Because of the slight downward trend in the use of spirits, and virtual no growth in beer consumption, the change in absolute alcohol consumed remained relatively unchanged.

Liquor Licensing Board

The Board held seven meetings during the fiscal period April 1, 1977 to March 31, 1978, with six in Yallowknife and one in Frobisher Bay. During the period five licences were suspended for periods of up to two weeks and included one suspension for an indefinite period for infractions of the Liquor Ordinance.

Eleven additional licences were issued and two licences were transferred because of a change in ownership.

The Board continued the practise of holding public meetings if objections were received from the public opposing the granting of a new licence. These meetings have provided a forum for interested parties to present their views to the Board.

Mr. Gerry Reimann from Yellowknife was appointed to the Board. Mr. Bill Erasmus' resignation from the Board was accepted with regret.

I have examined the statement of assets and liabilities of the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System as at March 31, 1978 and the statements of operations and equity for the year then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests and other procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

As stated in Note 2, no cost is included in the financial statements for the use of fixed assets and which are owned by the Government of the Northwest Territories and provided without charge.

In my opinion, except that a fair charge for the use of the fixed assets is not recorded, these financial statements present fairly the financial position of the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System as at March 31, 1978 and the results of its operations for the year then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Notes to Financial Statements March 31, 1978

1. <u>Nature of operations</u>

Under the Northwest Territories Liquor Ordinance, the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System is responsible for administering the purchase, sale and control of consumption of liquor in the Northwest Territories. In order to enable the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System to administer its operation, the Government of the Northwest Territories authorized advances of up to \$2,500,000.

2. Fixed assets

Buildings, fixtures and fittings owned by the Government of the Northwest Territories are provided for the use of the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System without cost.

3. Anti-Inflation Act

As part of the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Northwest Territories Liquor Control System is subject to and, in the opinion of management, has complied with the Anti-Inflation Act.
