Dear Sir.

At the Synod of the Diocese of the Arctic which met in 1984 there was a long discussion and a great deal of distress expressed over the matter of artificial abortions. After that Synod I wrote to the various auth both Territorial and Federal expressing our concern. The response we got was encouraging.

At the recent Synod the matter was again raised and I was directed to inform you and the appropriate health authorities that we are still concerned and affirm the position taken by our Church as outlined in the attached document.

With regard to this matter there was also considerable concern expressed because it would appear that when people approach the authorities about the possibility of an abortion only materials from the 'Pro-Choice' side of the issue are made readily available. We are calling on the health authorities to make materials from the 'Pro-Life' side of the issue equally available and would ask you to use your influence and authority to do the same.
