Ilines it is only to protect our identity.
