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HAY RIVER STUDENTS HOLD MOCK ASSEMBLY SESSION

YELLOWKNIFE (February 3, 1987) - During a recent session of the Legislative Assembly held in Hay River, the Members took part in an impassioned debate on the benefits of division for the people of the Northwest Territories.

But this was a mock session of the Assembly and Grade Four students at Camsell-St. Paul's School played the roles of MLAs.

As part of their social studies curriculum, the students are studying the operations of the Legislative Assembly and government in the Northwest Territories.

The Hon. Donald Stewart, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly and MLA for Hay River, and David Hamilton, Clerk of the Assembly, were invited to preside over the session, held last week.

Students in Yellowknife regularly attend sittings of the Assembly, but students living in communities outside the capital do not have the same opportunity to see government in action.

"This visit allows the students to experience a session of the Assembly and gives them an appreciation of how their government works and the roles and responsibilities of their elected representatives". Mr. Stewart explained. In a replica of the Assembly Chamber set up in the school gymnasium, with Mr. Stewart in the Speaker's Chair, 60 Grade Four students participated in the debate organized by their teacher, Pat Thomas.

Earlier in the day, Mr. Stewart also talked to Grade Five and Six students at the school. The students saw a slide presentation and videotape of a real Assembly session, followed by a question and answer session with Mr. Stewart.

Questions ranged from the origin of the robes worn by the Speaker and Clerk to "what will happen to the Northwest Territories' flag if the Territories divide?".

As well, the students showed great interest in the Assembly's mace, the symbol of the power of the Legislature, which was shipped to Hay River for the day.

Mr. Stewart stressed the importance of the parliamentary system and urged students to consider a career in politics. "A government is only as good as the people who participate in it", the Speaker said.

During his visit to the Hay River schools, Mr. Stewart also presented a contribution to members of the graduating class of Diamond Jenness Secondary School who are raising funds to travel to London, Paris and Rome during March break.

COMMITTEE TO HOLD PUBLIC REVIEW OF GOVERNMENT SPENDING

YELLOWKNIFE (April 14, 1987) - The Legislative Assembly's Standing Committee on Public Accounts will meet in Yellowknife April 28 to 30 to review the Territorial government's accounts and the Auditor General of Canada's report for 1985/86.

The Committee's sessions will be open to the public, beginning at 1:30 each day, in the Caucus Room of the Legislative Assembly Building.

The Public Accounts Committee, chaired by Slave River MLA Arnold McCallum, conducts an annual review of the government's accounts and financial transactions to determine how the government's money was spent and to ensure it was spent following proper procedures.

During this year's review, the Committee will follow up on its report from the previous year to ensure its recommendations have been implemented. As well, the Committee plans to examine the government's accounts to evaluate the format and any changes in accounting practices and principles.

NWT RETURNING OFFICERS APPOINTED

YELLOWKNIFE (May 15, 1987) - The Chief Electoral Officer has appointed a returning officer in each of the 24 NWT constituencies in preparation for a Territorial election expected this fall.

Jean-Marc Hamel, Chief Electoral Officer for Canada, is administering the Territorial election this year under an agreement with the Northwest Territories. According to the provisions of the new NWT Elections Act, future elections will be administered solely by the Northwest Territories.

The newly-appointed returning officers will travel to Yellowknife in June for training sessions with officials of Elections Canada and of the Office of the Legislative Assembly.

The returning officer in each electoral district is responsible for the administration of the election in his or her area. This includes responsibility for appointing an election clerk to assist him or her; for dividing the electoral district into polling divisions; for ensuring that all eligible electors are enumerated; and, for co-ordinating the distribution and receipt of election documents during and after the election. The dates of dissolution of the Tenth Assembly and election of Members of the Eleventh Assembly will be set during the Legislative Assembly session reconvening in Yellowknife May 26.

LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY PROTESTS CONSTITUTIONAL ACCORD

YELLOWKNIFE (May 28, 1987) - The text of a motion protesting the northern territories' exclusion from the recent constitutional talks at Meech Lake will be delivered to Prime Minister Brian Mulroney tomorrow.

The Hon. Donald Stewart, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, will be in Ottawa to deliver the motion, passed unanimously by MLAs today.

Representatives of the Yukon and Northwest Territories were not invited to participate in the constitutional conference despite the fact that the Constitution of Canada "specifically recognizes the existence of the Governments and Legislative Assemblies of the Yukon Territory and the Northwest Territories", the motion states.

Under provisions in the Meech Lake Accord, unanimous consent among the ten provinces is required before constitutional changes, including the creation of new provinces, can be made.


The motion, moved by Yellowknife South MLA Ted Richard, notes that despite the fact the Accord includes amendments directly and indirectly affecting Canadians resident in Yukon and Northwest Territories, the Prime Minister and First Ministers have not invited the northern governments to take part in the talks. "This is arrogant, paternalistic and insensitive on a human level and a scandalous travesty of justice on the political level", Yellowknife Centre MLA Bob MacQuarrie said in speaking to the motion.

"We demand our right to be heard", Mr, Richard added.

The motion directs the Speaker to communicate the Northwest Territories' objections in the strongest possible terms to the Prime Minister and the Premiers of each province.

ASSEMBLY TO HOLD EMERGENCY DEBATE ON AIDS

YELLOWKNIFE (June 4, 1987) - The Legislative Assembly will hold an emergency debate today on the problem of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) in the Northwest Territories.

Appearing as witnesses during the debate in Committee will be Dr. David Kinloch, Regional Medical Officer with Health and Welfare Canada, and Dr. Luis Barreto, epidemiologist for the Territorial Department of Health.

The emergency debate is expected to begin at approximately 4 p.m.

ENUMERATION OF VOTERS BEGINS SEPTEMBER 2

YELLOWKNIFE (August 31, 1987) - Enumeration of voters for the Territorial Election begins Wednesday, September 2.

During the four-day period between September 2 and September 5, enumerators in each community will prepare preliminary lists of voters eligible to cast ballots in the Election October 5.

To qualify to vote in the Territorial Election, electors must be Canadian citizens, 19 years of age or older and have lived in the Northwest Territories since at least October 5, 1986.

Enumerators prepare the preliminary voters' list from various sources including house-to-house calls.

When the voters' list is completed it is posted in a public place in each polling division. Eligible voters whose names do not appear on the list should apply to the Returning Officer for their electoral district if they live in the same community. If voters do not live in the same community as the Returning Officer, they should contact the enumerator in their community by no later than 8:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 16 to have their names added to the revised voters' list. Voters whose names do not appear on the official list can also apply on Election Day to be added to the voters' list. However, these voters will not be able to vote at advance polls or by proxy.

With the issue of the proclamations, the 45-day election period begins, ending October 5 on Polling Day. After Election Day, when the results have been finalized, the Returning Officers send the Writs to the Chief Electoral Officer in Ottawa to complete the election process.

PROXY VOTING ALLOWED AT TERRITORIAL ELECTION

YELLOWKNIFE (September 11, 1987) – Eligible voters who are not able to vote on Territorial Election Day, October 5 may be able to vote by proxy.

The NWT Elections Act allows a person who cannot vote at the advance polls on September 24 and September 29 or on the regular polling day to have another person vote for him or her on Election Day.

In order to vote by proxy, the elector must have reason to believe that he or she will be unable to vote on one of the three days set aside for voting and the elector and the person who will cast the proxy vote must have their names on the voters' list in the same electoral district.

Eligible voters must be Canadian citizens, at least 19 years of age and resident in the Northwest Territories since at least October 5, 1986.

An Appointment, Consent and Oath of Proxy Voter form must be completed by both the elector wishing to vote by proxy and the elector appointed as proxy voter. These forms are available from Returning Officers in each electoral district. The elector wishing to vote by proxy completes the Appointment, the elector who will be the proxy voter completes the Consent and both must sign the form and have it witnessed.

When the proxy voter goes to the poll on October 5, he or she will take the oath before the Deputy Returning Officer and will then be given the ballots.

A proxy voter may vote on behalf of only three electors at an election.

Proxy voting is not allowed at advance polls.

MOBILE POLL TO BE HELD IN CENTRAL ARCTIC COMMUNITIES

On September 30, a deputy returning officer and poll clerk will travel from Cambridge Bay to conduct the poll in Bay Chimo and Bathurst Inlet. Both communities are in the constituency of Kitikmeot West. Government of N.W.T. Yellowknife, N.W.T. Proxy voting is not permitted at mobile polls.



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


COMMITTEE ANNOUNCES PORTFOLIO RESPONSIBILITIES
