Second Reading of Bills

Bill 6: *Cannabis Legalization and Regulation Implementation Act.*

Consideration in Committee of the Whole of Bills and Other Matters

I MOVE that this Assembly recommends that the Minister of Municipal and Community Affairs develop a funding policy, which provides clear guidance as to funding eligibility requirements, to guide the disbursement of lottery funding under the new *Western Canada Lottery Act*.

**Committee Motion 29-18(3):**


Moved by the Member for Kam Lake:


I MOVE that this Assembly recommends that the Minister of Municipal and Community Affairs make a submission to the Financial Management Board requesting that the Financial Management Board establish a limit on any accumulated deficit or surplus in the Physical Activity, Sport and Recreation Fund;

AND FURTHERMORE, that this limit be made public, shared with the Standing Committee on Government Operations and reported upon annually by the Department in its year-end reporting on the fund.
