STATEMENT OF CLAIM

Filed on the 4th day of November 1992.

I. THE PARTIES

- 1. The Plaintiff, Government of the Northwest Territories ("GNWT"), is the duly constituted government elected by the citizens of Canada resident in the Northwest Territories. The Plaintiff GNWT concluded certain agreements with the Government of Canada (Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada) which concerned the delivery, administration and funding of hospital services in the Northwest Territories. These agreements which are described below in Part III provide, *inter alia*, "that Canada will assume the total cost" of hospital services provided to status Indians and Inuit.
- 2. The Plaintiff, Minister of Health of the Northwest Territories, holds office by appointment made pursuant to the <u>Legislative Assembly and Executive Council Act</u>,

R.S.N.W.T. 1988, c. L-5 (as amended). He is a signatory on behalf of the GNWT to the agreements described below in Part III.

- 3. The Plaintiff, Commissioner of the Northwest Territories, is the Chief Executive Officer for the Northwest Territories. He is a signatory on behalf of the GNWT to the agreements described below in Part III pursuant to the terms of section 19 of the Northwest Territories Act, R.S.C. 1985, c. N-27 (as amended).
- 4. The Defendant Ministers of National Health and Welfare and of Indian Affairs and Northern Development are signatories on behalf of the Government of Canada to the agreements made between Canada and the Northwest Territories for the provision of hospital services in the Northwest Territories that are described below in Part III.

II. HISTORY OF HOSPITAL CARE IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

- 5. After 1960, there were two delivery systems for providing hospital services to NWT residents. One delivery system was operated by the GNWT and one was operated by Health and Welfare Canada ("HWC"). Both were funded, directly or indirectly, by the Government of Canada. There were no formal geographic or functional distinctions between these two delivery systems, but, generally, the GNWT delivered hospital services for Métis and non-native users and HWC delivered hospital services to status Indians and Inuit.
- 6. For reasons of administrative efficiency, the GNWT began in 1982 to take over the administration of certain HWC delivery systems. This assumption of administration took another step in 1988 with the Health Transfer Agreement discussed below in Part III. At no time either during or after the period of administrative transfer was any agreement reached or decision taken to alter the legal responsibility for funding hospital services. In particular, funding for status Indians and Inuit was throughout and remains the responsibility of the Government of Canada.
- 7. Both GNWT and federal officials from the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development ("DIAND") and from HWC declined to transfer legal responsibility for the funding of hospital services for status Indians and Inuit at the time of the administrative transfers. Indeed, it was always the understanding of the GNWT that any such transfer of funding responsibility would require the consultation and agreement of the affected native organizations.

III. THE AGREEMENTS

- 8. On or about October 28, 1986, representatives of the Government of Canada and the GNWT signed an agreement which provided for financial contributions to be paid to the GNWT by the Government of Canada for the purpose of funding the "total cost" of hospital care for status Indians and Inuit (the "1986 Contribution Agreement").
- 9. Paragraph 12 of the 1986 Contribution Agreement provides that contributions shall be made on the basis of estimated billing of the total value of services rendered, and that such contributions are to be adjusted "once the amount actually and properly payable under the agreement becomes known".
- 10. On or about March 21, 1988, an agreement was signed between representatives of the Government of Canada and representatives of the GNWT which provided for the transfer from Canada to the GNWT of the responsibility to deliver certain hospital and health care services in the Northwest Territories (the "1988 Health Transfer Agreement").
- 11. On or about August 23, 1989, representatives of the Government of Canada and the GNWT signed an agreement which provided for financial contributions to be paid to the GNWT by the Government of Canada for the purpose of funding the "total cost" of hospital care for status Indians and Inuit (the "1989 Contribution Agreement").
- 12. Paragraph 11 of the 1989 Contribution Agreement states that "The territory shall provide Canada no later than sixty days following each fiscal year with a detailed accounting based on actuals for that particular fiscal year."

IV. THE DEBT INCURRED BY THE DEFENDANTS

Ontribution Agreement, the Defendants have obligated themselves to contribute to the GNWT the sum "so calculated that Canada will assume the total cost of hospital care provided to status Indians and Inuit". This legal obligation was not altered by the 1988 Health Transfer Agreement, although the method of calculating the reciprocal billing amounts was affected slightly. Since the signing of the 1988 Health Transfer Agreement, Canada has received credit in the billing calculations for an amount transferred into the Gross Expenditure Base (GEB) of the GNWT pursuant to Section 4 of the 1988 Health Transfer Agreement.

- 14. The application of what is known as the "P/L escalator" to the amounts transferred into the GEB of the GNWT has been the subject of negotiations between the Government of Canada and the GNWT. This term is referred to in the 1988 Health Transfer Agreement. The Plaintiffs acknowledge that if the Defendants' position on the applicability of the P/L escalator were to be accepted, the amounts owing to the Plaintiffs would be reduced by a determinable amount.
- 15. The Defendants are obligated to pay the "total cost" of hospital services for status Indians and Inuit on the basis of actual costs incurred. This principle is clearly spelled out by paragraph 12 of the 1986 Contribution Agreement and by paragraph 11 of the 1989 Contribution Agreement.
- 16. The Government of Canada, and in particular the Defendant Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, has repeatedly and explicitly acknowledged the basic responsibility for funding the costs for hospital services for status Indians and Inuit in the Northwest Territories.
- 17. Indeed, the Defendants have paid or transferred to the GNWT significant sums for fiscal years 1986/87 to 1991/92 pursuant to the terms of the agreements mentioned above in Part III. However, the Defendants have not paid or transferred sufficient sums to meet their obligations as defined by these agreements.
- 18. The Plaintiffs have submitted their accounts to the Defendants (or their agents) at regular intervals as called for by the above-mentioned agreements. The Plaintiffs have complied with these agreements in all other ways.
- 19. Until recently, however, it was not feasible for the GNWT to accurately determine the actual costs of usage of hospital facilities by status Indian and Inuit. Accordingly, the bills presented for the period from 1986/87 to 1991/92 were based on estimates of usage of territorial hospital services by status Indians and Inuits based upon a percentage of the population for the service area of each facility.
- 20. Officials of the GNWT have now produced revised billings based on actual costs of hospital services as called for by the agreements. These revised billings were forwarded to the Defendant Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development. Payment of these sums has not been received.
- 21. At all relevant times, the Plaintiffs have itemized and justified each of the costs incurred in the delivery of hospital services to status Indians and Inuit. The costs

incurred and the billings charged to the Defendants are set out for each fiscal year and attached as Schedule "A" to this Statement of Claim.

- 22. The Defendants have failed to make the required contributions to the Northwest Territories, and in so doing are in breach of the agreements mentioned above in Part III.
- As a result of the Defendants' failure to contribute the amounts called for by these agreements, the Plaintiffs have incurred substantial hardship in continuing to provide hospital services to status Indians and Inuit, which they continue to provide notwithstanding the Defendants' breach.

V. RELIEF SOUGHT

- 24. Accordingly, the Plaintiffs claim as follows:
 - a) the sum of seventy-nine million, twenty-two thousand, one hundred and thirty six dollars (\$79,022,136) as per the statements of accounts attached as Schedule "A";
 - b) pre-judgment and post-judgment interest at a rate to be fixed by this Honourable Court in accordance with sections 36 and 37 of the Federal Court Act; and
 - c) costs of this action on a solicitor and client basis including any goods and services taxes which may be payable; and
 - d) such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

The Plaintiffs propose that this action be tried at Ottawa.
