About This Material

The Northwest Territories Legislative Assembly provides pension benefits to its elected members under the Legislative Assembly Retiring Allowances Act (RAA) and the Supplementary Retiring Allowances Act (SRAA). Section 21 of the RAA and section 11.1 of the SRAA require that a report on the administration of each Act be presented to the Assembly by the Board of Management each fiscal year.

This report summarizes the current active membership, inactive members and plan assets. An appendix to this report summarizes all of the positions held, past and present, of the current 19 members.



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Membership Information

Overview

There are several categories of membership under the Act:

- Active members are the current elected Members of the Assembly;
- Deferred non-vested members are former Members of the Assembly who left prior to becoming eligible for a pension (vested). If they return to the Assembly and become vested, they will be eligible for their full pensions;
- Deferred vested pensioners are former active members who are entitled to a pension, but have not yet commenced receiving it.
- Pensioners are former members or survivors of former members who are currently in receipt of a pension.

A number of Members are entitled to a deferred pension for positions (such as Minister or Chairperson) which they held in the past, but no longer hold. Appendix A summarizes these positions for each of the current Members.

Members who have held a position for less than one year are not vested in a pension for these positions. However, if they resume a position and complete, in aggregate, one year of service in the position, they will be entitled to a deferred pension. Therefore, Appendix A also tracks these nonvested positions.

Pensioners

On March 31, 2006 there were thirty-three (33) prior members or survivors of prior members receiving monthly pensions from the RAA and thirty-three (33) from the SRAA, as outlined in Table 1.

On January 1 each year, pensions are increased to reflect changes in the cost of living as measured by the average Consumer Price Index to September 30 of the previous year. The January 1, 2006 increase was 2.24%.

Page six (6) shows the Members receiving pensions as at April 1, 2006 under the RAA and the SRAA.

Non-Vested Terminated Members (Deferred Non-Vested)

There are thirteen (13) former Members in total who left the Assembly before becoming eligible for a pension. They have not been re-elected for more than two Assemblies; therefore we have not shown details for these former Members. Such former Members who are re-elected must pay back to the RAA pension fund their contributions that were refunded when they left with interest in order to be reinstated in their previous service.

Membership Changes: Terminated Members

The following member left the Assembly during the Plan year and received a lump sum settlement from the RAA. He was not entitled to a benefit from the SRAA. He did however have both an RAA and SRAA pension for previous service and these pensions have been reinstated.

Additional SRAA Payment

Section 10.1 of the SRAA provides for a payment equal to 6.50% of a member's remuneration from the date they were first elected to March 31, 1996 plus interest for members who:

- a) Were first elected in the Thirteenth Assembly, or
- b) Were first elected in the Twelfth Assembly but had less then two years of service in the Twelfth Assembly.

The payment is payable when the member ceases to be a member. The accumulated entitlements at March 31, 2006 of the remaining four (4) members are summarized in the following table:

Maximum Benefit

Section 20.1 of the Act states that the combined allowance payable under the RAA and the SRAA must not exceed, in total, 75% of the best average earnings of a member at retirement. There are currently no member(s) who will reach the 75% maximum in the next five years.



April 1, 2006






