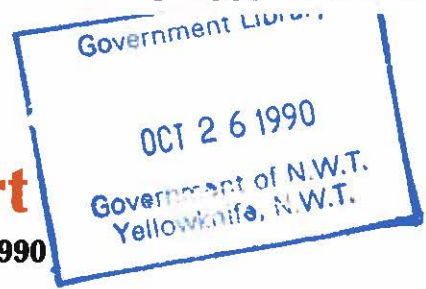

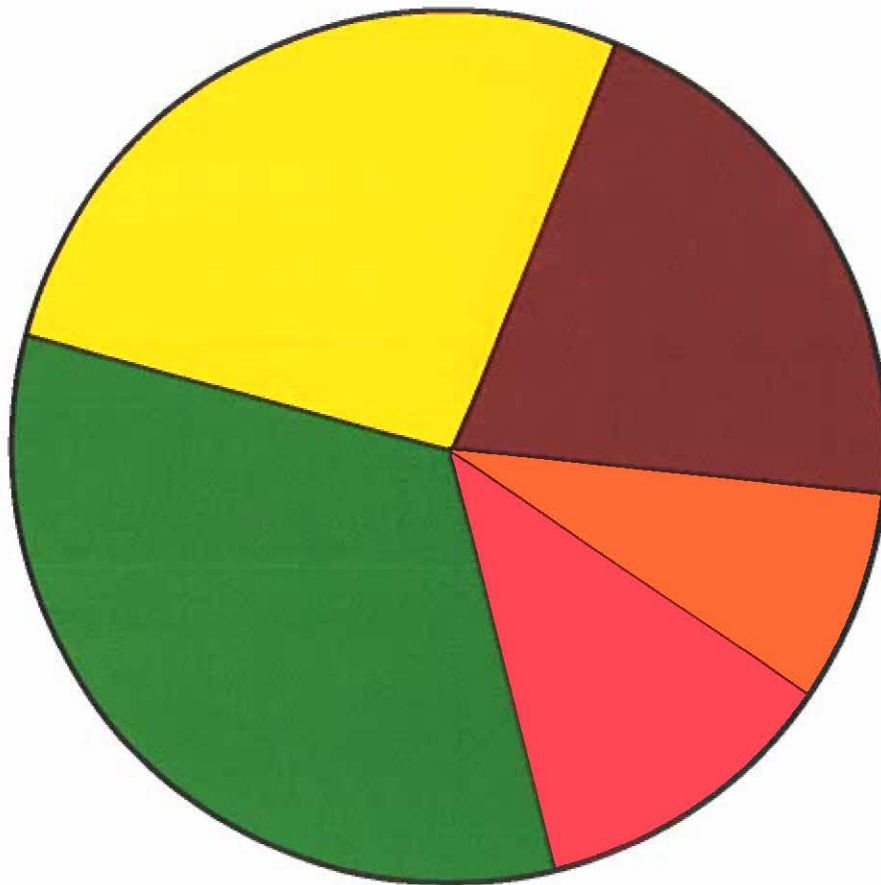

(000's)**



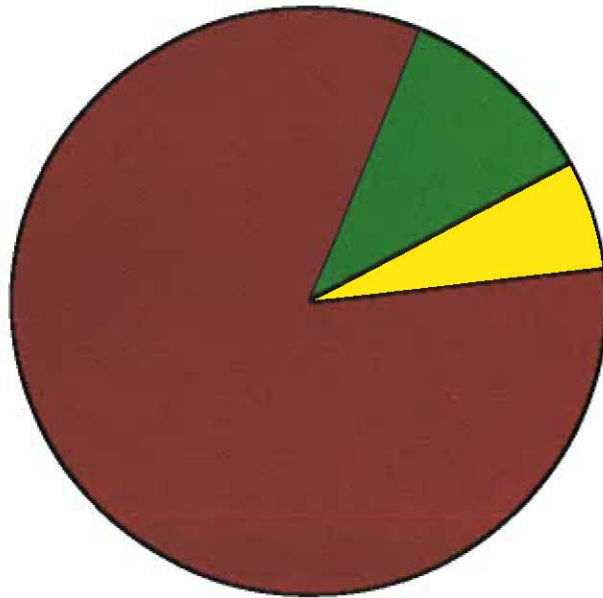

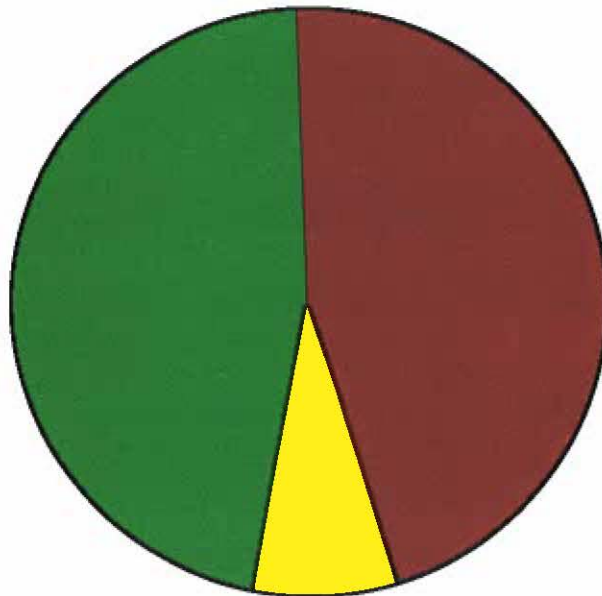

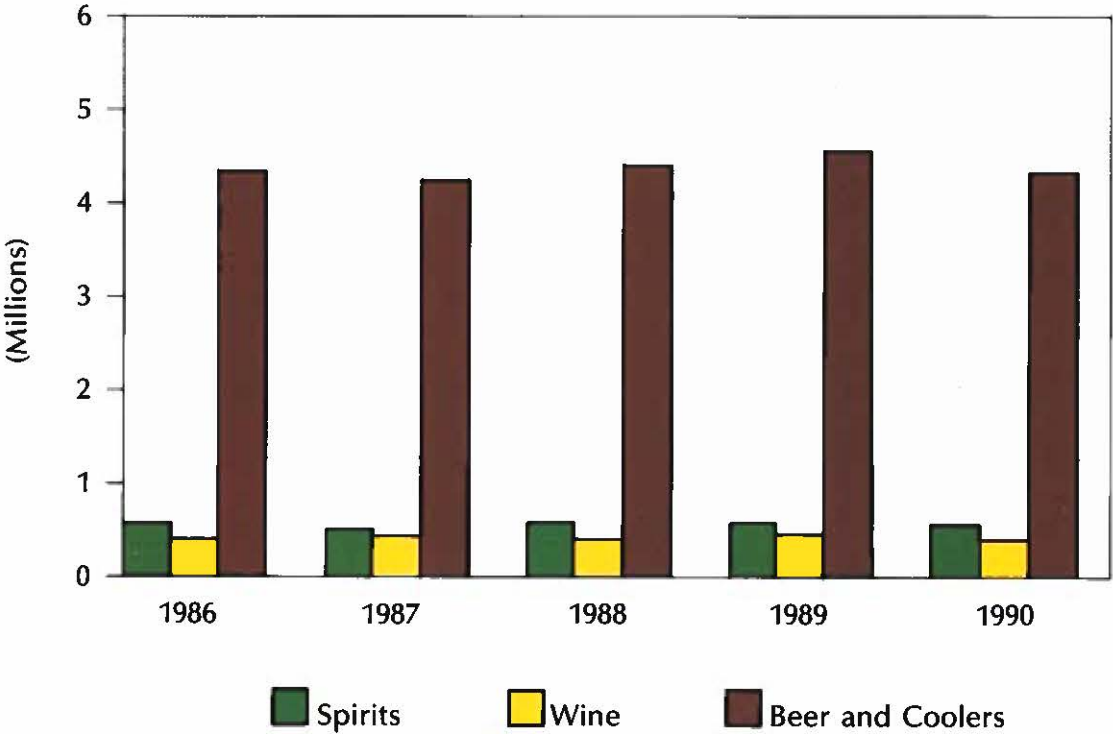
**Litres of Absolute

■ Beer 45.8% ■ Spirits 47.8% ■ Wine 6.4%



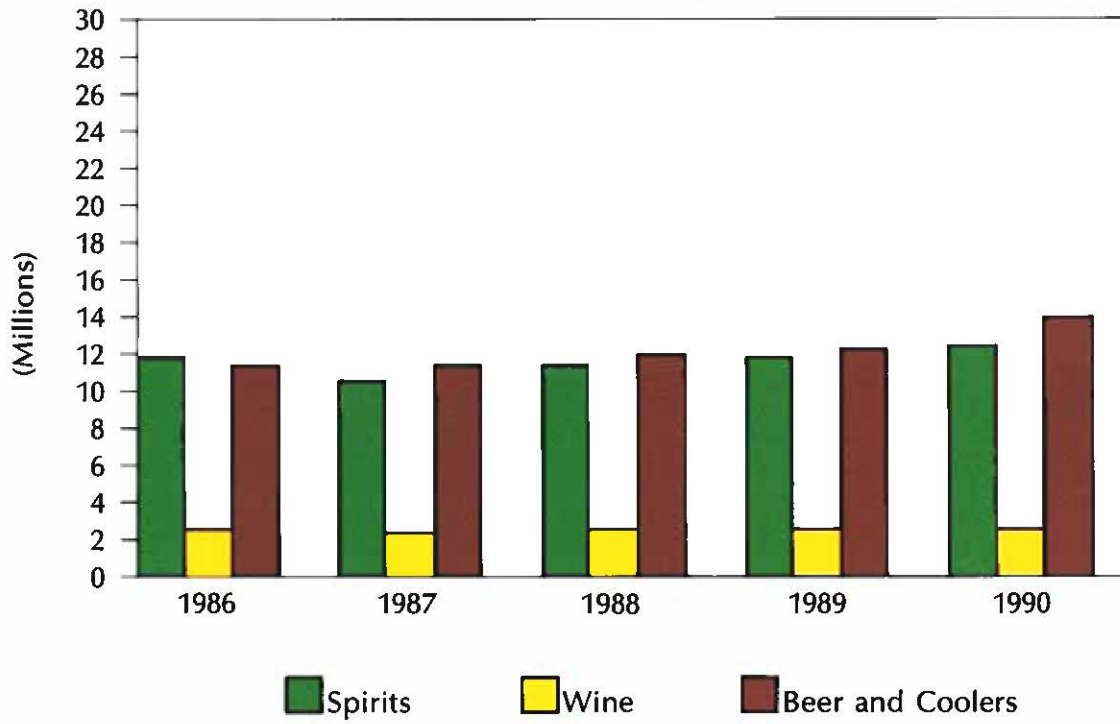
Five Year Sales History

AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Minister responsible for the
Northwest Territories Liquor Commission

I have examined the balance sheet of the Northwest Territories Liquor Commission as at March 31, 1990 and the statements of income and changes in financial position for the year then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests and other procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

Notes to Financial Statements
March 31, 1990

1. Operations

The Northwest Territories Liquor Commission is responsible for the operation of liquor stores and the purchase, sale and distribution of liquor in the Northwest Territories under Part II of the Northwest Territories Liquor Act. The Commission is authorized by the Legislative Assembly to receive working capital advances from time to time not exceeding \$5,500,000 to finance its operations. The Legislative Assembly increased this amount to \$6,500,000 on April 10, 1990.

Net income for the year is to be transferred to the Government of the Northwest Territories in accordance with the Liquor Act.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

These financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year. A summary of the significant accounting policies of the Commission is as follows:

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the landed cost at each liquor store.

Fixed assets

Buildings, furnishings and fixtures are owned and paid for by the Government of the Northwest Territories. They are provided for the use of the Commission without charge and are not reflected in the financial statements.

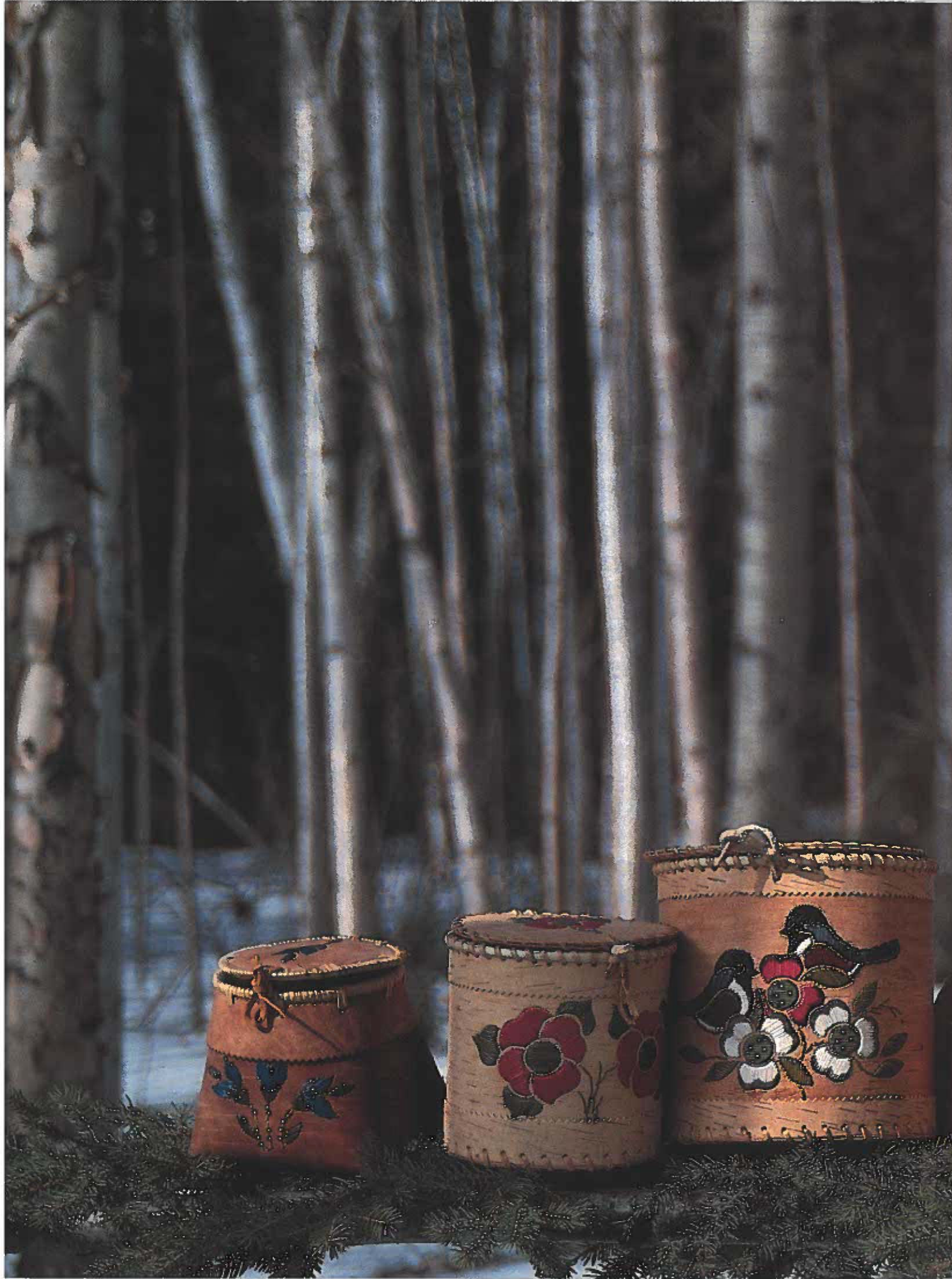

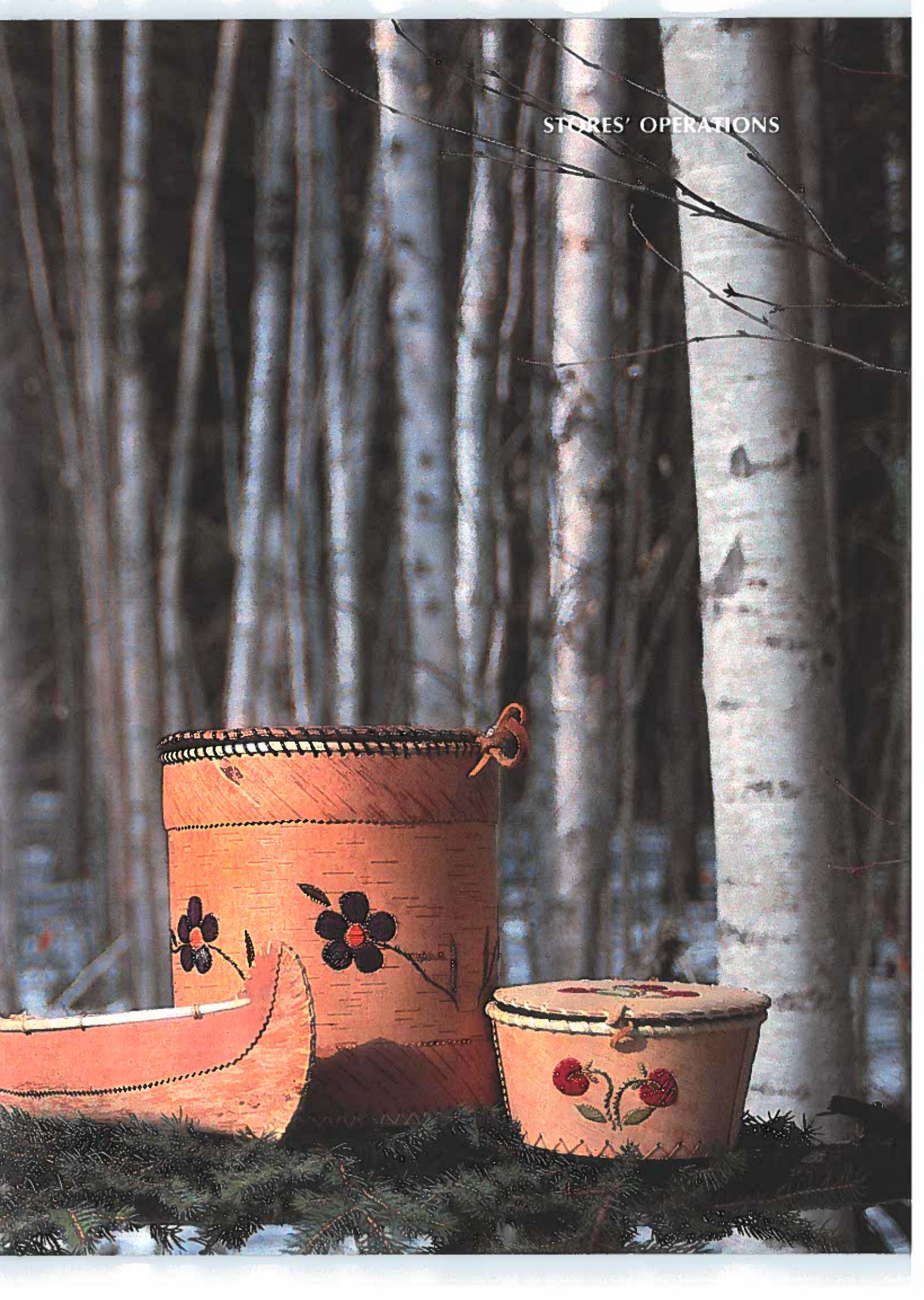
