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## POPULATION ESTIMATES

### 1. Introduction

This report presents Northwest Territories population estimates for December 1980 and outlines estimation procedures. Methodological details are provided in the Appendix.

Tables in this report present population and population change information for 1978 through 1980. Community, regional and territorial totals are provided. Information is also included for the Central Arctic Region, which was formed April 1, 1981.

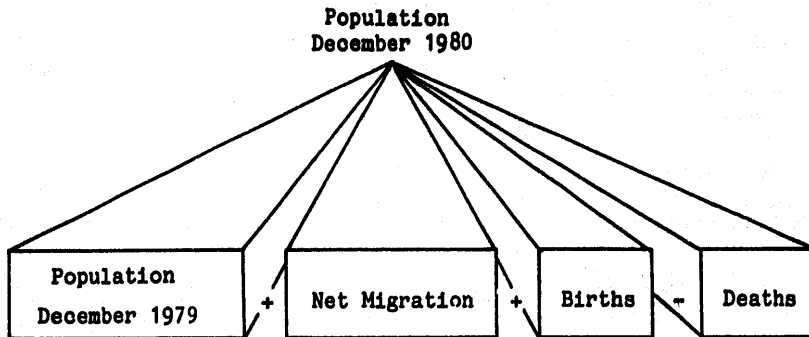
### 2. Population Highlights

Population estimates provided in this report indicate that:

- during 1980 the Northwest Territories experienced a population loss of almost 200 persons. This compares to a population loss of more than 300 for 1979.
- all regions except Fort Smith experienced small population gains. The Inuvik Region population increased by an estimated 233 persons compared to a loss of more than 100 during 1979.
- net out-migration from the Northwest Territories fell to an estimated 1172 persons compared to 1349 in 1979. (Based on health care registrations fewer people migrated to the Northwest Territories -- 2764 compared to 4283 during 1979. It follows that considerably fewer persons left the Territories -- an estimated 3936 in 1980 compared to 5632 the previous year.)
- in 1979 all regions experienced population losses due to migration. In 1980 this trend was reversed for Keewatin and Inuvik Regions. Net out-migration from the Fort Smith Region exceeded 1000 persons.
- for the Northwest Territories taken as a whole, natural increase (the excess of births over deaths) offset for the most part population losses attributable to migration. Once again births were more than 1200, with deaths being in the order of 200 persons.

### 3. Estimation Procedure

Population estimates were developed for all communities by adjusting year-end 1979 population figures for the effects of birth, death and migration during 1980. The schematic for this procedure is as follows:



Birth and death information was provided by the Registrar General of Vital Statistics, while migration estimates were developed from Family Allowance statistics with adjustments for school enrolment information. Details are provided in the Appendix.

Population figures for Snare Lake are provided separately from those of Rae-Edzo. Population estimates for Rae-Edzo have been adjusted to reflect this change.

**APPENDIX**



A. Population Estimation Procedure, December 1980

Population figures for December 1980 were developed by estimating numbers of children 0-17 years of age, parents with children 0-17 years of age, and other adults, for each community. The estimation procedure also provides birth, death and net migration information.

Data Sources

1. Population Statistics, December 1979. Bureau of Statistics, Government of the Northwest Territories.
2. Family Allowance (FA) statistics, December 1979 and 1980. Department of Health and Welfare, Canada.
3. Vital statistics data, 1979 and 1980. Department of Justice and Public Services, Government of the Northwest Territories.
4. School enrolment data, 1979 and 1980. Department of Education, Government of the Northwest Territories.

Estimation of Total Population

Sum of child and adult population estimates.

Estimation of Child Population

1. Children Estimate, 1979: FA children at December 1979, adjusted for births and infant mortality during 1979 and for school enrolment.
2. Children Estimate, 1980: FA children at December 1980, adjusted for births and infant mortality during 1980 and for school enrolment.

Adjustments to FA data were for children less than 1 year, whose population tends to be understated by FA records. Additional adjustments were made for school enrolment data.

Estimation of Adult Population

This procedure develops separate estimates for parents and for other adults:

1. Parents Estimate, 1979: FA families at December 1979, times estimated parents per family at December 1979.
2. Other Adults Estimate, 1979: Population at December 1979, minus parents and children at December 1979.

3. Parent Deaths Estimate, 1980: All adult deaths during 1980, times parents at December 1979, divided by all adults at December 1979.
4. Other Adult Deaths Estimate, 1980: All adult deaths during 1980, minus parent deaths during 1980.
5. Preliminary Parents Estimate, 1980: Parents at December 1979, plus estimated number of parents added due to birth of first child during 1980, minus parents with one child 17 years of age at December 1979, minus deaths to parents during 1980. (Excludes migration.)
6. Preliminary Other Adults Estimate, 1980: Other adults at December 1979, plus children 17 years of age at December 1979, plus parents with one child 17 years of age at December 1979, minus parents whose first child was born during 1980, minus deaths to other adults during 1980. (Excludes migration.)
7. Preliminary Families Estimate, 1980: FA families at December 1979, plus estimated number of families formed by birth of first child during 1980, minus families with one child 17 years of age at December 1979. (Excludes migration.)
8. Parents per Family Estimate, 1980: Preliminary parents estimate, divided by preliminary families estimate.
9. Final Parents Estimate, 1980: FA families at December 1980, times parents per family at December 1980. (Includes migration.)
10. Net Migration of Parents Estimate, 1980: Final parents estimate, minus preliminary parents estimate.
11. Net Migration of Other Adults Estimate, 1980: Preliminary estimate of other adults, times net migration of parents, divided by preliminary estimate of parents.
12. Final Other Adults Estimate, 1980: Preliminary estimate of other adults, plus net migration of other adults during 1980.
13. Adult Population Estimate, 1980: Final parents estimate, plus final other adults estimate.

#### Estimation of Net Migration

1. Net Migration of Infants Estimate, 1980: FA children less than 1 year of age at December 1980, minus reported births, plus infant deaths during 1980. (Calculated only if positive)
2. Net Migration of Children Estimate, 1980: Children 1-17 at December 1980, minus children 0-16 years of age at December plus net migration of infants, plus deaths to children 1-17 years during 1980.
3. Net Migration Estimate, 1980: Sum of net migration for children, parents and other adults.

**B. Population Estimation Procedure, December 1979**

Population figures for December 1979 were estimated using the same procedure as was used for December 1980 estimates.

**C. Population Estimation Procedure, December 1978**

Population estimates for Northwest Territories communities at December 1978 were developed by adjusting year-end 1977 population figures for birth, death and migration.

Components of this estimation were:

1. Base population figures for December 1977.
2. Change in community population due to migration: Net migration identified for children aged 1-14 years from Family Allowance records during 1978 was transformed into an estimate of total migration using age profiles for communities or groupings of similar communities;
3. Births for each community, estimated from Family Allowance statistics;
4. Deaths during calendar year 1978, based on Vital Statistics information.
