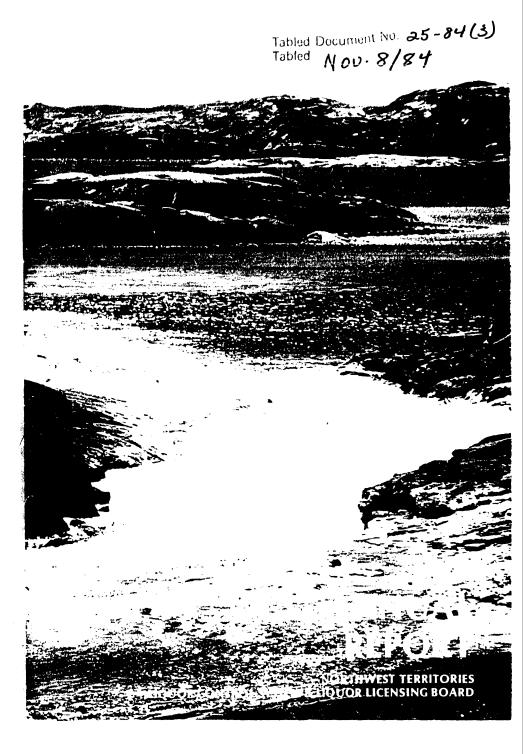

### N.W.T. LIQUOR LICENSING BOARD

#### 1. Operations

The System, extablished under the Northwest Territories Liquor Ordinance, is responsible for administering the purchase, sale and control of liquor consumption in the Northwest Territories. The System is authorized by the Legislative Assembly to receive working capital advances from time to time not exceeding \$5,500,000 to finance its operations.

Net income for the year, excluding salaries, wages and employee benefits paid by the Government, is to be transferred to the Government of the Northwest Territories in accordance with the Liquor Ordinance.

#### 2. Accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles considered to be appropriate in the circumstances and applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year. A summary of the significant accounting policies of the System is as follows:

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the landed cost at each location within the System.

**Fixed** assets

Buildings, furnishings and fixtures, owned and paid for by the Government of the Northwest Territories, are provided for the use of the System without cost and are not reflected in the financial statements.

Salaries, wages and employee benefits

Salaries, wages and employee benefits are charged to expenditures of the Government of the Northwest Territories but are recorded as expenses of the System for the purpose of determining net income for the year.

#### 4. Agency sales

Pursuant to the Liquor Ordinance, agents have been appointed in several locations to sell liquor. For agents purchasing liquor stock from the System the purchases were subject to discounts of \$451,000 (\$412,000 in 1983). In addition, commissions of \$320,000 (\$313,000 in 1983) were paid to agents selling consigned liquor stocks owned by the System.

#### 7. Subsequent event

A new Liquor Ordinance came into force on April 1, 1984. The Ordinance requires that, except for revenues from the sale of liquor, all moneys from licence fees and other moneys derived from the administration of the Ordinance and its regulations are to be deposited to the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Government of the Northwest Territories. In addition, certain expenses related to the Liquor Licensing Board will be charged to appropriations provided for that purpose. The net effect of these changes will be to reduce the net income of the System by about \$450,000 for 1985 and future years.
