Re: Pudlak Comments on Resolute Bay

Mr. Pudlak's comments on DPW's involvement with the Resolute Bay water line is an indicator of the tremendous waste and inefficiency of the public service.

It's already costly enough to provide the basic municipal services to our remote communities let alone have those costs escalated by the waste and inefficiency of those providing the service.

There seems to be little effort on the part of this government- MLA's or management -to come to terms with what's really happening. Yes, I do appreciate the tremendous inertia that accompanies the buerocracy and time for all the paper to flow through all the layers but isn't a little ridiculous to have thousands of employees who do nothing but that, and spend millions on consultants to do zip?

If this continues, then the only reasonable solution is to eliminate the middle man (the GNWT) and negotiate directly with the federal government for the funds to provide those services and provide them in a more efficient manner. You have already seen some progress on this front.
