Dear Bob,


Thank you for your letter of June 15 outlining services available at the Keewatin Guest Lodge.

Services include:

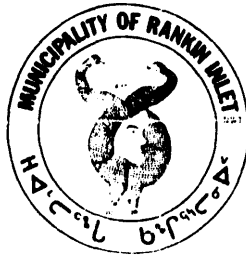
Bed and Breakfast - \$65.00 per person per night.

Dear Mr. Bisset;


It is a pleasure to inform you that Council has approved your licence for Keewatin Lodge.

Dear Sir:

Keewatin Guest Lodge has been operating in Rankin Inlet since August 1983. While our business is still quite small, we are planning to expand. Over the past 10 months we have provided accommodation for a broad variety of guests. They have all expressed approval and encouragement for the services we have provided. Some have travelled to Rankin Inlet on several different dates and stayed with us each time.

Over the past 2 - 3 weeks several persons have indicated they would prefer to stay at Keewatin Guest Lodge, however, have been prevented because of an interpretation of a directive to departments of the Government of N.W.T. stating that personnel on business travel must stay at the commercial hotel or transient centre if space is available.

In our case I believe this is an unjust interpretation as we are licenced by the Hamlet of Rankin Inlet the same as Rankin Inlet Lodge. We are a commercial establishment, open year round, providing a quiet home type atmosphere for our guests. We presently have 2 guest rooms each with twin beds, dresser, night table and lamp, decorated as at home with window curtains, blinds, wall pictures and niks etc. Our rate is \$65.00 daily bed and breakfast. Lunch is \$6.00 and dinner \$15.00 if desired and requested by the guest. We have provided breakfast as early as 5 A.M. and dinner as late as 10 P.M. for guests who were departing early or arriving late. Our guests, during their stay, have the run of the house just as if they were home and are treated as part of our family. This they like.

I request your assistance and co-operation in clarifying the essence of the directive as pertaining to Rankin Inlet.

That Government of N.W.T. personnel have the choice of staying at the Rankin Inlet Lodge or Keewatin Guest Lodge, whichever they prefer.

If you agree, I ask that a memo verifying the above be sent to the different departments of the Government of N.W.T. both in Rankin Inlet and outside the district.
