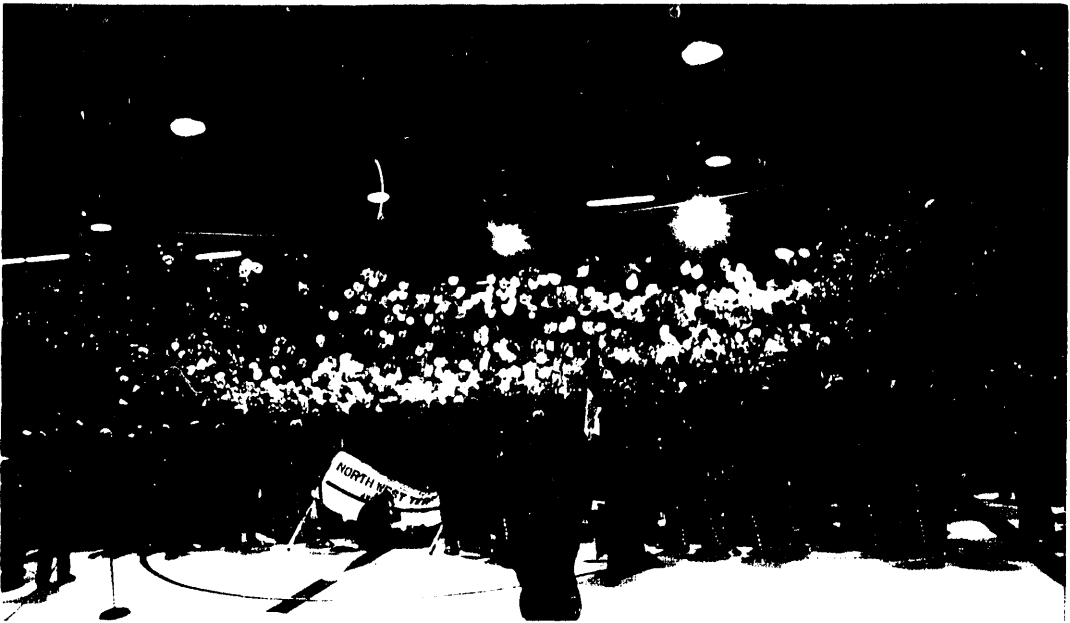

COMMISSIONER'S MESSAGE



I am pleased to have this opportunity to congratulate the athletes of our Northwest Territories Team on their excellent performance at the 1984 Arctic Winter Games.

These eighth Arctic Winter Games were memorable for many reasons. The Games returned to Yellowknife, our capital city, and site of the first-ever Arctic Winter Games in 1970. All Yellowknifers and, indeed, all of the Northwest Territories can be justifiably proud of this edition of the Games. The motto, "Best Ever Games", was indeed achieved and many thanks must go to the Yellowknife Host Society and the hundreds of volunteers who offered so freely of their time and energy.

The Government of the Northwest Territories is pleased to have been a part of the 1984 Arctic Winter Games. Direct grants and services in kind assisted the Yellowknife Host Society to stage the athletic competitions and to house, feed and transport the nearly 1,000 athletes and officials. With the added support of the Government of Canada and the City of Yellowknife and the many donations received from private sector, Yellowknife was able to balance its budget of \$800,000.

Our government's support extended, however, beyond the responsibility for hosting the 1984 Arctic Winter Games. Financial support allowed organizers of our Northwest Territories Team to conduct a series of six regional trials and a Northwest Territories trial to select the final Arctic Winter Games Team of 290 athletes and officials. In keeping with our philosophy of mass participation 1,700 athletes participated in regional trials and over 900 in territorial trials.

As I visited the sport competitions and many cultural events of the 1984 Arctic Winter Games I had the opportunity to observe the spirit of friendship and fellowship which have become traditional. While competition was keen in all sports, good sportmanship was always evident. It is this characteristic that makes the Games the truly unique event that it is.

I was particularly pleased with our own athletes and officials who proudly represented the people of the Northwest Territories in the true spirit of the Arctic Winter Games.

The Eighth Arctic Winter Games are now history. This book serves to honour the athletes, staff, volunteers and supporters of Team Northwest Territories and we hope, provides you with fond memories.

ARCTIC WINTER GAMES



In 1970 Yellowknife played host to 800 athletes from Alaska, the Yukon and Northwest Territories in the first-ever Arctic Winter Games. Conceived by officials from the three units, the Games were intended to provide northern athletes with the opportunity to improve their skills against athletes of similar background and ability and to foster friendship and understanding among all peoples of the Arctic through sport and cultural activities.

In 1984, 14 years later, the Eighth Arctic Winter Games returned to Yellowknife, site of the first games. Nearly 1,000 athletes, coaches and officials

participated in 13 different sport competitions. While many changes have been made in the 14 years since the First Arctic Winter Games were held, the primary purpose has remained that of providing northern athletes with the opportunity to compete at a level appropriate to their skills.

The successful staging of eight Arctic Winter Games is testimony to the hard work, dedication and perseverance of thousands of volunteers and the continuing support of government and industry. This continued support is most appreciated.

TEAM NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

Preparations for the 1984 Arctic Winter Games began in the Northwest Territories immediately following the 1982 Games. A local Host Society began planning the hosting of the Games while on a second front, organizers began the task of training and selecting the Northwest Territories team.

During closing ceremonies for the 1982 Arctic Winter Games Yellowknife was announced as host city for the 1984 games. The City immediately organized a Host Society whose responsibility it was to organize the 1984 Games. A volunteer Board of Directors was appointed and a number of volunteer committees were established with specific responsibilities. In addition to committees for each of the 13 sports of the 1984 Games, 17 committees handled responsibilities ranging from accommodation, catering and transportation for athletes to cultural program, medical and fund-raising. In all, the Yellowknife (1984) Arctic Winter Games Host Society had 1,000 volunteers assisting to make these Games the best ever.

While the Host Society was occupied with its preparations for the 1984 Games, the preparation of our Northwest Territories athletes and officials was being organized by a second, separate group. A central role was established for Sport North, supported by the Sport and Recreation Division of the Territorial Government's Department of Local Government. The NWT Arctic Winter Games Organizing Committee was formed with responsibility for conducting regional competitions and territorial trials in each of the 13 sports of the 1984 Arctic Winter Games.

The NWT was divided into six regions for competition purposes - Baffin, Keewatin, Central Arctic, Inuvik, South Slave and North Slave. Regional Co-ordinators scheduled competitions between athletes in each region and selected regional teams for the territorial trials held January 20 to 22, 1984.

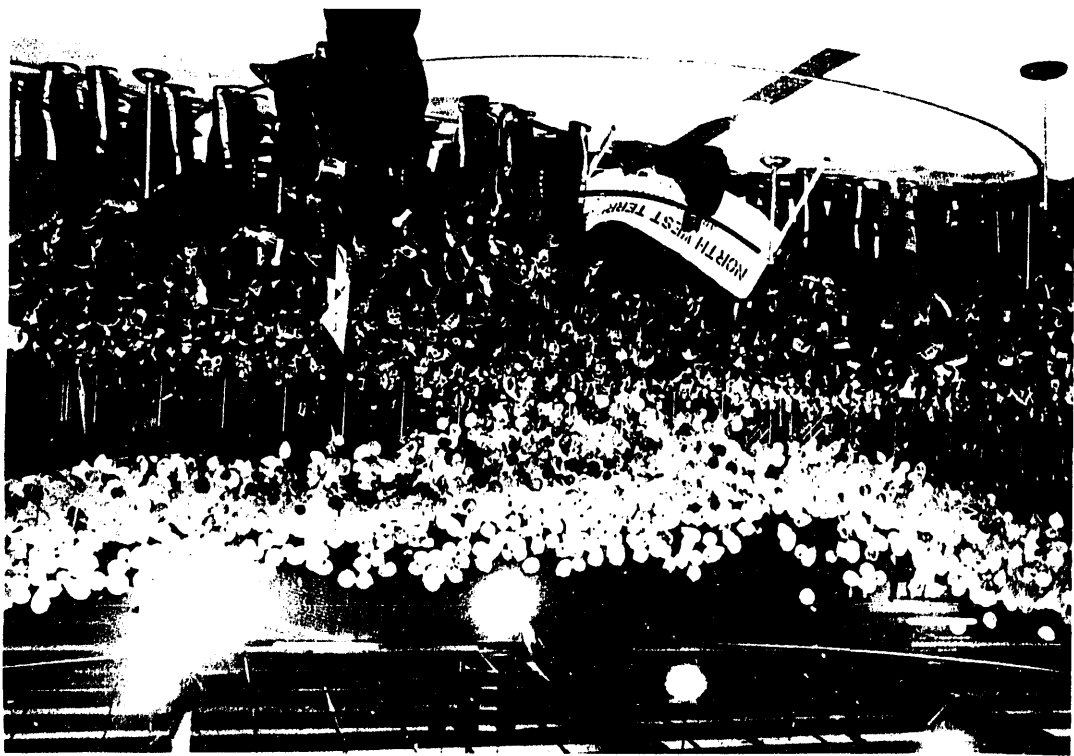
Nearly 1,700 athletes registered for the Arctic Winter Games. A new program to subsidize travel for regional competitions assisted to involve more people from smaller communities. Communities and athletes themselves were still responsible for a major portion of travel costs, however, a considerable contribution since most communities are accessible only by air.

About 1,000 athletes and officials participated in the territorial trials for the Arctic Winter Games. Chartered aircraft transported athletes to one of seven host communities where competitions were held. It is a credit to the organizers that despite staggering logistics, all competitions were successfully completed and all athletes returned safely home.

The 300 athletes, coaches and officials who were Team Northwest Territories for the 1984 Arctic Winter Games were supported by hundreds of volunteers and the substantial financial commitment of many more.

Team Northwest Territories represented our Territory with great distinction, capturing the most overall medals and gold ulus of excellence for our best performance ever at the Arctic Winter Games. It is not just the winners that we can be proud of however, as every member of our team proudly represented the Northwest Territories during their competition and at all other times.

Congratulations to all members of Team Northwest Territories.

Our government was pleased to sponsor an ambitious and highly successful cultural program of northern and native craft displays and concerts attended by hundreds of Yellowknifers and visitors.

Perhaps the highlight of all for us in the Northwest Territories was the performance of our athletes. Our athletes collected the highest number of gold ulus and highest total number of medals ever at the Arctic Winter Games. This performance is a tribute to our athletes and the coaches and managers who support them. We are proud to be a major part of a sport system which not only encourages broad-based participation but yields such excellent competitive results.

To our athletes and officials — congratulations.

It is only because of significant financial contributions of the Government of the Northwest Territories and the business community that this objective is possible.

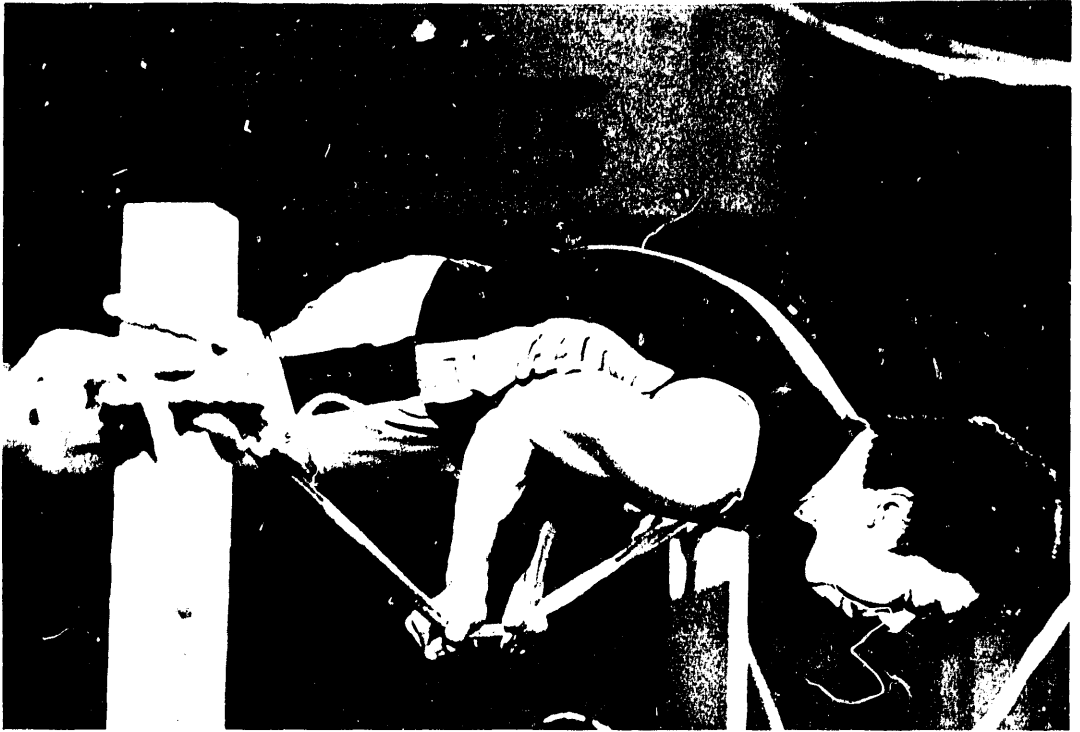
