

**TERMS OF REFERENCE  
1992 LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF THE  
WORKER'S COMPENSATION ACT**

1. To examine the present *Worker's Compensation Act* and identify those areas where legislative action is required to provide a more effective, equitable and efficient system to workers, employers and the Northwest Territories as a whole.
2. To engage in consultations as required or deemed necessary
3. The Review shall take into account the two Reports of the Committee on Agencies, Boards and Commissions on the Workers' Compensation Board dated June 18 and June 26, 1992. In addition, extensive use shall be made of the two previous large scale reviews of the W.C.B. completed in 1986 and 1989. Current legislation and legislative reform in other jurisdictions should also be considered.
4. To establish and forward to the Minister, comprehensive evaluations and recommendations on suggested improvements to the *Workers' Compensation Act*. The final "*Legislative Action Plan*" will outline the areas where reform is required and will suggest changes.
5. The review shall take into account the diversity of the Northwest Territories with its aboriginal cultures and traditional subsistence-based economy alongside the wage economy.
