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WATER AND SEWAGE SERVICES SUBSIDY POLICY

AMENDMENTS

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THREE COMPONENTS

1. Extend the Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Policy to include all Towns and Villages.

Eliminate the Trucked Water Delivery Subsidy Program to Towns and Villages.

- 2. Raise subsidized residential and non-profit rates.
- 3. Reduction of the subsidy level to commercial user in Hamlets, Charter Communities, Other Designated Communities.

WATER/SEWER SUBSIDY CABINET SUBMISSION

Background

- April 1992 NWTAM requested the commercial rate subsidy provisions in Hamlets be extended to tax-based municipalities.
- November 1992 FMB approves Expenditure Reduction Implementation Committee recommendation to phase in commercial subsidy reductions in hamlets, charter communities, settlements.
- Third Session (December 2, 1992) MLA for Nahendeh (Mr. Antoine) presses Minister to extend Water and Sewage Services Subsidy to tax-based municipalities. Cites issue of inequitable treatment compared to hamlets.
- January 1993 Town Council of Inuvik requests Department of Municipal and Community Affairs to enter into a Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Agreement.
- Town of Hay River and Village of Fort Simpson continue to request extension of WSSS Policy to them and other tax-based municipalities.
- April 1993 commencement of a three year Block Funding Agreement with the City of Yellowknife removing the City from on-going water delivery subsidy arrangements.
- April/June 1993 MACA submitted a "net budgeting" proposal to amend the Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Policy and subsidized rates by Cabinet Submission and companion FMB Submission.

-- THE PRESENT POLICY --

Igaluit and Norman Wells (since April 1991)

- · Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Policy applies
- Subsidized Residential and Non-Profit Rate is \$0.0022/litre (or about 1 cent a gallon)
- Subsidized Commercial Rate for Businesses \$0.0044/litre (or 2 cents a gallon) <u>limited to 50 percent of water consumed</u>

Other Villages and Towns

- · Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Policy has <u>not</u> applied.
- Water Delivery Subsidy Tax-Based Communities Program
 - 1) applies only to Fort Smith at present and Yellowknife (through City Block Funding Agreement)
 - 2) Trucked water delivery <u>only</u> (not for sewage collection)
 - 3) Residential users pay flat rate of \$5.00 a month for first 4,000 litres and \$5.00 for next 2,000 litres.

"Ad hoc" Water Delivery Subsidy

- 1) applies to Hay River and Fort Simpson (on-island only)
- 2) <u>only</u> for trucked water delivery
- 3) residential users <u>only</u> they pay \$5.00 per month regardless of water consumption.

Hamlets, Charter Communities, Settlements

- · Subsidized Residential and Non-Profit Rate is \$0.0022/litre.
- Subsidized Commercial Rate is \$0.0044/litre (FMB has directed this be limited to apply to only 50 percent of water consumption).
- · Subsidies for both water delivery and sewage collection/disposal.

Special Service Areas

- 1) Subsidy provided under Water and Sewage Services Subsidy Policy.
- 2) To <u>residential and non-profit users</u> in selected areas outside designated service areas (Hay River/Enterprise Corridor, Salt Plains Indian Reserve Area).
- 3) Subsidy only for trucked water delivery.
- 4) Flat subsidized rate of \$15.33 per 1000 gallons (about \$0.0033/litre) user pays no more than \$15.33/1000 gallons.

· <u>Indirect Subsidies</u>

<u>Piped</u> Services - Fort Simpson and Inuvik Rates charged to government users cross subsidize rates charged to residential, non-profit and commercial users.

^{*} Of this, \$206,000 was allocated in 1993/94 to Yellowknife under the City Block Funding Agreement -- no further water/sewage subsidy provisions apply.

Principles

- 1) Residents of the Northwest Territories should be entitled to basic water and sewage services to safeguard their health.
- 2) Basic water and sewage services should be provided to Northwest Territories residents on an equitable and affordable basis.
- 3) Municipal governments should exercise authority and responsibility for the delivery of water and sewage services in their communities.
- 4) Water and sewage services should be provided by municipal governments in the most efficient manner possible.

HOW THE SUBSIDY WORKS:

• The Water and Sewage Services Subsidy pays the difference between the ECONOMIC RATE in each community and the SUBSIDIZED RATE.

• Economic Rate

Means the blended average cost per litre incurred in a <u>town</u>, <u>village</u>, hamlet, charter community, or <u>designated community</u> in providing trucked and piped water and sewage services to users within its boundary.

For example, in Fort McPherson:

Economic Rate = Cost of Piped Service + Cost of Trucked Service
Estimated Total Metered Water Consumption

= \$\frac{\$690,898}{25,307,619} = \$0.0273/litre

Subsidy = (Economic Rate - Subsidized Rate)

Subsidy Paid For Residential and Non Profit

Users = \$0.0273 - \$0.0022

= \$0.0251/litre

or \$25.10/1000 litres

Subsidized Rate

The "Yellowknife Rate"

- is used as a guide or proxy for an affordable subsidized rate
- means the cost per litre charged for piped water/sewage service to residential customers in the City of Yellowknife.
- term is misunderstood:
 - 1) Because the rate in the policy is <u>not</u> the actual arate charged per litre for piped water/sewage service to residential users in Yellowknife (it is close, but is <u>not</u> identical).
 - 2) It implies that the City of Yellowknife, rather than GNWT, determines the affordable rate in the WSSS Policy (not true).

WATER & SEWAGE SERVICES POLICY AMENDMENTS AND RATE CHANGES

- Towns and Villages (TV) residential subsidized rate to be \$0.0033/litre as of June 1, 1994. Commercial subsidized rate to be \$0.0044/litre for 50% consumption
- Fort Simpson "Off Island" as Special Service Area for residential users at \$0.0044/litre as of June 1, 1994
- Increase subsidized rate to Hamlets & Designated Communities (HC) residential users as of June 1, 1994 to \$0.0027/litre in Year One. Year Two subsidized rate to be \$0.0033/litre subject to FMB review
- Special Service Area rates to be raised to \$0.0037/litre June 1, 1994 and to \$0.0044/litre on April 1, 1995
- Reduce the subsidized commercial rate in Hamlets and Designated Communities from \$0.0044/litre for 100% of consumption to \$0.0044/litre for the 90% consumption and the remainder at the economic rate as of June 1, 1994. Further reductions subject to FMB review
- Eliminate Trucked Water Delivery Subsidy Program to Tax Based Municipalities
