Whereas our two Members of Parliament are of aboriginal and believe in aboriginal principals of compassion, cooperation and harmony;

Now Therefore be it resolved that the Leadership of the Deh Cho First Nation which include the Dene, Metis and Northerner oppose the Bill C-68 as it now reads;

And be it further resolved that the Members of Parliament for the Western Arctic, the Honograble Ethel Blondin-Andrew as our elected representative not support third reading of Bill C-68;

And be it further resolved that she, Ethel Blondin-Andrew vote and speak out publicly against Bill C-68.
