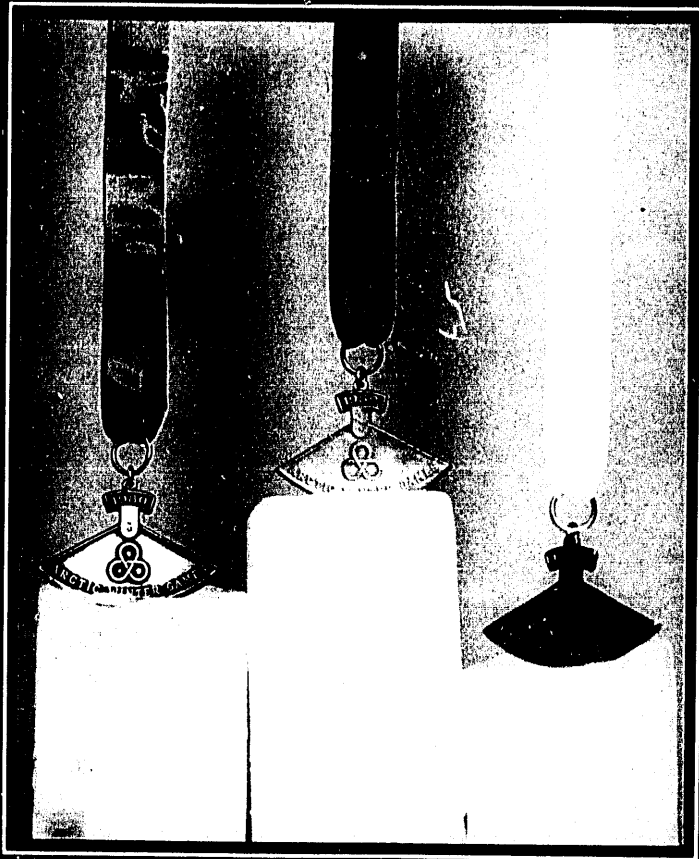

---


I am pleased to have this opportunity to congratulate members of the Northwest Territories Team on their performance at the 1980 Arctic Winter Games.

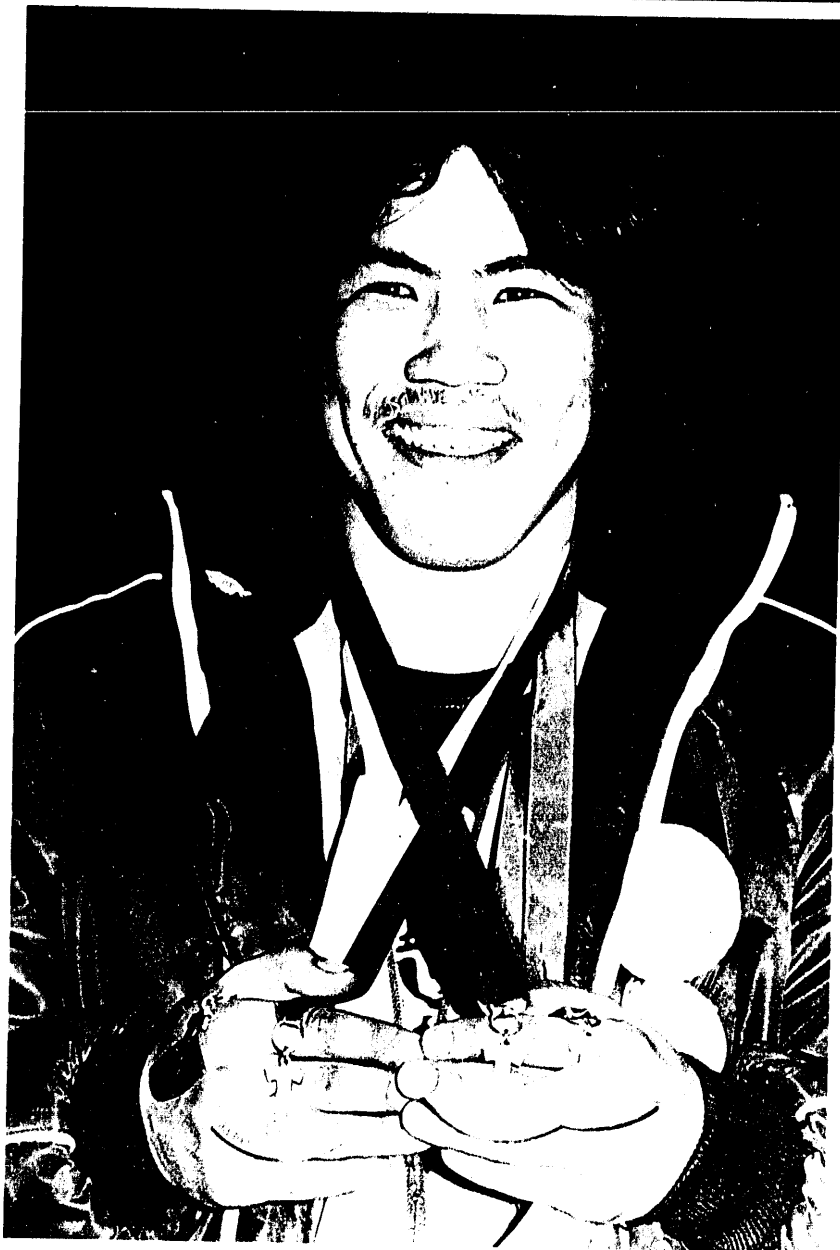

# arctic winter games



The 1967 Jeux Canada Games in Quebec City marked the first time a team of athletes from the Northwest Territories participated in a major national multi-sport competition. This experience led to discussions on a new Winter Games competition format designed specifically for the people who live North of the 60th Parallel.

Government officials from Alaska, Yukon Territory and the Northwest Territories worked together to realize the first Arctic Winter Games in 1970 at Yellowknife, N.W.T. Subsequent games were successfully held in Whitehorse, Yukon Territory in 1972, Anchorage, Alaska in 1974, Schefferville, Quebec, in 1976 and Hay River/Pine Point, N.W.T. in 1978. Le Nouveau Quebec entered the Games as participants in 1976, but withdrew in 1978.

The Games have had a significant impact on the development of sports in the Northwest Territories. Few sport organizations existed in 1970. Twenty-seven sport associations are now active in promoting and developing sports throughout the Northwest Territories.

In response to a growing interest in sport and the need to coordinate and support the effort of emerging sport groups, the Sport North Federation was established in 1977. Sport North now manages the selection of the N.W.T. Team for each Arctic Winter Games and is well underway with preparations for the next Games, to be held in Fairbanks, Alaska in 1982.

# ready... set...

Dreams are often hard to realize. Such is the case of the dream to foster mutual understanding and friendship between the people of the Canadian and United States Arctic through the Arctic Winter Games.

The immense breadth and diversity of Alaska, Yukon Territory and the Northwest Territories provided a formidable task for the games organizers, and the challenge was met with hard work, dedication and perseverance. The result of this effort has been the staging of six successful editions of the Arctic Winter Games. Most recently, Whitehorse, Yukon Territory played host to nearly 1000 athletes and coaches for six days in March in the 1980 version of the Arctic Winter Games.

Any international multi-sport and culture festival owes much of its success to its organizers and supporters, and the Arctic Winter Games is no exception. Planning for the 1980 Games started even before the 1978 Games in Hay River and Pine Point, N.W.T. were completed.

Entrusted with overall responsibility for overseeing the Games and ensuring their continuity, the Board of Directors of the Arctic Winter Games Corporation met during the 1978 Games for the purpose of reviewing bids and selecting the Host City for the 1980 Games. Following tradition, Arctic Winter Games Corporation President, Don Dennis of the State of Alaska announced during closing ceremonies that Whitehorse, Yukon Territory would play host to the next Games in 1980.

The Host Organization immediately began to prepare for 1980. To delegate the many duties involved in organizing the Games, seventeen volunteer committees were established by the Host Society. In addition, sport committees were struck for each of the fifteen sports of the 1980 Games. A list of these committees indicates the responsibilities of the Whitehorse Host Society.

While the Host Society was occupied with its preparations for the 1980 Games, each participating Unit began to organize for the selection and preparation of its athletes and officials. Unique conditions and factors would determine a different approach to the task for each Unit.

In the Northwest Territories a central role was established for Sport North, which is the federation of territorial sport governing bodies. Supported by the Recreation Division of the Territorial government's Department of Local Government, Sport North established a Northwest Territories Arctic Winter Games Organizing Committee.

Its responsibility was to organize and conduct regional competitions and the territorial trials for selection of those teams and individuals making up the Northwest Territories Arctic Winter Games Team.

The N.W.T. was divided into six regions for the purpose of competition: Baffin, Keewatin, Central Arctic, Inuvik, South Slave and North Slave. Regional Coordinators saw that competitions were completed and teams selected for the Territorial Trials held Jan. 18-19, 1980.

Most of the travel costs to regional competition were paid by the communities and the athletes themselves — a considerable contribution since most communities are accessible only by air and in some regions the distances travelled were over five hundred miles.

Our Territorial Trials required one of the most massive air lifts ever attempted in the Northwest Territories. Over 1000 athletes and officials were chartered to one of the eight communities chosen to host the fifteen sport competitions. Some participants travelled over 2500 miles and logged many hours to reach the site of their competition. The logistics of travel arrangements alone were overwhelming, but not only did everyone arrive in time for their competition but all were returned safely to their home community. Our 1980 Territorial Trials were by far the most successful ever.

Without time to savor past accomplishments, organizers immediately set to work to arrange transportation for over 300 competitors to Whitehorse for the week of March 16-22 and the Sixth Arctic Winter Games.

This then, was what went into realizing the dream for those Northwest Territories athletes and coaches who stepped off the plane early March 16 to compete in the 1980 Arctic Winter Games. We hope your memories are vivid, for many have contributed.
