I enclose herewith a letter to the Commissioner of the Northwest Territories on the matter of the Fort Rae re-construction job last summer which I discussed with you some time ago. This is the contract given Estabrook Construction of Grimshaw, Alberta., contents of enclosed letter you will understand thoroughly after perusal.

Mou will note that copies of this letter have been sent on to the persons noted bottom page 2. In a covering letter to Mr. Chretien, Minister of I.A. & M. Development, I have also mentioned the general situation here in the Territories., the fact that the Territorial Government Dept. of Public Works: is actually increasing their participation in road building and maintenance work, to the detriment of private enterprise in the form of resident N.W.T. general road construction contractors.

Estabrook Will \$7,315.00, being about 25% of his total bid, and it should be remembered that I was to use N.W.T. operators while Estabrook and his operators were from libert.

I do hope you and Mick Sibbeston manage to have these matters fully discussed with the Territorial Council and bring about changes for the better - the Territorial Covernment should confine themselves to the administrative end of Coverrment only. This is what they are put in for, and not to engage in a business such as road construction or maintenance.

Re: Re-construction fort Ree Highway Tryitation to Mid - June 25, 1971.

Further to my letter of July 18, 1971 in which a comparison was made of the successful bid (stabreck destruction, of Grimsbaw, Alberta to that of our Company, to which I have not one yet have had any reply or comment from your Department, of Tublic Jorks, Highways Division, I now feel this whole matter should now be brought to your attention.

To atart with your "Invitation to Bid" dated dune 25,1071 and forwarded to me. I would call your attention to the fact that the "opartment stated the Bodel of Twin Lowered Gerepers required must be of 1867 or later odel. To the best of my knowledge there are no much machines in the Bodel, western Region caned by any Contractor, or even by the Rosell. Public works department. I would also like to add "that on my asking your Dr. Okojeted if Sotabrook Construction had been asked to bid in this matter, I was informed they had been asked prior to Invitation to Bid being put out by B.T...

The acaser to just way Tetabrook Construction of Grimshaw, Ilta were the successful bidders finally (there were only two bids) at a bid price of 17.018.65 above that of Justice Generalism now seems obvious - because the read 1907 erapers, or later as acked for were not available in the 1.7. Ferritories - this would automatically put as 1.7.7. bid out of competition in this particular case. I would like to know the reason for the 1.7.4. stipulation the age of any satisment to be used on any type of road equipment? The fact that istances Construction was further employed on the Resolution Highway in the fall of 1071, (and this without Tender or request for bids), and after work having been commanced by them, the failure to obtain any trucker from May River truckers to assist on the job would tend to show that Estabrock Construction onlywers to be given this Contract.

It should be further rated that while Satubrook would employ only two (2) operators on this job, Sueller Construction were to ampley five (3) operators, also the latter would have been not find to the tention of the tention of the form they siver, i.e., and not alberta. By operators were all from they siver, i.e.,

The information I obtained on the stabrock was given me on my respect to both Mr. Bentley and Skogstad when Bids were opened at Enterprise, N. N. T. on the 9th July, only 8 days prior to commencement of work date which was stated as "the week of the 19th of July. It must be assumed, therefore, that Estabrock was on the date of opening Bids, July 9th, 1971, all set to proceed from Crimshaw, Alberta to Fort Ree, N. N. T. (a distance of approximately 500 miles) to be able to commence work on the Contract the week of July 12th, actually 8 days later.

Do you feel, as Commissioner of the Territories, that the method of "Invitation to Bid", as used by P.P.W., and especially the stipulation on Year of Model equipment to be used would be any encouragement to P.W.T. contractors to enter a bid? Further to this, do you feel that in giving a centract such as this to an Alberta contractor who employs resident. of Alberta as his operators, is in any way doing anything for the Unemployment situation as it now exists in the Territories.

I do know that other persons and Cocieties in the M.J.T. are most interested in matters of this nature, and I also regard the matter of contracts generally and the one I have now referred to you, as being one which you should properly discuss most thoroughly with your repartment of Tublic Corks and those who are responsible for highway construction and maintenance in the Highways division of D.F.W.

The feet that a contractor from Alberta was employed to take on a contract at 132,000.00 at a distance of well over 500 miles from his establishment, and at a total price of 47,315.00 more than the only other bidder (\$25,535.00) who is an \$1.7.7. resident contractor, and about 300 miles distant from the project, would appear to call for a reasonable explanation.

I hope I shall have comething from you on this matter.
