## Initiative to Research the Feasibility of a Common inuit Orthography

- WHEREAS Inuit Circumpolar Conference Resolution 89-34, adopted July 28 1989 by the ICC General Assembly in Sisimiut, Greenland, directs the ICC Executive Council "to establish a committee, consisting of two members from each of the nation states to research the feasibility of a common writing system throughout the circumpolar region":
- WHEREAS a research project of this type was carried out in Canada during the 1970s by the Inuit Tapirisat of Canada;
- WHEREAS a similar research project carried out across the circumpolar world in the 1990s would serve as a valuable instrument to improve the ability of inuit of different nation states and different regions in Canada to communicate with each other;
- WHEREAS such a research project would encourage discussion on the role of language development in the strengthening of Inuit culture;
- WHEREAS some misunderstanding of the intent of the ICC resolution appears have taken place, which may have caused concern among Keewatin Inuit; and
- WHEREAS inuit who are partial to one writing system or another have nothing to fear from a research project designed and carried out by inuit in a democratic fashion under the suspices of a respected inuit body such as the ICC;
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 1990 Annual General Meeting of the Keewatin Inuit Association, having carefully reviewed ICC Resolution 89-34, is in complete support of the intent of this resolution and will do everything possible to encourage and facilitate the work of the committee to be formed as result of this resolution;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the KIA has complete confidence that the feelings and opinions of Keewatin Inuit will be respected and taken into account by the committee;
