FREQUENT FLYERS GROUNDED — PUBLIC SERVANTS NO LONGER GET POINTS FOR FREE FLIGHTS

OTTAWA, ON-High-flying bureaucrats have had their wings clipped.

They have lost one of their biggest perks free airline tickets.

No longer will federal public servants get free tickets for leisure trips by taking advantage of frequent-flyer programs offered by domestic airlines.

The federal government has quietly abandoned as a failure a voluntary program under which bureaucrats were supposed to turn in their frequent-flyer points for later use on government business.

Canada's two major airlines have agreed that from now on, all frequent-flyer points earned by public servants on government business will be credited directly to the government.

By moving to prevent abuses of frequent-flyer programs, the government is potentially going to save up to \$20 million a year.

About 1,600 federal bureaucrats take airline trips every working day.
