INTRODUCTION BY THE MINISTER OF HEALTH
& SOCIAL SERVICES

This report outlines the role which social assistance plays in the economy of the Northwest Territories. It meets the financial needs of a variety of people: the aged and handicapped, single parents with young children, the working poor, and the unemployed.

The years 1980-85 have seen a rise in unemployment and inflation in Canada. Unemployment has always been high in the Northwest Territories and remains high. Inflation has been harder on northern communities than elsewhere. Anti-sealing and trapping sentiment in Europe, North America and elsewhere has caused a decline in income from fur.

Júhdá hınéné Northwest Territories golǒ gots'ę Dene hıǒ du kugha ʔeghálayıda gǒhlıle gots'ę hıdú k'ále ʔekáʔagǒht'e. Hagú júhdá kǒé kágodéyıla niyá lǒ t'áhsı yádétı. Hagú hıdé gots'ę hıná Tudate ʔeyi sáwé ch'áʔeret'ę gots'ę sáwé gǒ sǒba lá yúwé ʔája.

ʔeyi Financial Assistance Program yeri ts'ę gokeʔa la Dene ke ʔareyǒné kugha gonezǒ gǒʔ wǒle gogha ni yá ʔaket'ı. Hederi gháré Dene Hıshai ke sǒba hé kuts'é rágodi wǒle, gots'ę meni du ʔeghálayeda ke ʔeghálayıda gha gákuretǒ gots'ę sǒba hé kuts'é rágodeeni. Gots'ę meni bene t'áhsá ʔagǒht'e ke t'áhsı gogha gákuretę gha. Hagú ʔeyi beya gǒhlı, meni wani deya yárishee ke yá lǒ ʔeyi ke yá láni kuya hek'égodı kǒ het'ódeʔa.

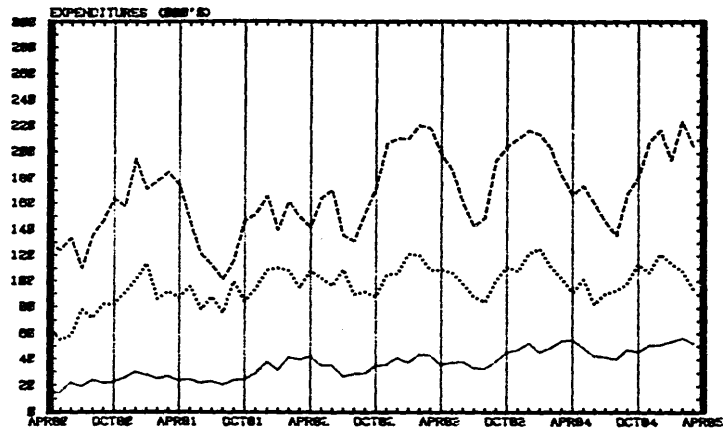
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REGIONAL SOCIAL ASSISTANCE EXPENDITURES
MONTHLY TOTALS FOR FISCAL YEARS 1982/81 - 1984/85

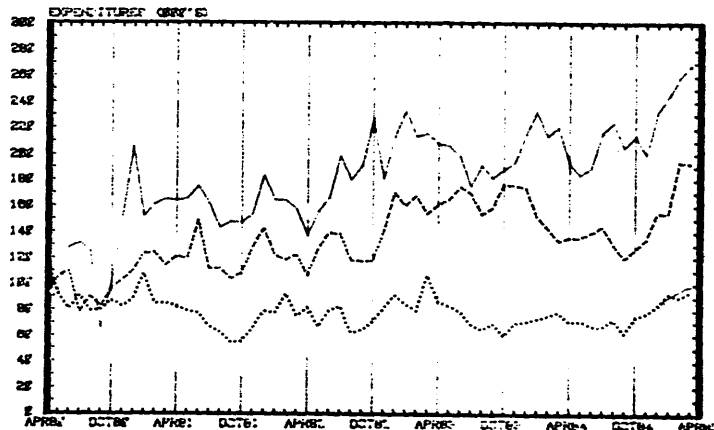

MONTHLY TOTALS FOR FISCAL YEARS 1982/81 - 1984/85

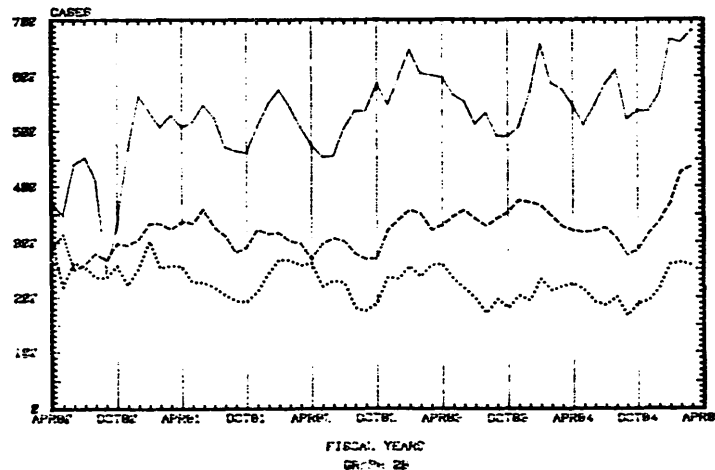

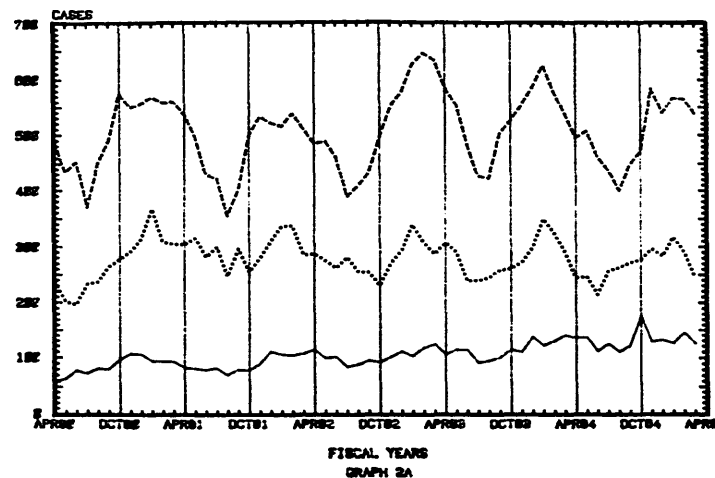
REGIONAL SOCIAL ASSISTANCE CASES
MONTHLY TOTALS FOR FISCAL YEARS 1988/81 - 1984/85

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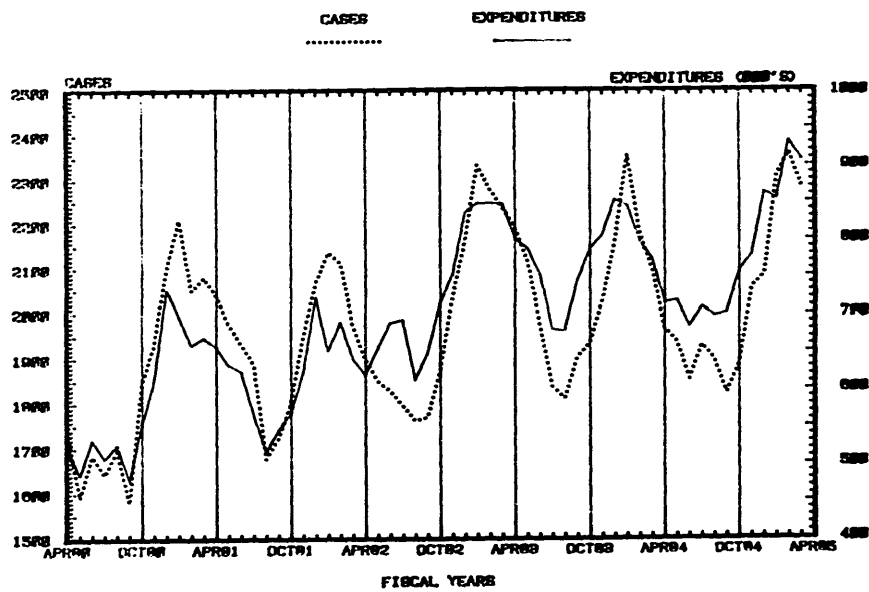

SECTION II - SOCIAL ASSISTANCE AND THE ECONOMY

One-third of the social assistance program is devoted to unemployed persons who are healthy and able to work, but who have neither a job nor unemployment insurance. One-sixth of the program helps those people who do have jobs, but do not earn enough to provide for the basic necessities of food, clothing and accommodation. These people are known as the "working poor".

A further one-sixth of the program goes to those persons who need assistance because they must stay at home to look after children. Typically these persons are younger single parents. They are employable people. Some stay at home to take care of young children, others look for work and day-care but can't find either.

This means that approximately two-thirds of the social assistance program shores up a failure in the economic system to provide employment for persons in the Northwest Territories.

Communities vary widely in their dependence on social assistance. Yellowknife and Inuvik, which have strong wage economies based on local industry, commerce and government, have social assistance expenditures less than 1% of the total community income. Twelve communities, such as Fort Franklin and Clyde River, which rely on the traditional hunting or trapping economy, supplemented by governmental jobs and possibly a local craft industry, have social assistance expenditures over 10% of the total community income. Two communities, Rae Edzo and Repulse Bay exceed 20%.

It shows also the average number of months Recipients and their families received assistance.

Table 3 shows the total number of "Persons" who were helped monthly for the year through social assistance. "Persons" include Recipients and their families.

Also shown is the total number of Cases for the year (that is, the total number of Recipients each month for the year). "Average family size" is calculated by dividing the "No. of Persons" by "Cases".

Communities vary widely in their dependence on social assistance. The range of dependence of the communities is looked at further in Table 24, page 114.

GRAPH 10: REGIONAL DEPENDENCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, 1983-84

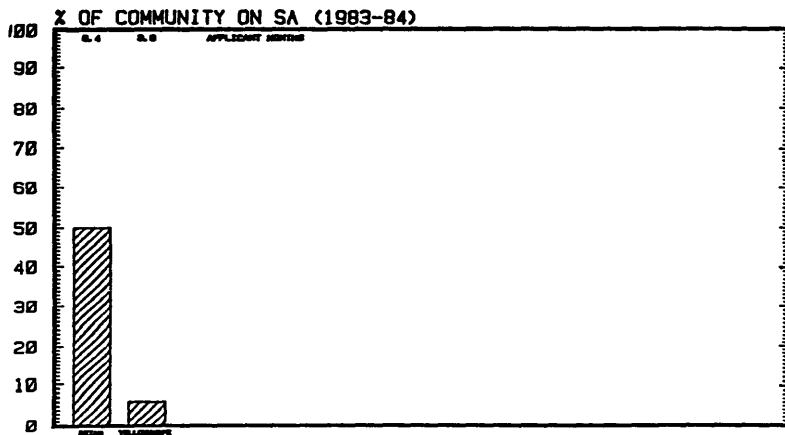

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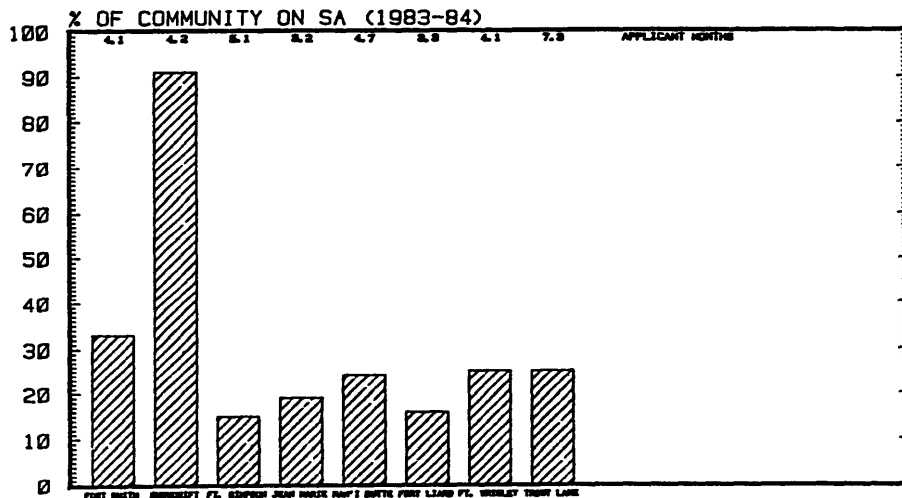
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YELLOWKNIFE REGION DEPENDANCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE



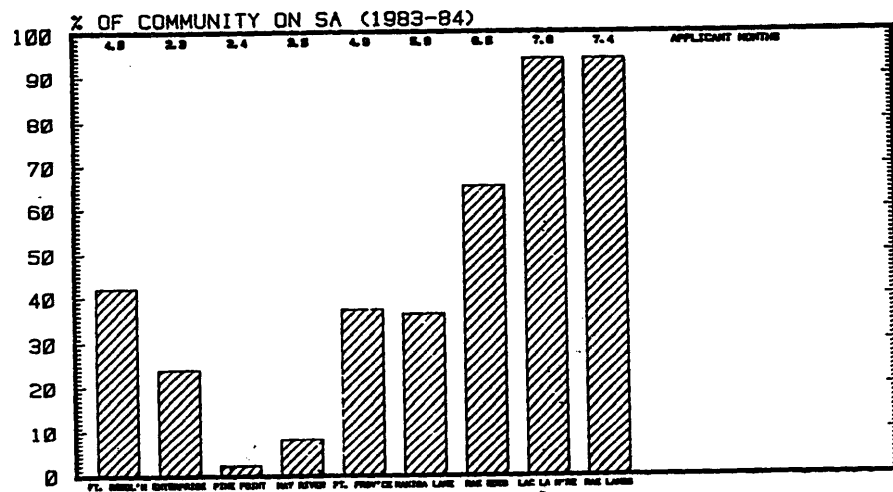

FORT SMITH REGION DEPENDANCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE



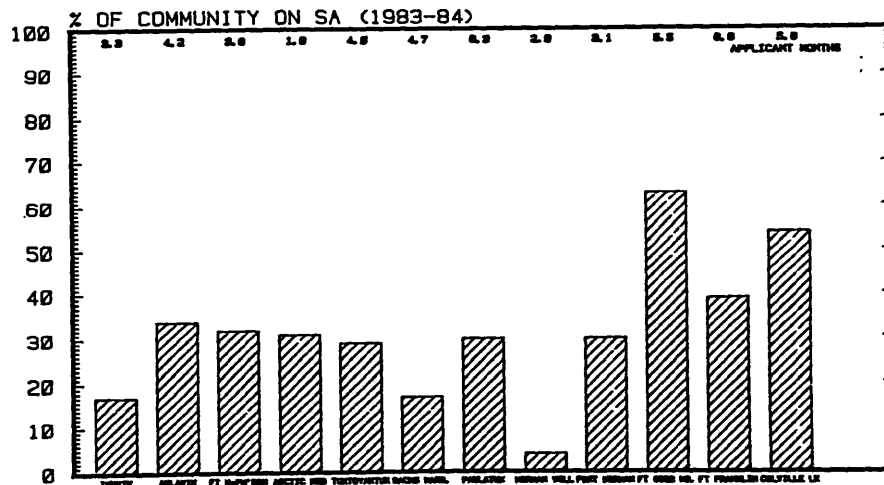

FORT SMITH REGION DEPENDANCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE



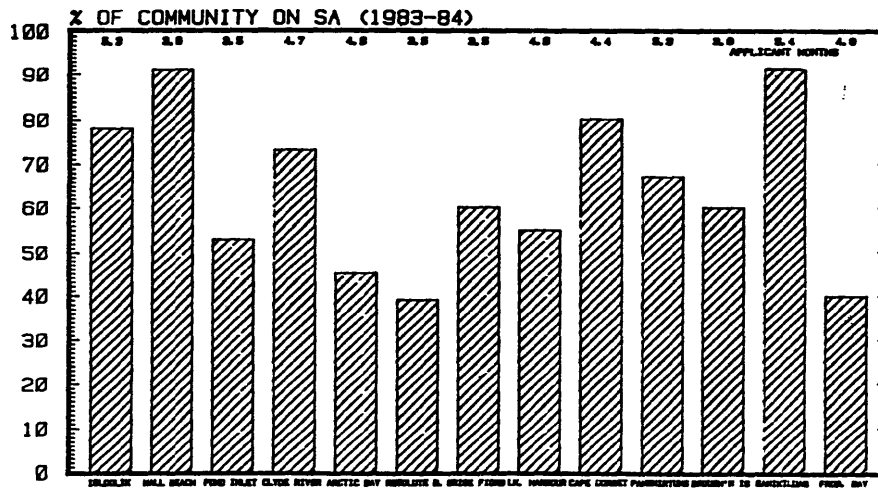

INUVIK REGION DEPENDANCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE



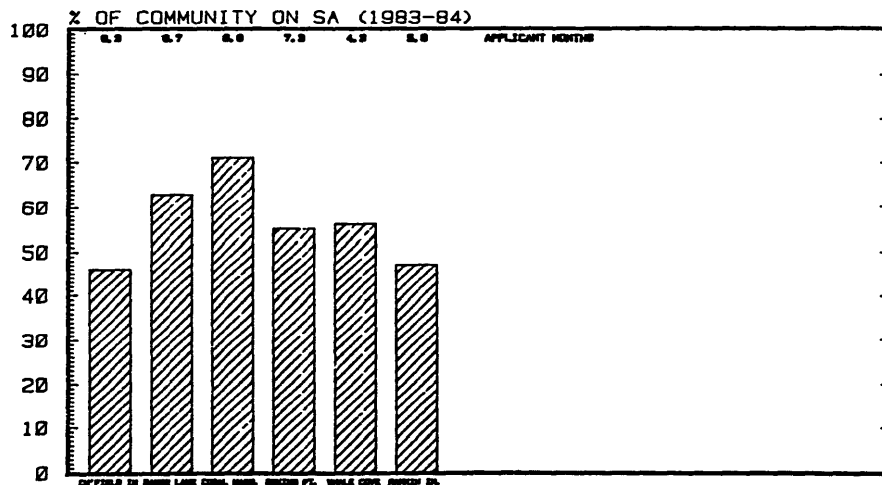

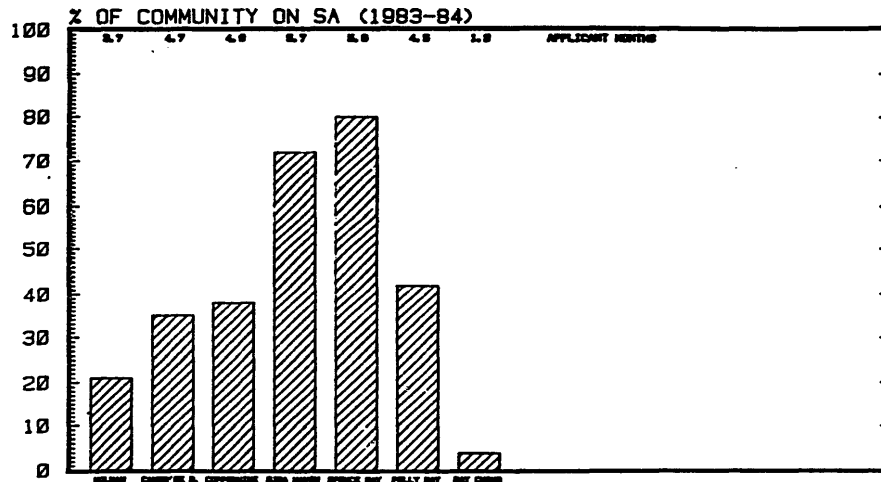
KEEWATIN REGION DEPENDANCY ON SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

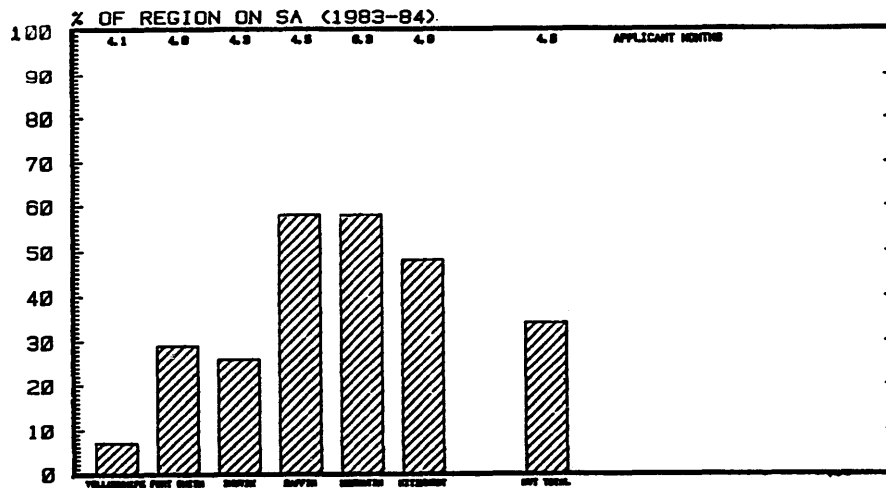

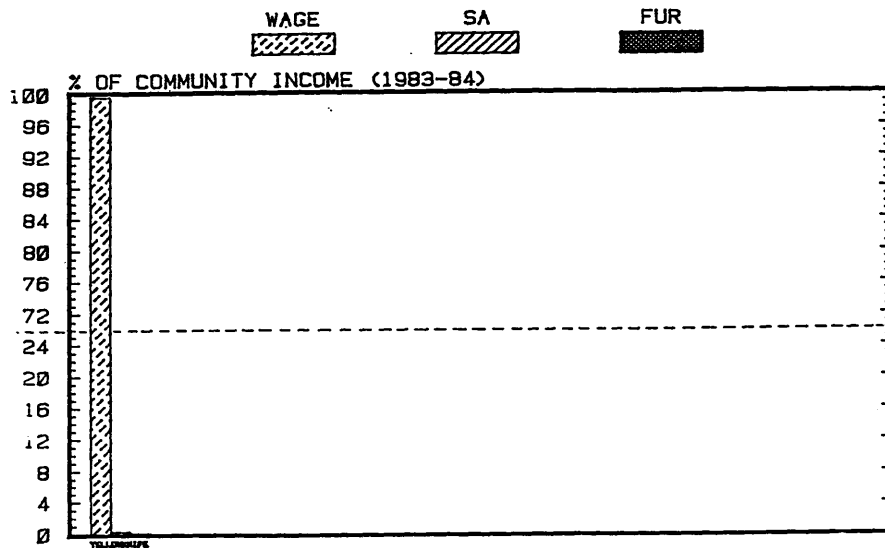

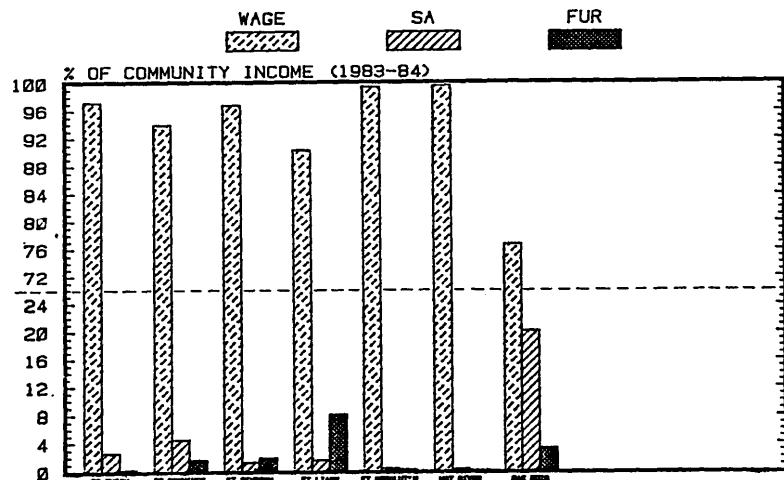

YELLOWKNIFE REGION SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME



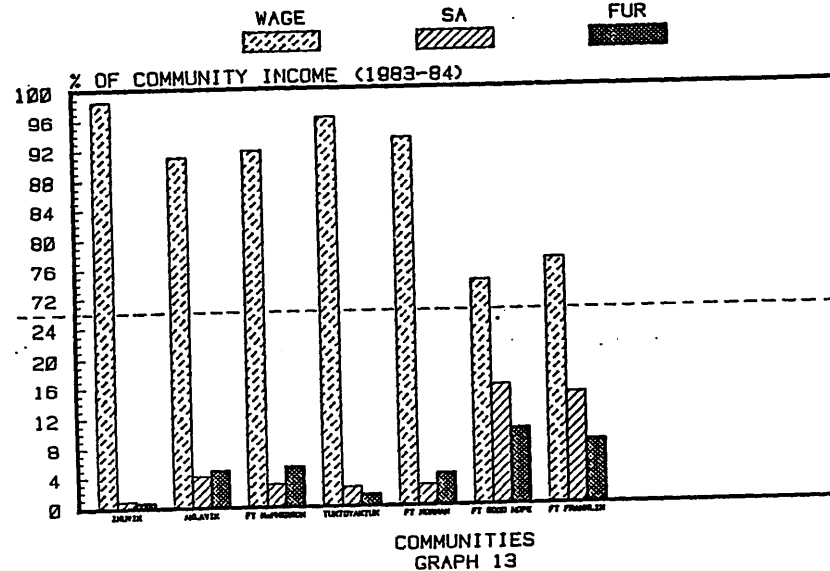

FORT SMITH REGION SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME

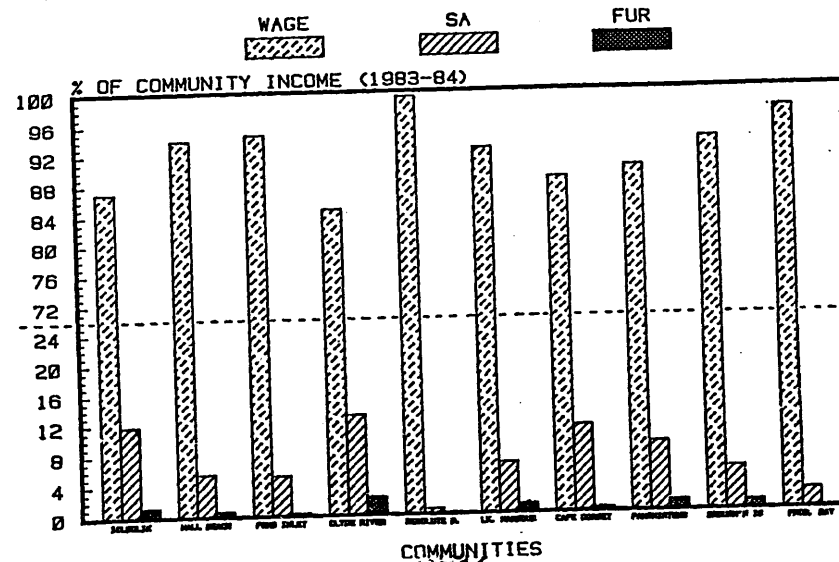

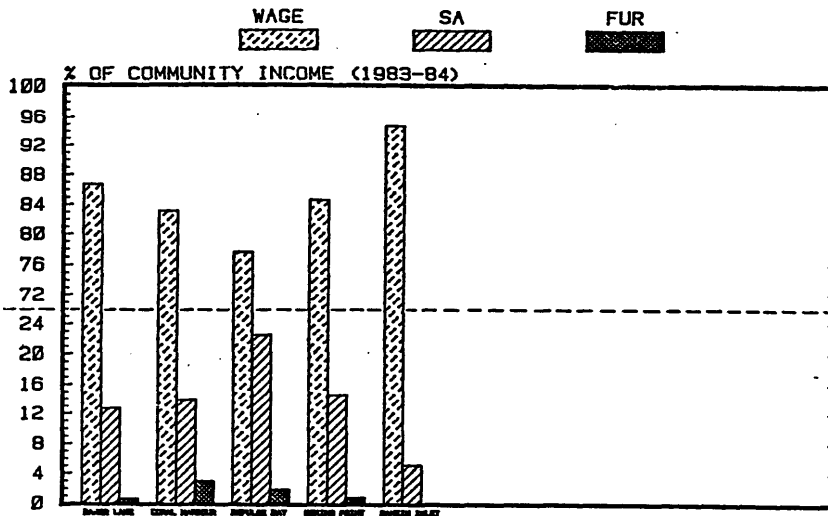
INUVIK REGION SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME



BAFFIN REGION SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME

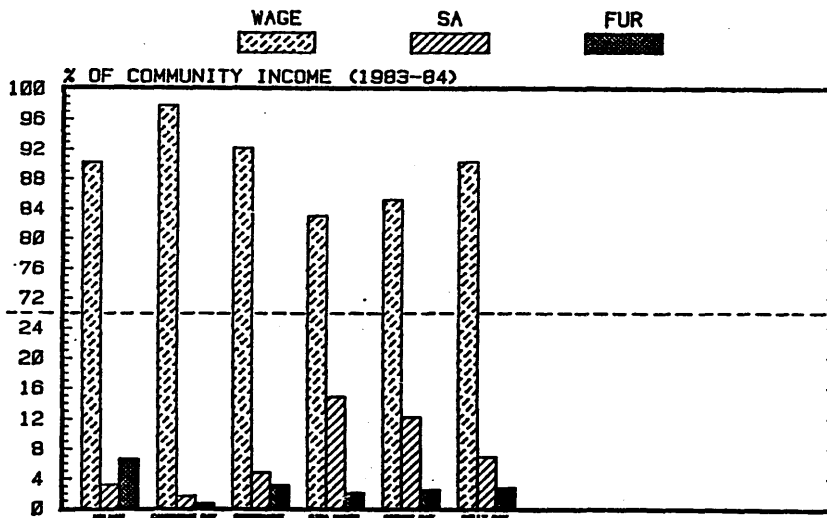


KEEWATIN REGION SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME

REGIONAL SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, FUR AND WAGE INCOME

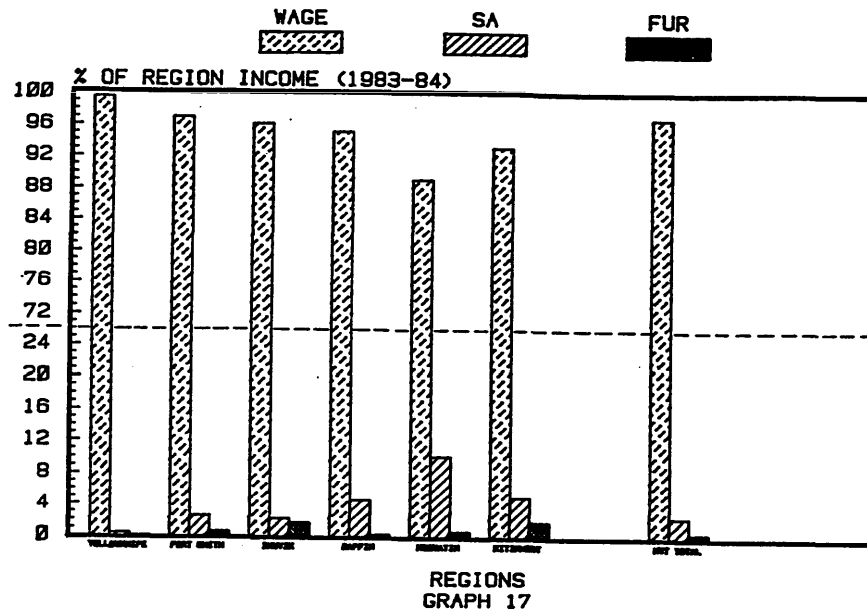

Senior Citizens who receive the Federal Guaranteed Income Supplement or the Spouse's Allowance are paid a supplementary benefit by the Government of the Northwest Territories. The benefit was \$75.00 during the fiscal year from March 1984 until January 1985. It was increased in February 1985 to \$85.00.

Table 6 shows the total number of benefits paid in 1984-85. Some recipients will have become eligible through the year and will not have received the twelve monthly benefits for the year totalling \$920.00 (that is, 10 x \$75.00 plus 2 x \$85.00).

The table also shows the number of people in the community who are over 60, and the percentage of this group which gets the Senior Citizens' Supplementary Benefit.

SECTION IV - DAY-CARE

Day-care in the Northwest Territories operates chiefly in the larger centres: Yellowknife, Fort Smith, Bay River and Inuvik. In 1983-84 the Yellowknife, Fort Smith and Inuvik Regions used 94% of the total day-care expenditure.

Day-care expenditures in 1983-84 were 20% lower than in 1980-81. The average number of day-care recipients per month dropped from 42 to 37 in the same period.

Persons who require a day-care subsidy must apply under the social assistance program. Direct subsidies to day-care centres are not given.

Expenditures for day-care in 1980-81 were \$154,000 which was 2% of total social assistance; in 1983-84 day-care subsidies dropped to \$123,000, which was just over 1% of social assistance expenditures.

Unemployed persons who are able to work but cannot find employment and do not have Unemployment Insurance represent 33% of the total welfare case-load. (See Pie Chart 7B, page 92, Table 17, page 83,) Whether a person gets a job depends on his or her education, age and the availability jobs.

Table 8A shows the number of "unemployed but able" persons in the NWT in 1984-85 who received social assistance, by age groups between 15 and 65. The total population in these age groups in the NWT is also shown, and the percentage which need social assistance.

Table 8B shows the education level reached by the "unemployed but able" in various age groups. The numbers given in each age group refer to the percentage of that group which has had a particular number of years of education. For example, 1.5% of those between the age of 20 and 29 have received four years of education.

Table 8C shows the education level reached by the "unemployed but able" in various age groups as a cumulative percentage of the group. For example, 95.4% of those between 20 and 29 years of age have received at least one year of education while only 21.3% have received at least ten years of education.

Recipients in age groups 40-49 and 50-64 years of age represent a high proportion of the 40-64 year olds population in the Northwest Territories. In fact the 50-64 years old group has the highest percentage, 6.3%, of any age category; the 20-29 years old recipients are 5.1% of the population; the 40-49 years old are 4.3%. The 30-39 years old, by comparison are only 3%.

These figures represent a trend in the Northwest Territories for older persons to begin parenting a "second generation" of children after their older children have grown up.

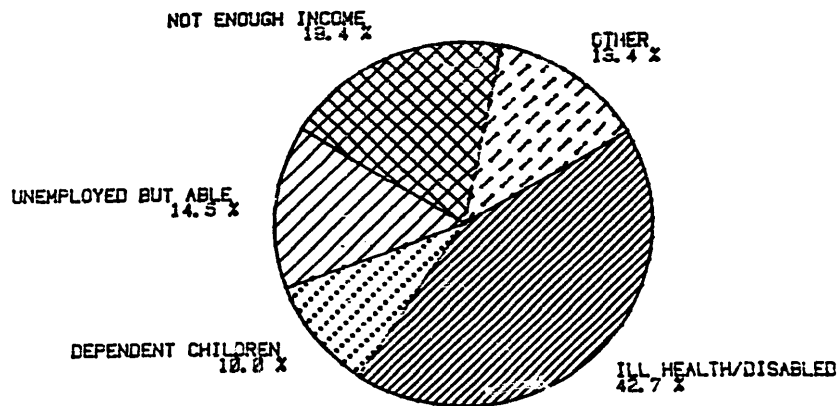

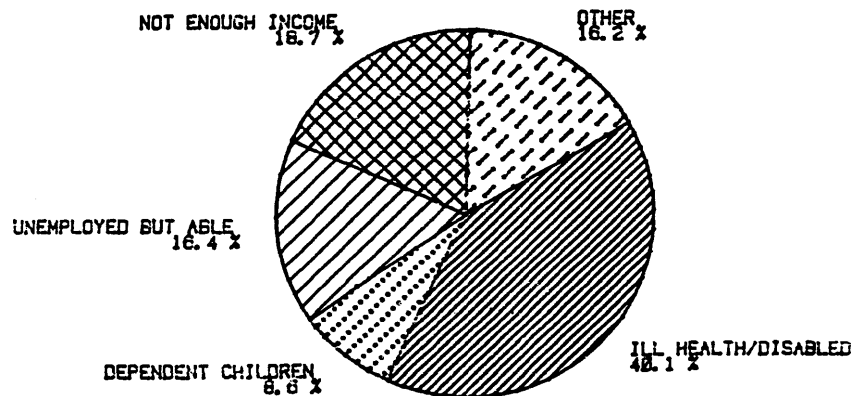

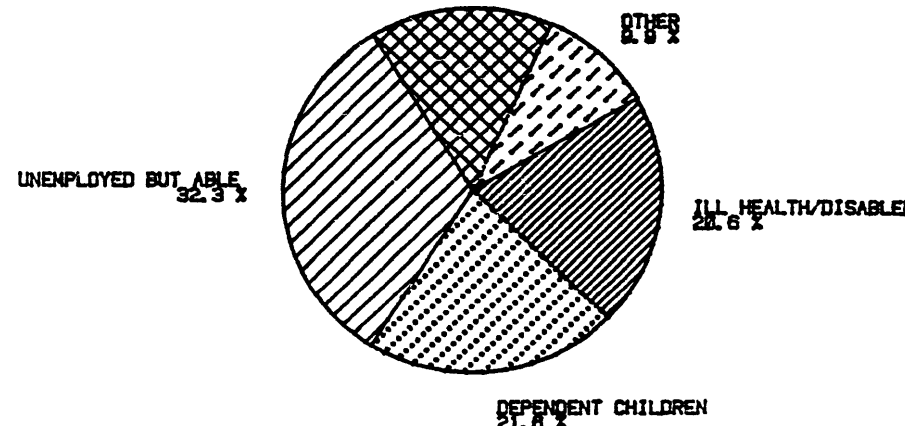

REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE. NO. OF CASES (1984-85)



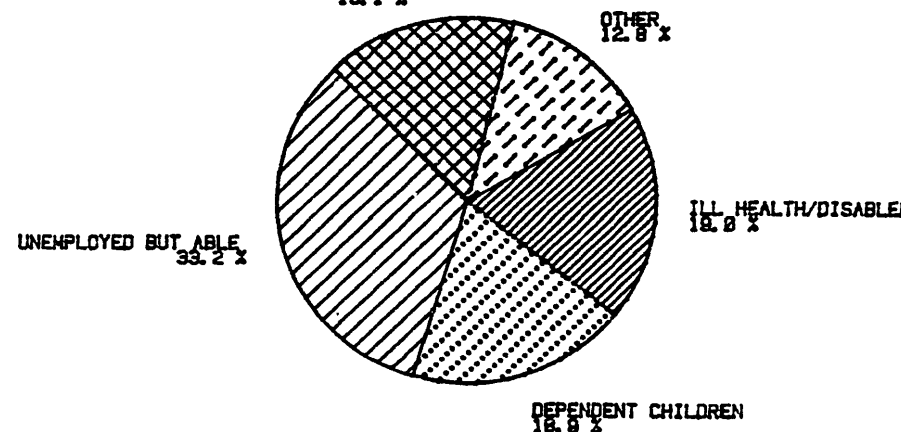

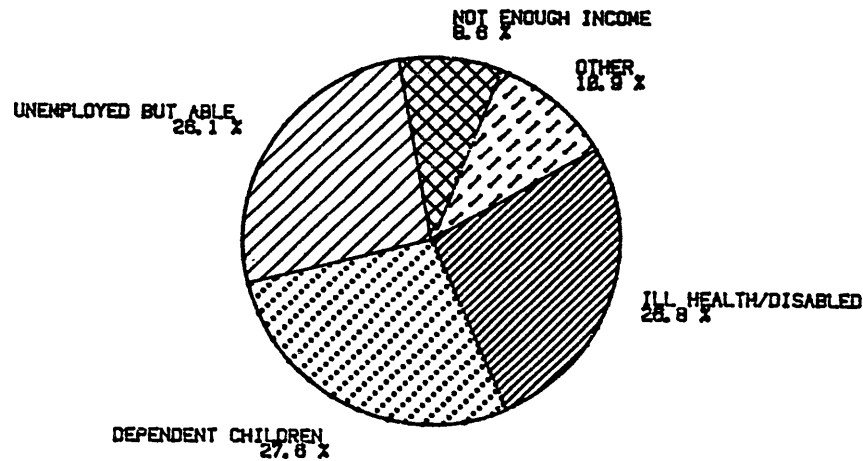

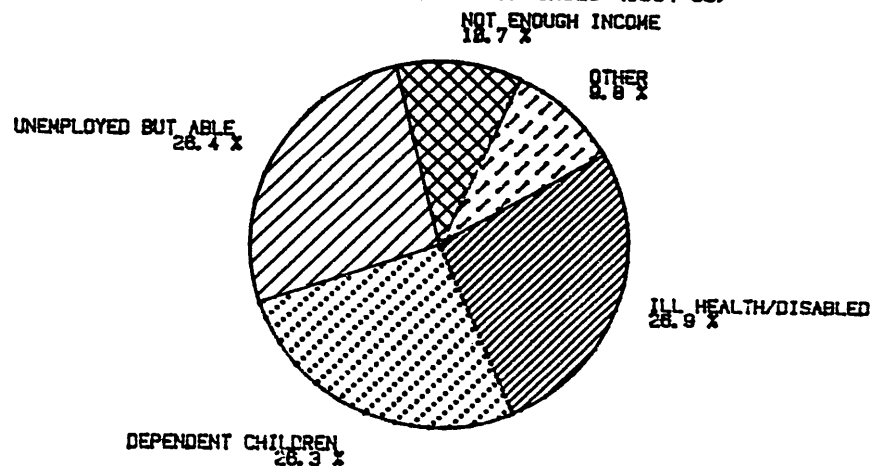

REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



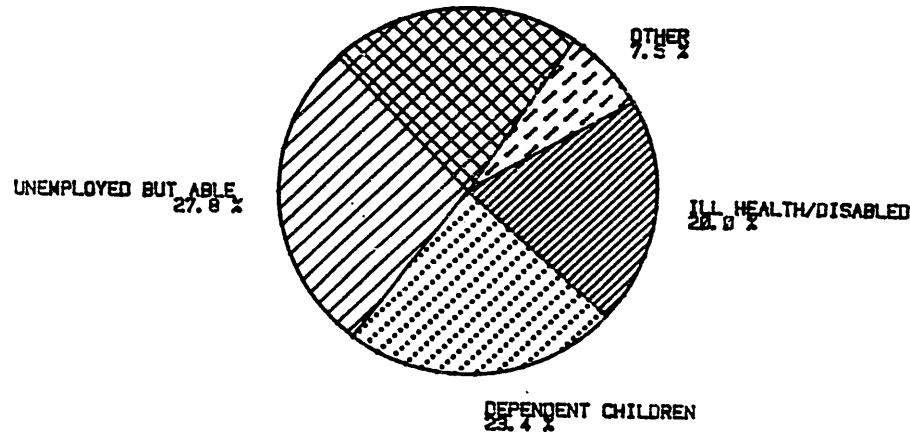

REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE, NO. OF CASES (1984-85)



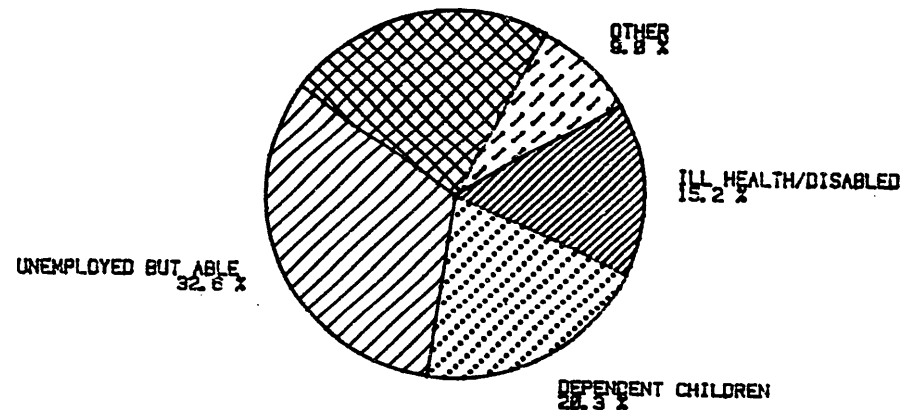

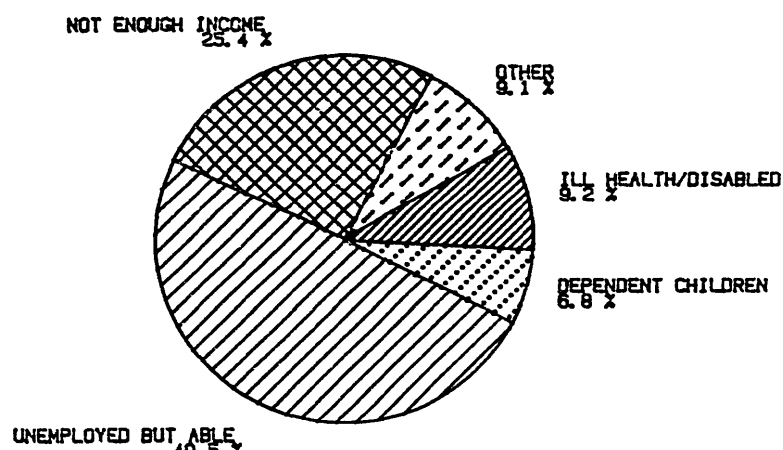

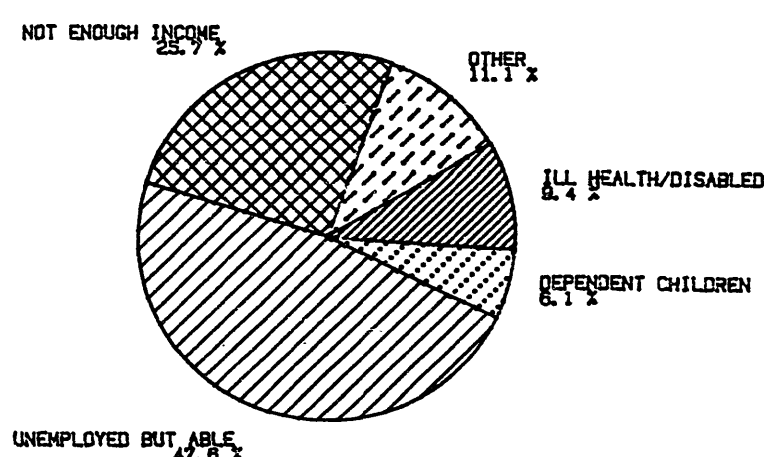

REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



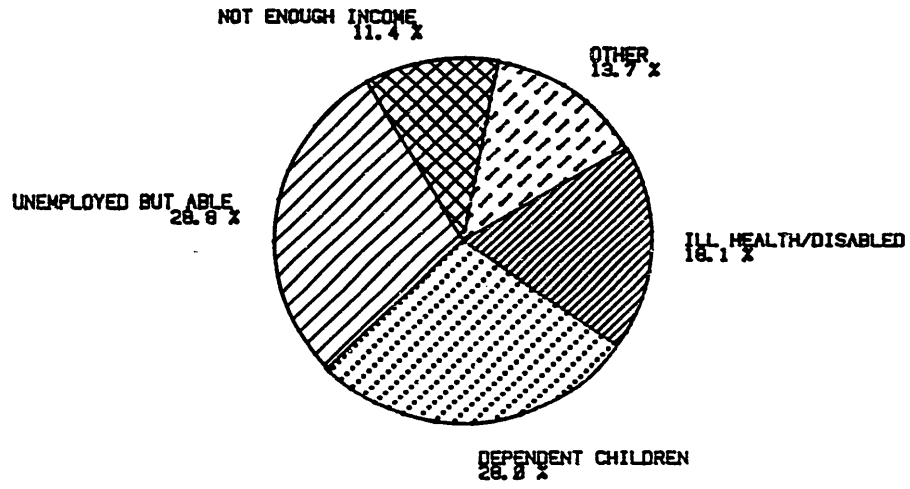

REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE, NO. OF CASES (1984-85)



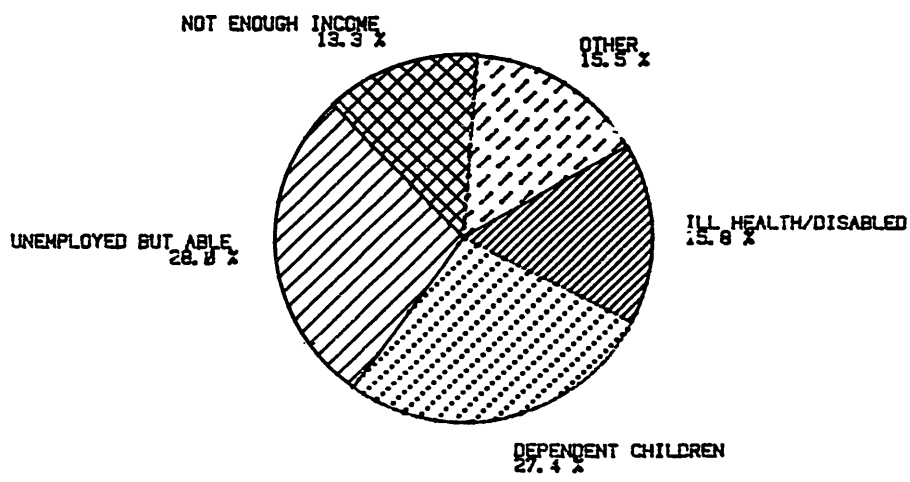

 REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE. EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



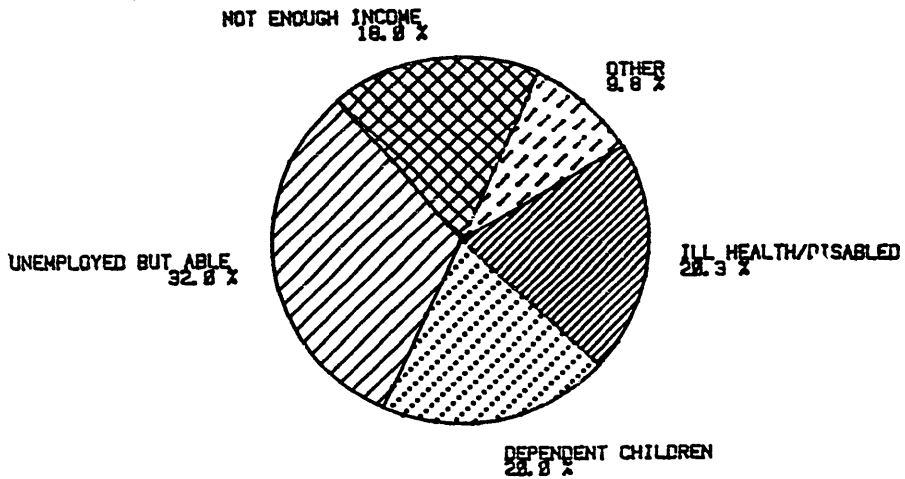

 REASONS FOR ASSISTANCE. NO. OF CASES (1984-85)



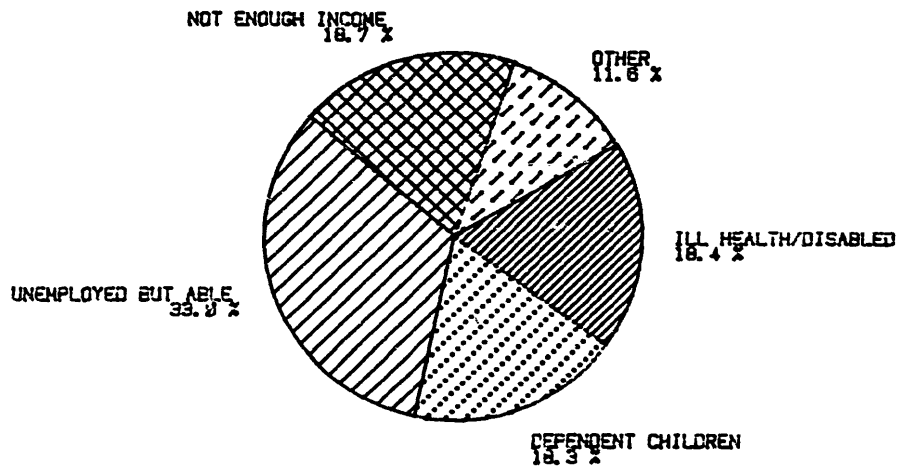

SECTION IX - FAMILY STATUS

The family status of social assistance recipients (couples, single parents and single persons) varies in different regions of the Northwest Territories. In Yellowknife 26% of all social assistance recipients are single persons, compared to the Inuvik and Fort Smith Regions with 13-15%, and the three regions above the tree line, Baffin, Keewatin and Kitikmeot, with 6-8%.

In Yellowknife single parents make up 37% of all recipients, (including dependents) in the Fort Smith and Inuvik regions 25-30%; and in the Baffin, Keewatin and Kitikmeot regions 17-20%.

Couples (including dependents) constitute 35% of the Yellowknife recipients, 56-60% of the Fort Smith and Inuvik region recipients, and a consistent 74% of the Baffin, Keewatin and Kitikmeot region recipients.

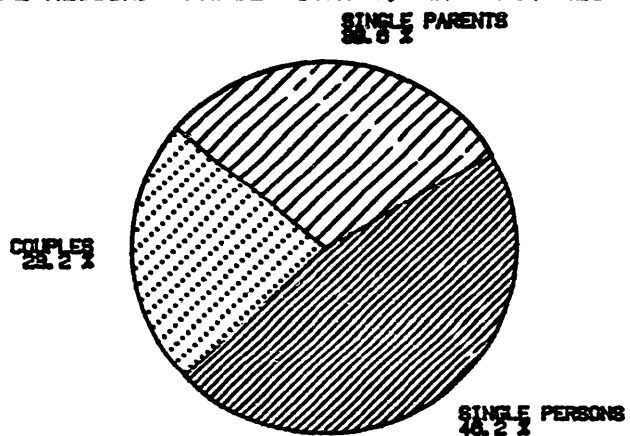

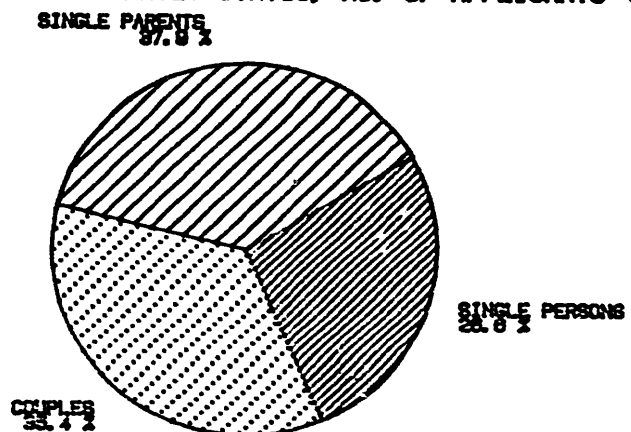

YELLOWKNIFE REGION: FAMILY STATUS, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



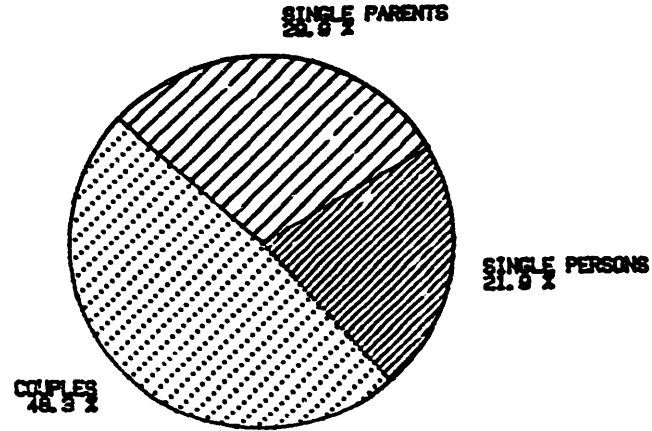

YELLOWKNIFE REGION: FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)



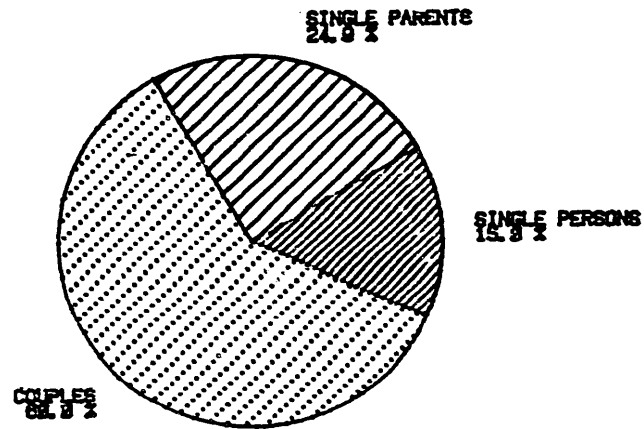

FORT SMITH REGION: FAMILY STATUS, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



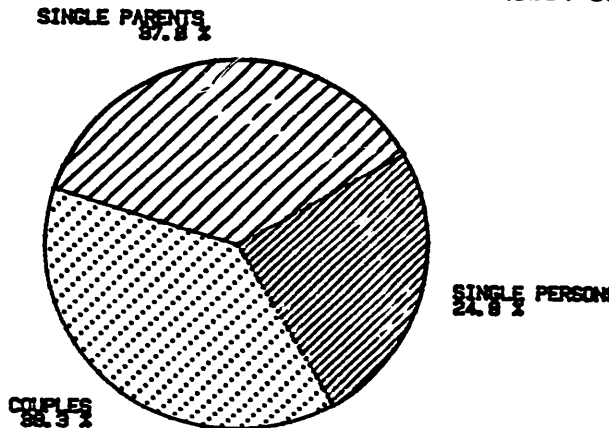

FORT SMITH REGION: FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)



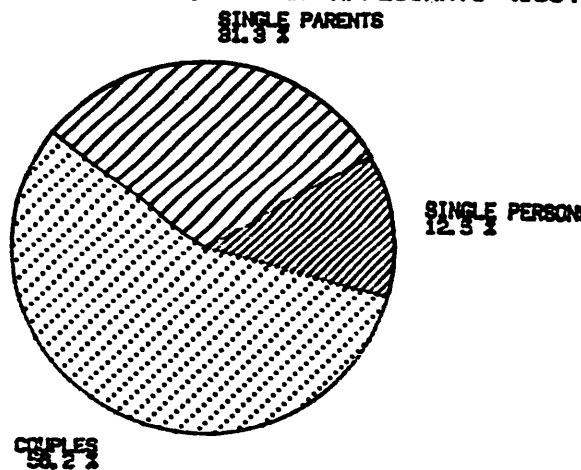

INUVIK REGION: FAMILY STATUS, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



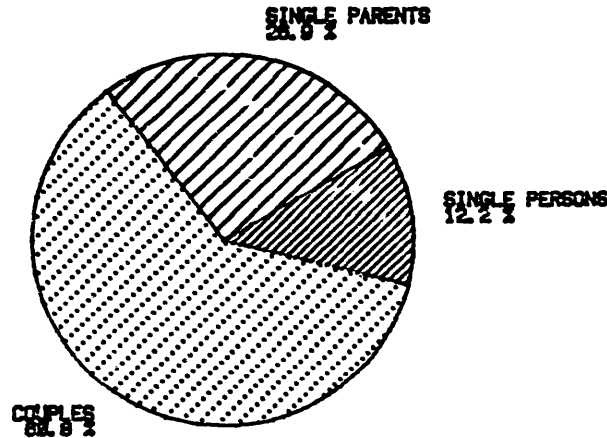

INUVIK REGION: FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)



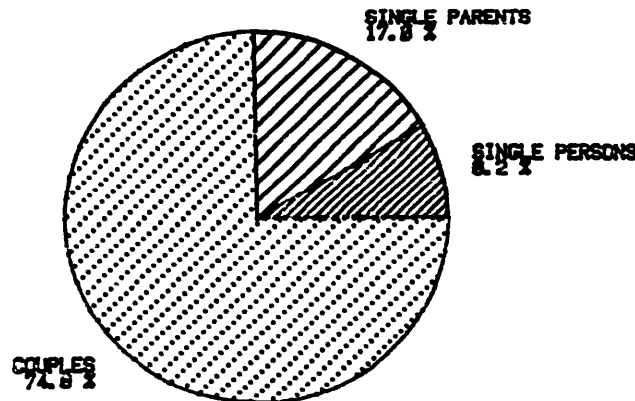

BAFFIN REGION: FAMILY STATUS, EXPENDITURES (1984-85)

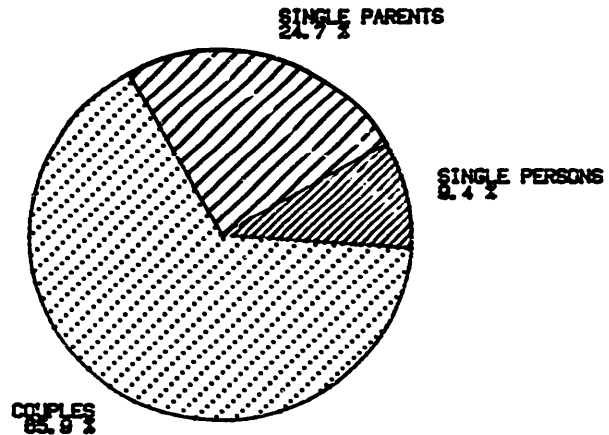

BAFFIN REGION: FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)

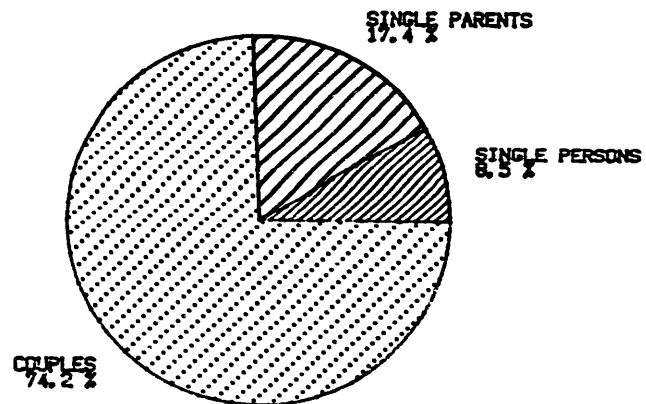

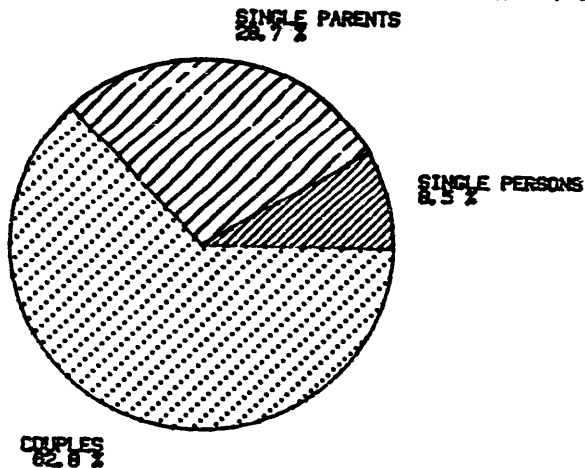

KEEWATIN REGION: FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)



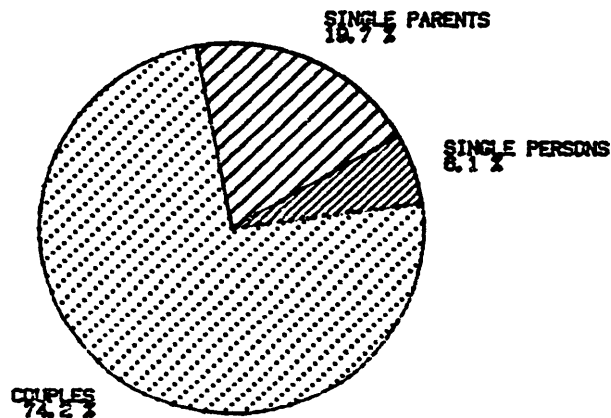

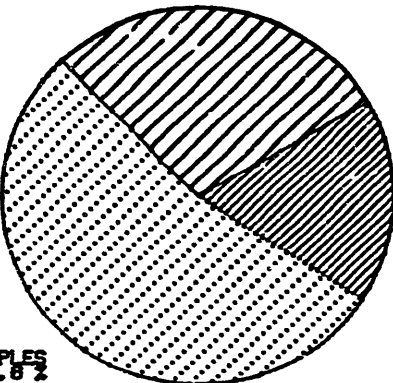
KITIKMEOT REGION, FAMILY STATUS, NO. OF APPLICANTS (1984-85)

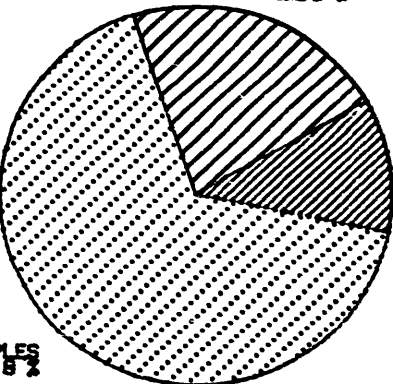

The range in average social assistance per recipient in the communities is from \$641 (Arctic Red River) to \$2,918 (Eskimo Point). 60% of the communities lies within a range of \$931 to \$2,085, ie: \$1,154. (Technically this represents one "standard deviation" on either side of the "mean").

The range in average social assistance per case is from \$172 (Lake Harbour) to \$574 (Norman Wells). 60% of the communities lies within a range of \$248 to \$386.

The range in percent of communities on social assistance is from 2% (Pine Point) to 91% (Snowdrift) with an average of 38%. 60% of the communities lies within a range of 18% to 58%.

There appears to be no pattern to account for the distribution of communities along the continuum. The range is wide and the regions are well distributed.

Arctic Red River (Pine Point) \$172 (Norman Wells) \$574. 60% of the communities lies within a range of \$931 to \$2,085, ie: \$1,154. (Technically this represents one "standard deviation" on either side of the "mean").

Snowdrift - 91% of communities on social assistance. 60% of the communities lies within a range of \$248 to \$386.

CLM and CLD are also included in the distribution of communities along the continuum.

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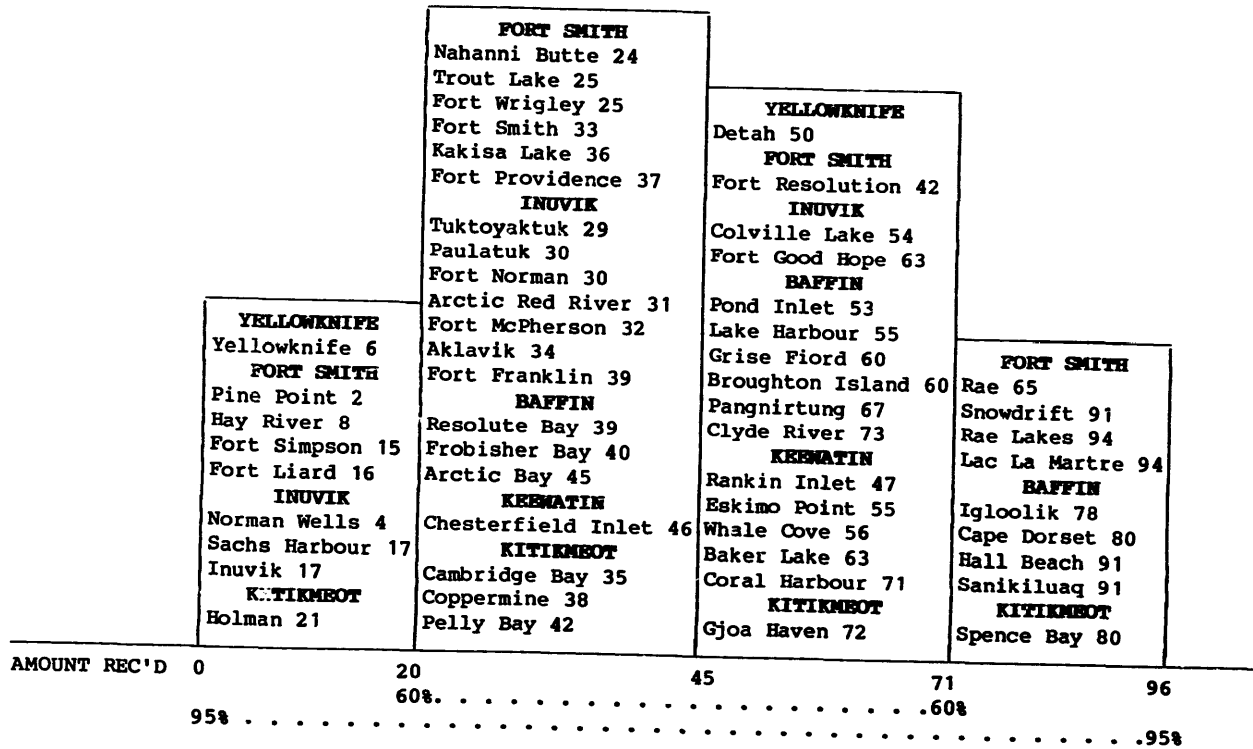

Social assistance can be used to cover the cost of rent, mortgage payments and utilities.

Table 25 shows the number of people who receive assistance for rent, mortgage payments and utilities in the following categories:

1. HOUSING CORPORATION - minimum rent.
The Housing Corporation charges a minimum rent of \$32 to all tenants with an (approximate) income of \$200/month or less. Utilities are not included in the minimum rent.
2. HOUSING CORPORATION - more than minimum rent.
The Housing Corporation charges rent according to the income of the tenant. Income between \$200 and \$400/month is assessed at a sliding percentage of 16.7% to 25%. Above \$400, rent is 25% of the assessed income. (NOTE: Assessed income is actual income less certain deductions. Utilities are not included in the rent charged.)
3. OTHER SOURCES - Rent to other sources, ie: rent to a landlord other than the Housing Corporation.
4. MORTGAGE ASSISTANCE - A monthly allowance may be paid to persons who are purchasing their own home if the costs are not more than it would be for rented accommodation.

The table also shows the average payments per month, the average total payments per year and the average number of months for which people received rent assistance.

SECTION XII - NEED ITEMS

The allowance for food takes up almost 70% of social assistance expenditures; clothing 7% and rent 5% are the next major items.

In Yellowknife food (30%) is the major item; in the Fort Smith and Inuvik regions food is 56%; north of the tree line in the Baffin, Keewatin and Kitikmeot regions food is approximately 80%, clothing is over 7% in Yellowknife and in the Fort Smith, Inuvik and Keewatin regions, 5% in the Baffin Region and under 3% in the Keewatin region.

Food Expenditures

Food expenditures take up almost 70% of social assistance expenditures; clothing 7% and rent 5% are the next major items. 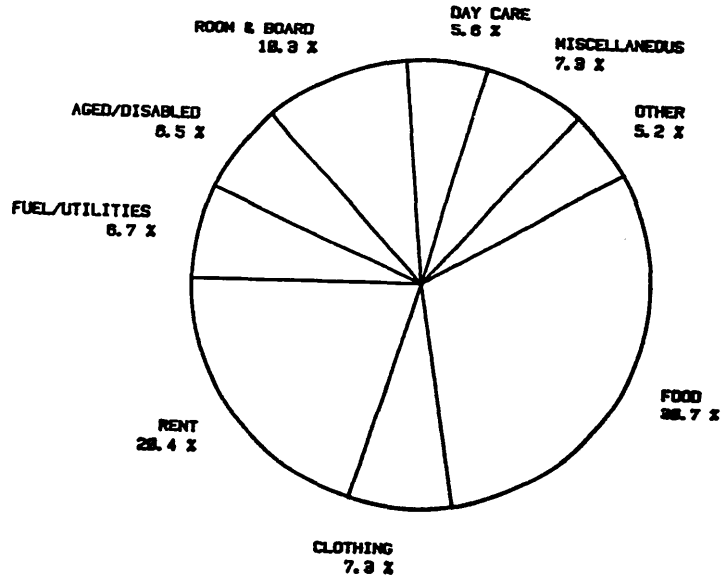

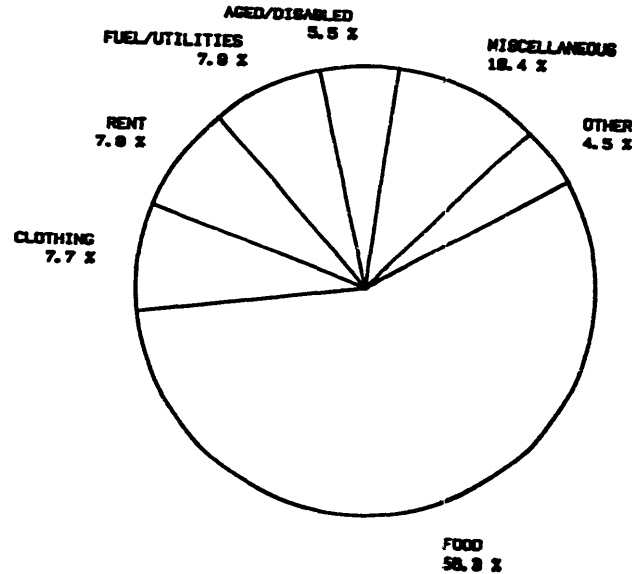

YELLOWKNIFE REGION NEED AMOUNT EXPENDITURES (1984-85)

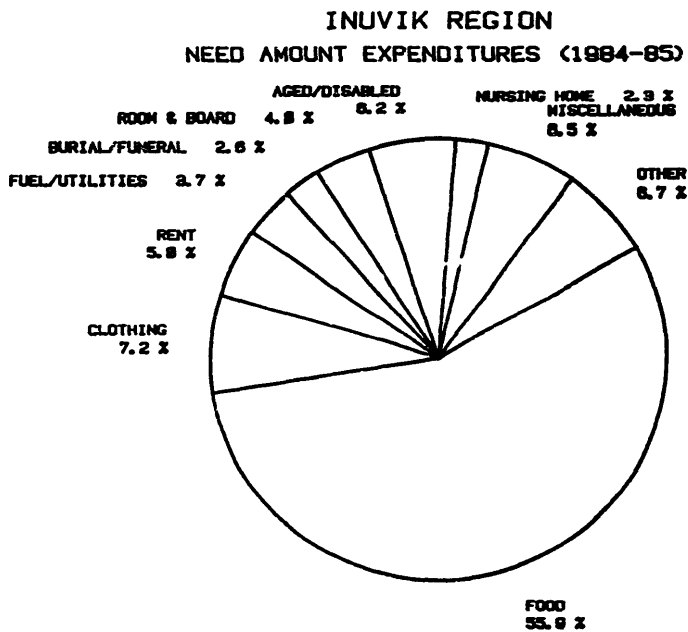

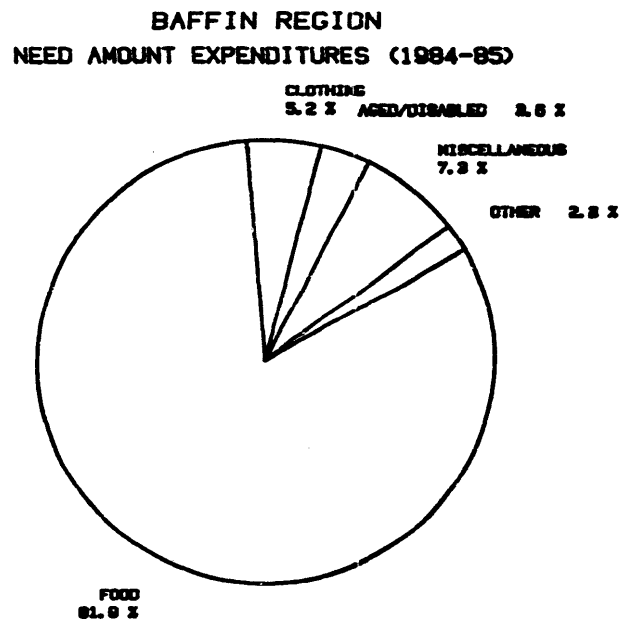
FORT SMITH REGION NEED AMOUNT EXPENDITURES (1984-85)

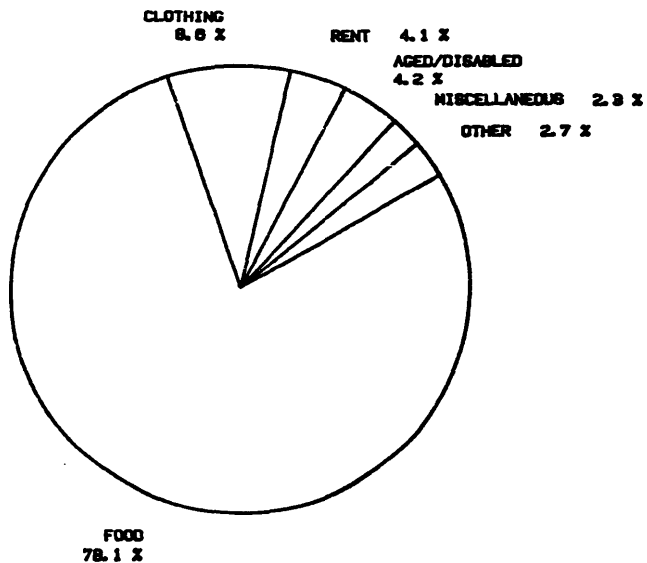

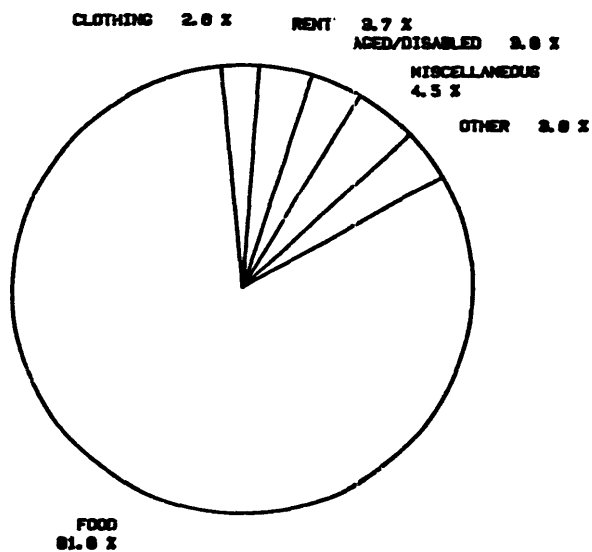
NEED AMOUNT EXPENDITURES (1984-85)

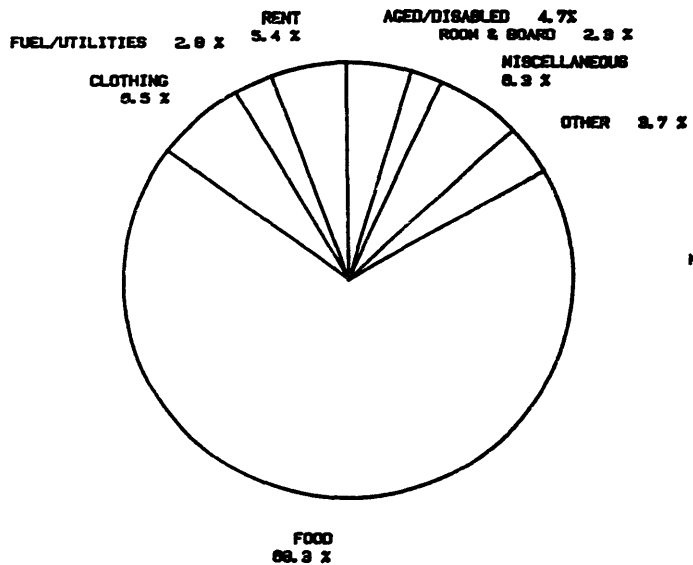
KITIKMEOT REGION

NEED AMOUNT EXPENDITURES (1984-85)



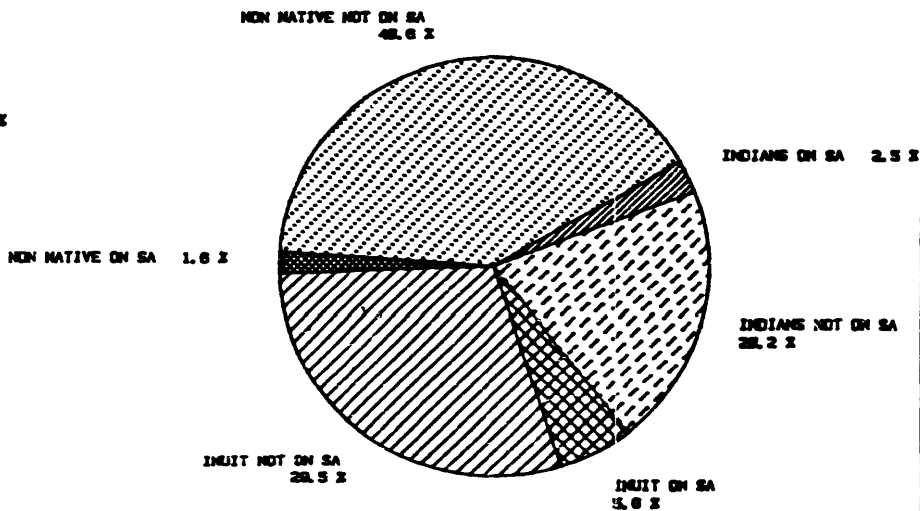
