The Local Education Authority of Sanikiluag, N.W.T. wrote their own thoughts towards Cultural Inclusion money being decreased for year 1980-81.

1. We are usually short of money for education purposes. We would like an increase in the budget so that we can continue our cultural inclusion program.

2. We would like an increase in the budget for continuing the cultural inclusion program.

Lucassie Kattuk, L.E.A. Vice-Chairman.

3. We would like an increase in the budget for continuing the cultural inclusion program so that students could be taught hunting, Inuktitut, and English without the L.E.A. having to struggle for funds. Government should not cut the budget for cultural inclusion.

Johnassie Iqaluq, L.E.A. Councillor.

I think students should be taught how to hunt, camping, the names of places and plants, the weather, the old ways of living, how to build igloos and how to survive on their own. For these reasons I don't want a cut-back in our budget for education. The girls must be taught how to sew.

Noah Arragutainaq, L.E.A. Councillor.

5. I don't agree with the budget cut-backs for cultural inclusion. I have children who will be attending the cultural inclusion program. We have been told that the budget for this program is being discussed and might either be increased or decreased. If they are not going to increase the budget, the children might as well not attend school. The money that the communities now receive from government are no longer enough. We should be consulted before the government decides how much money we are going to get. As the enrolment increases, the funding should also increase.

Samson Meeko, L.E.A. Councillor.

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6. The money allotted in the 1979-80 fiscal year wasn't sufficient; it did not cover all the programs we intended to carry out. Funds for 1980 will probably be insufficient due to increasing enrolment and inflation. The \$150,000 should be given back to the committee.

7. The money allotted for 1979 was not enough. As a result students were idle during the spring and summer months after having been out on the land during the winter months. This was very inconvenient to students and their instructors. For the fiscal year 1980 we would like the funds to be increased for this program.

Our children today are forgetting our culture. In order for our young people to be able to practice our old way of living, they must be taught in this program. The young people will be very frustrated if they don't know how to survive by themselves and there is no one to give them assistance. As it is right now whenever the money runs out they are idle. When their elders are no longer around, they will have to learn to survive by themselves. If they don't know how to survive, they will suffer as they are spoiled by the conveniences available to them that we didn't have. They have never face threats of starvation or harsh weather; all they do today is attend school.

A STATE AND A STAT

The Local Education Authority in Sanikiluaq is very upset because funding for school programs in the N.W.T. has not been increased. The funds should be increased because of the increased student inrolment and the increased costs of materials. L.E.A.'s cannot carry out the programs they intended without the government's assistance. The Inuit will not forget the promises the government made to provide suffic ent assistance. Even when the government breaks its promises will will continue to remind them of the promises they made. We would like the government education officials to keep in mind that we will not give up our hopes withoug a fight for them to keep the promises they made.

Although there are six classrooms in Sanikiluaq, there is still not enought classroom space for the students. There is no school bus to transport the students; as a result, students are being transported by skidoo. Transportation should really be handled by the education authorities. Although we could use a school bus, we do not have enough money to provide this transportation.

There are a number of activities that local education authorities would like to carry out but they have never been able to because there has never been enough money. Programs such as various school activities, hunting, igloo building, sewing, technical training, land familiarization, studying animal behaviour and tracking, winter survival, soapstone carving cannot be carried out. All these programs can't be conducted because the government does not provide enough money.

Another reason why the funding should be increased is because of inflation rates. We would also like to recommend that the amount of money being spent on experimental programs should be decreased and that money for education programs should be increased in the N.W.T.

We would like you to consider our suggestions very seriously.
