Would not a sales tax , including binges and nevasdas be more equitable?

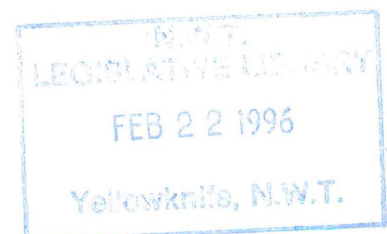

This has a couple of effects, the strike is meaningless for a good percentage of civil servants and any strike is meaningless as the essentials of government operations are covered by non-striking employees. But what happens to us poor people who may whether we want to strike or not will be without wage or income because even if we go to work and the union has voted for strike, we are fined the amount of our daily wage because we crossed the line?

Please listen to your constituents before a swift passing of this bad legislation.
