

PREAMBLE

In its simplest expression a spatial price survey compares average consumer price levels of one geographic center with those of another. Conceptually the process is not complex: Retail prices of identical items in two centres are compared to compute price ratios (relatives). These price relatives are then combined to determine overall price differences. In this calculation, each item is weighted according to its percentage of an average household's total expenditure on consumer goods and services. The resulting price relative is expressed as an index number for one city (Yellowknife) where the index for the base city (Edmonton) equals 100.

A. Definitions

To the designation of the late of the late

- Price: prevailing retail price of a good or service collected in Yellowknife or Edmonton during the survey period June 2 to 13, 1980.
 - to ensure valid spatial price comparisons, analysis was limited to goods and services possessing identical model numbers or other distinguishing features.
 - sale prices were included as prevailing retail prices. Their inclusion reflects the mix of sale and regular priced items experienced over the long term.
- Weight: household expenditure for a given item expressed as a percentage of total expenditures for consumer goods and services. The more important an item is to the overall family budget the greater its weight and therefore the greater its contribution to the average price difference -- the aggregate statistic.

- weights used in the spatial price survey are those found in Statistics Canada's 1974 survey of consumer expenditures, adjusted for price movements from 1974 to 1980. In the absence of weights for Yellowknife, Edmonton values were adopted. Spatial comparisons reported in this survey therefore represent price differences in June 1980 that would be experienced by an average Edmonton household moving to Yellowknife and maintaining a 1974 Edmonton consumption pattern.
- results for the June 1980 survey are based on approximately 89% of the weights used in the calculation of the Consumer Price Index (C.P.I.) published by Statistics Canada. Major exclusions are "mortgage interest", "depreciation on dwellings", "expense of other owned accommodation" and "education". Methods for collecting comparable price information in these areas could not be developed within the time constraints of this survey.
- a full list of weights is provided in Appendix C.

Relative:

- at the item level, a relative refers to the ratio of prices observed in Yellowknife and Edmonton. These relatives are combined to form overall price differences and price relatives for various components of consumer expenditure.
- a list of relatives is provided in Appendix A.
- for presentation purposes price relatives have been expressed as index numbers rather than ratios.

Price Index: - a price relative multiplied by 100.

- this calculation provides a spatial price index for Yellowknife for which the associated Edmonton value equals 100. For example, a spatial price index of 125.0 indicates Yellowknife price levels 25% higher than Edmonton.

B. Methodological Considerations

The following illustrates some methodological considerations that should be recognized when interpreting the survey results:

(i) Price Comparison:

- this survey makes price comparisons between Edmonton and Yellowknife for fixed quantities of goods and services.
- these comparisons do not necessarily reflect actual living cost differences as Yellowknife consumption for certain items may vary substantially from that of Edmonton. For example, quantity consumed has a large influence on overall expenditure differences for items such as automotive gasoline, home heating and electricity. In such cases, cost of living comparisons would incorporate consumption differences as well as price variations.

(ii) Item Selection:

Complete Control Contr

- products priced were consumer goods and services available for sale in Yellowknife and Edmonton during the survey period. Purchases through mail, catalogue sales or personal shipment were excluded.
- product selection was based on popularity (volume sellers) in Yellowknife and availability in both cities.
- products selected for pricing tended to be major brands with the exception of certain store specific brands sold in Yellowknife.
- to be consistent with the requirement that product comparisons be identical, no brand or model substitution was permitted.

(iii) Store Selection:

- store selection for Yellowknife included all major retail outlets selling surveyed items.
- for Edmonton a representative sample of retail establishments was used. Stores selected provided a distribution by geographic area, size and type of operation.
- certain Edmonton department and chain stores were included to permit the pricing of store specific brands available in Yellowknife.

(iv) Consumer Behaviour:

- results of this survey reflect prices paid by the average consumer for goods and services in Yellowknife and Edmonton during the survey period.
- certain types of consumer behaviour are not reflected in this procedure. For example:
 - buying in bulk
 - co-operative purchasing
 - exhaustive search for minimum price
 - stock piling sale items
- suggested retail prices were used for products where prices are usually negotiated (eg. motor vehicles).

(v) Choice of Weights:

- the weights used were those of the 1974 Edmonton Family Expenditure survey, adjusted to incorporate price changes from 1974 to 1980.
- the 1974 Edmonton Expenditure survey weights represent the budget distribution for surveyed quantities of goods and services at prevailing 1974 prices.
- the 1980 adjusted weights are the June 1980 budget distribution for an Edmonton household purchasing the same quantities of goods and services as they had in 1974, but at June 1980 prices.

(vi) Imputation:

- in certain cases, identical matches for items or services could not be achieved. In these instances, price relatives for the missing items were imputed from groups of similar items. Groupings were based on marketing factors such as: perishability, storage requirements, sales volume, transportation costs and other special handling requirements.


Survey results provide price comparisons between Edmonton and Yellowknife incorporating nearly 4,000 price quotes for over 650 consumer goods and services. These products are distributed over the seven components of consumer spending reported by Statistics Canada in its Consumer Price Index: "food"; "housing"; "clothing"; "transportation"; "health and personal care"; "recreation, reading and education"; and "tobacco and alcohol".


- for June 1980, average price levels were 26% higher in Yellowknife than in Edmonton. Thus, the purchasing power of an Edmonton dollar in Yellowknife is approximately 79 cents -- a sizeable reduction in consumer spending power.
 - this price difference results primarily from higher indexes for "housing" (138), "transportation" (127) and "food" (121).
 - the "tobacco and alcohol" component also exhibited a high price index (132), but its low weight (6%) limited its impact on overall price differences.
 - lower price indexes were observed for "recreation, reading and education" (114); for "clothing" (114); and for "health and personal care" (116).

PRICE INDEXES, by Component Yellowknife, June 1980




PRICE INDEXES, Food Component Yellowknife, June 1980

- for June 1980, food prices in Yellowknife were 21% higher than those in Edmonton. Retail prices for "food for home consumption" (124) were higher than those experienced for "food consumed away from home" restaurant meals (113).
 - retail food prices for home consumption were 24% higher in Yellowknife. The overriding factor was the price of perishable items.
 - fruit and vegetable prices were 34% higher in Yellowknife, resulting primarily from large differences for "fresh vegetables" (160), "fresh fruit" (126) and "processed fruit" (126).
 - higher prices for "dairy products" (136) especially those of "fresh milk" (152 to 156) yielded prices 34% higher for "dairy products and eggs."
 - 25% higher prices for "meat, poultry and fish products" resulted from higher prices for "beef" (135) and relatively lower price differences for "pork" (108) and "poultry" (116).
 - among remaining major food categories, price levels ranged from 8 to 18% higher than those of Edmonton.

- prices associated with "housing" were on average 38% higher in Yellowknife than Edmonton.
 - prices for "shelter", including items such as rent, taxes, insurance and maintenance, were 37% higher. (It should be noted that "mortgage interest", "depreciation on dwellings" and "expense of other owned accommodation" were not priced.)
 - prices related to apartment rentals were 27% higher.
 - a contributing factor to higher prices for "owned accommodation" (154) was the municipal tax rate in Yellowknife (169).
 - prices for "household operation" were the highest within the housing component.
 - this price difference resulted primarily from high costs for "water, fuel and electricity" (239).
 - Yellowknife prices for "household furnishing and equipment" were 12% higher than Edmonton.

- on average, retail prices for "clothing" were 14% higher than Edmonton.
- although indexes have been provided for groupings within the "clothing" component, the reader should be cautioned on the use of figures other than the total clothing index. For lower levels, survey data did not provide sufficient numbers of product matches for reliable estimates.

- the "transportation" index was on average 27% higher in Yellowknife than Edmonto:
 - "private transportation" prices were 17% higher.
 - within this category, highest price differences were observed for automobile and truck operation (133), reflecting costs associated with gasoline and maintenance services.
- overall prices for "public transportation" were 101% higher in Yellowknife influenced by higher costs for taxi (195) and bus travel (300).
 - price differences for "inter-city transportation" were somewhat lower (167).

- retail prices for "health and personal care" products and services were on average 16% higher in Yellowknife.

- prices for "health care" services were 2% to 15% higher in Yellowknife.
- higher costs for "personal care" (118), were largely a product of retail prices for "personal care supplies" and "personal care appliances" (121 and 120 respectively).

- on average, prices for goods and services associated with "recreation, reading and education" were 14% higher in Yellowknife.
 - recreational products and activities were 15% higher in Yellowknife.

 Lower costs for admission to certain types of entertainment reduced this value, but the higher costs for equipment and activity fees prevailed.
 - prices of reading materials, including paperbacks and magazines, were similar to those of Edmonton.

- in June 1980, "tobacco and alcohol" prices were 32% higher in Yellowknife.
- highest index values were exhibited for "tobacco" (142).
- retail prices for alcohol were on average 28% higher in Yellowknife. Higher price relatives were experienced in alcohol purchased through the liquor control system. Considerably lower price relatives were recorded for alcohol consumed in licensed premises.

APPENDIX B

ITEM SPECIFICATION

ITEM SPECIFICATION

FOOD

Food for Home Consumption:

- all items were priced in major food outlets in Yellowknife and Edmonton; convenience and low volume establishments were excluded from the survey.
- regular, and where found, sale prices were used.

Food Away from Home:

- spatial comparisons refer to prices on a selection of single item orders sold in family restaurants.

HOUSING

Shelter:

- rental values refer to monthly market rents on 2 bedroom apartments possessing comparable physical attributes and ammenities in both cities.
- comparison of property taxes refers to mill rate: assessment procedures for Edmonton and Yellowknife are based on the same standards.
- mortgage interest and depreciation were not included in the survey as appropriate methodology was not available.

Household Operation:

- price indexes for water, fuel and electricity represent comparisons based upon consumption of identical quantities in both centers, and therefore are not cost of living comparisons. In general the procedure for calculating price was as follows:
 - (i) average consumption by month and associated yearly totals were determined for Edmonton during 1979-80;
 - (ii) rate structures for June 1980 were applied to determine an average bill for each city by month;
 - (iii) monthly bills were then summed to yield a yearly total bill for each center; and
 - (iv) yearly total bills were then divided by consumption to determine final unit price.
- prices of water and electricity therefore refer to unit costs in both centers based on Edmonton consumption patterns.
- price of fuel refers to the price of fuel oil in Yellowknife and the unit cost of gas in Edmonton, equated by BTU content.
- it should be noted that natural gas is used for purposes other than home heating by Edmonton households.
- prices for long distance phone calls refer to the average cost of a 3 minute evening call to various Canadian cities.

Household Furnishing and Equipment:

- all price comparisons are for identical consumer goods and services.

CLOTHING

- price comparisons for clothing were based on identical items and related services.
- the variety, labelling and marketing of clothing articles reduced substantially identical matches achieved for this component. The reader is therefore cautioned regarding price comparisons other than the total index for clothing.

TRANSPORTATION

Private Transportation:

- prices of automobiles, motorcycles, and trucks refer to the suggested retail price, as negotiated prices could not be reliably obtained.
- automobile and truck operation include retail prices of goods and services required in the operation of these vehicles. Price quotes were obtained from gas stations, hardware stores and retail automotive suppliers.

Public Transportation:

- prices for taxi service were based on the first mile travelled, while prices for bus travel included both adult and student fares.
- price of inter-city transportation refers to total airfare for a fixed set of destinations. Destinations selected were based upon frequency of travel from Edmonton.

HEALTH AND PERSONAL CARE

Health Care:

- prices for similar services by health professionals (eye care and dental work) were evaluated in both cities.
- medical supplies refers to retail prices for prescribed and non-prescribed medicines purchased in drug and department stores.

Personal Care:

- -- comparable personal care services, including hairstyling and hair care were priced.
- personal care supplies and appliances were priced in drug, hardware, grocery and department stores.

RECREATION. READING AND EDUCATION

Recreation:

- identical stereo and television equipment, accessories and servicing were priced in specialty and department stores.
- cable television includes price of installation and monthly connection for a 24 month period.
- home recreation and outdoor equipment involved comparisons of a sample of identical consumer items representative of these classifications.
- prices for hotel and motel accommodation were assumed equal. Persons do not generally purchase these services in their own city for travel purposes.
- prices for packaged holiday trips refer to the average price for a set of holiday destinations weighted by frequency of travel from Edmonton.

 These packages include airfare and 1-2 weeks accommodation.

Reading and Education:

- price comparisons refer to paperback novels, newspapers and magazines.

TOBACCO AND ALCOHOL

Tobacco Products:

- prices are those collected from drug, grocery and department stores for popular brands of cigarettes and cigars.

Alcohol Beverages:

- prices are list prices for wine, beer and liquor sold in stores and for beer and liquor sold in similar licensed premises.
