STATUS OF WOMEN COUNCIL ACT

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Government of M.VV.T. Yellowlosia, N.VV.T.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Status of Women Council of the Northwest Territories; to set out the objects and powers of the Council; to provide for the appointment of members to the Council; to limit the personal liability of members of the Council; to provide for the designation of a President and two Vice-Presidents of the Council; to permit the Council to hire its own employees; to establish the fiscal year of the Council; to provide for the tabling of an annual report; to consequentially amend the Financial Administration Act by adding the Council to Schedule A of that Act; and to repeal the Advisory Council on the Status of Women Act.

IMPORTANT

This Bill is tabled for public review. This proposed Act does not represent the final policy of the Government of the Northwest Territories and is subject to change after public review and comment. Furthermore, changes of a technical nature can be expected to prepare the Bill for introduction in the Legislative Assembly.

Powers	 (2) The Council may (a) receive and hear submissions and suggestions from individuals and groups concerning the status of women; (b) research matters relating to the status of women; (c) suggest research areas in relation to matters relating to the status of women 	35

Composition	4. (1) The Council shall be composed of not fewer than five and not greater than nine members, as the Minister considers appropriate.	50
Appointment	(2) The Minister shall appoint a member for a term of not less than one year and not more than three years, to be determined at the time of appointment.

Vacancy	 (5) Where there is a vacancy on the Council and the remaining number of members is less than five, (a) the Minister shall, within 90 days of the vacancy occurring, fill the vacancy; and (b) where the vacancy occurs because the term of a member has expired, the member shall remain in office until the vacancy is filled. 	10

Place of meetings	9. (1) The Council may hold its meetings in any place in the Northwest Territories.

Funding	10. The Council may receive grants, contributions and donations for carrying out the purposes of this Act.	
Fiscal year	11. The fiscal year of the Council is the period beginning on April 1 in one year and ending on March 31 in the following year.	10
Annual report	12. (1) Before July 1 of each year, the Council shall submit to the Minister an annual report consisting of	15
