

AIDS PROGRAM IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES UPDATE

MR. SPEAKER, SINCE THE LAST SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE
ASSEMBLY THE N.W.T. AIDS PROGRAM HAS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE
INFORMATION ABOUT AIDS TO THE PUBLIC, THROUGH NEWSPAPER
ADVERTISEMENTS, POSTERS, PAMPHLETS, THE TOLL FREE
TELEPHONE INFORMATION LINE, REGIONAL AND COMMUNITY
WORKSHOPS, AND THROUGH THE N.W.T. SCHOOL HEALTH
CURRICULUM.

DEPARTMENTAL STAFF HAVE PARTICIPATED IN WORKSHOPS IN SEVERAL COMMUNITIES IN THE BAFFIN AND KEEWATIN REGIONS, AND ALSO IN THE YOUTH CONFERENCE HELD IN ARVIAT THIS SUMMER. LAST MONTH, THE AIDS PROGRAM STAFF TOOK PART IN THE CONFERENCE AT FORT SMITH ORGANIZED BY UNCLE GABE'S FRIENDSHIP CENTRE. THIS KIND OF PARTICIPATION WITH LOCAL COMMUNITY INITIATIVES WILL HELP US TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE PREVENTION OF AIDS.

IN FEBRUARY, THE ANNOUNCEMENTWAS MADE THAT \$600,000
WOULD BE ALLOCATED TO LAUNCH A TERRITORIAL WIDE CAMPAIGN
TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE PREVENTION OF AIDS AND
THE HAZARDS OF TOBACCO USE. LOCAL PEOPLE HAVE BEEN
SELECTED TO CARRY OUT THE CAMPAIGN. THESE INDIVIDUALS WILL
RECEIVE SPECIFIC TRAINING TO PREPARE THEM TO PROVIDE HEALTH
INFORMATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE REGIONS AND COMMUNITIES.
INFORMATION IS BEING DEVELOPED IN THE OFFICIAL LANGUAGES OF
THE N.W.T., AND, STARTING IN THE NEW YEAR, WILL BE DELIVERED
TO EACH HOUSEHOLD. ORAL PRESENTATIONS ARE ALSO BEING
PRODUCED.

NATIVE THEATRE GROUPS ARE ASSISTING THE AIDS PROGRAM STAFF
TO ADDRESS THIS HEALTH ISSUE IN THE NORTH. NEGOTIATIONS
ARE CONTINUING WITH TUNOONIQ (POND INLET PLAYERS) FOR THE
PRODUCTION OF RADIO DRAMAS IN INUKTITUT FOR USE IN THE
CENTRAL AND EASTERN ARCTIC. RADIO DRAMAS IN VARIOUS DENE
LANGUAGES WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE NEW YEAR. CURRENTLY, THE
NATIVE THEATRE GROUP IN YELLOWKNIFE IS DEVELOPING A SERIES
OF RADIO DRAMAS FOR USE IN THE WESTERN ARCTIC. THE
ENGLISH VERSION WILL BE RELEASED ON WORLD AIDS DAY -

DECEMBER 1, 1989. ON THIS DAY, THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, INFORMATION WILL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE PUBLIC ABOUT HIV INFECTION AND ITS RESULTING DISEASE, AIDS.

SINCE 1987 IT HAS BEEN KNOWN THAT SOME PERSONS IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES ARE INFECTED WITH THE HIV VIRUS. AS OF OCTOBER 1, 1989 THERE WERE SEVEN SUCH PERSONS. THE NUMBER OF INFECTED PERSONS IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES MAY IN FACT BE MANY MORE THAN SEVEN BECAUSE OF THE EXCEEDINGLY LONG INCUBATION PERIOD.

ON AVERAGE, IT MAY BE TEN YEARS FROM THE TIME A PERSON
BECOMES INFECTED BEFORE HE OR SHE BECOMES ILL ENOUGH TO
SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION. THESE PERSONS MAY THEN, OVER A
LONG PERIOD OF TIME, UNKNOWINGLY CONTINUE TO INFECT
OTHERS.

IT IS EXTREMELY DIFFICULT TO TARGET PROGRAMS OF PREVENTION OR CONTROL, AND TO PROJECT THE NEED FOR CARE RESOURCES, WHEN IT IS NOT KNOWN WHAT THE NUMBERS MAY BE, OR IN WHAT AGE GROUPS OR AREAS INFECTION IS SPREADING.

THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION IS PROMOTING A METHOD WHICH WILL FIND OUT THESE FACTORS; IT IS CALLED <u>UNLINKED</u>

ANONYMOUS SCREENING OR UAS. THE UAS METHOD TESTS A

LARGE NUMBER OF BLOOD SAMPLES WITHOUT KNOWING THE

IDENTITY OF THE PERSONS INVOLVED. THE RESULT OF THE

SCREENING GIVES A RELIABLE INDICATION OF THE DEGREE TO

WHICH INFECTION HAS SPREAD IN AN AREA. AT NO TIME DURING OR

AFTER THE SCREENING IS IT POSSIBLE TO IDENTIFY THE INDIVIDUALS

CONCERNED.

THE NEED TO ESTABLISH LEVELS OF HIV INFECTION IN NORTHWEST TERRITORIES POPULATIONS IS OF VITAL IMPORTANCE TO THE FUTURE HEALTH OF NORTHWEST TERRITORIES RESIDENTS. AFTER OBTAINING THIS INFORMATION WE WILL BE BETTER ABLE TO ESTIMATE THE LEVELS OF HIV INFECTION; THE INFORMATION WILL BE GATHERED UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE CHIEF MEDICAL HEALTH OFFICER.

THIS INFORMATION WILL HELP OFFICIALS TO PLAN MORE
EFFICIENTLY FOR THE FUTURE HEALTH CARE OF THOSE INFECTED

WITH HIV, AND HELP THEM TO DETERMINE WHETHER PROGRAMS
AIMED AT PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF AIDS ARE WORKING.

MR. SPEAKER, THE MEDICAL DIRECTOR RECENTLY ATTENDED A MEETING ON AIDS IN GREENLAND; ALL CIRCUMPOLAR COUNTRIES WERE REPRESENTED. A PERMANENT TECHNICAL GROUP WAS SET UP TO LOOK AT THE VARIOUS PROBLEMS THAT AIDS PRESENTS TO THE PEOPLES OF THE CIRCUMPOLAR NATIONS.

LATER THIS MONTH, THE AIDS PROGRAM COORDINATOR WILL BE
MEETING WITH A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE YUKON AIDS
PROGRAM TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION ABOUT AIDS PROGRAMS
AND EXPLORE JOINT INITIATIVES IN AIDS EDUCATION.
