Assistant Requisition.

This letter is to inform you, once again, that the Resolute Hunters would still like to retain their share of the Melville Island Polar Bear Quota. In the future times, we hope you will keep this in mind when the quota is again available to the High Arctic.

The second topic is the H.T.A.s request for an assistant to the Wildlife Officer in Resolute Bay. Sometimes the officer has to leave town and there is no one to take his place for awhile. It would also create a good opportunity for a local person to train to be a wildlife officer. Sometimes the wildlife office have been broken into when the game warden is out of town. An assistant would also help to prevent this, since there would be somebody to take care of the building when the officer is away.

If a budget is available for this position, the Resolute Bay Hunters and Trappers would appreciate it if your department could provide an assistant for the Wildlife Officer of Resolute Bay.
