## SOBRIETY OF ALCOHOL & DRUG COUNSELLORS

WHEREAS alcohol and illegal drugs are major threats to the health and wellbeing of Denendeh and the people of the Deh Cho Region;

AND WHEREAS the Government of the Northwest Territories provides contribution funding to local operations in 5 Deh Cho communities and 35 other communities across the Northwest Territories;

AND WHEREAS the Dene of the Northwest Territories have traditionally valued personal honesty, effective role modelling and healthy living as the cornerstones to counselling troubled or ill members of our communities;

AND WHEREAS the effectiveness of addictions counselling is reduced when the conduct of alcohol and drug workers becomes inconsistent with the philosophy of a healthy alcohol and drug-free lifestyle;

AND WHERES the credibility of alcohol and drug workers in community settings is significantly diminished by their personal use of intoxicants;

AND WHEREAS the operation of an efficient community treatment or prevention project is hindered when employees embrace a lifestyle which places them at risk of addiction;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Deh Cho Regional Council express its unlimited support for the decision by the Territorial Minister of Social Services obligating each recipient of 1991-92 contribution funding for the operation of alcohol and drug counselling projects;

- a. To ensure the effective operation of the program by hiring only employees who practise sobriety;
- b. To ensure that all employees of the project understand that sobriety means total abstinence from alcohol and drugs, and,
- c. To ensure that current employees of the project who do not practise sobriety be identified, and be provided with counselling and treatment to attain sobriety;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Deh Cho Regional Council strongly recommend to the Government of the Northwest Territories that a policy framework should be developed to ensure that such obligations are placed on recipients of alcohol and drug contribution funding in 1992-93 and in subsequent years;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution only addresses the issue;
