pcp number??? This should have been provided the same day not 1 week later. I will expect it this morning. Along with his Lot number and date on the product with picture. Today!

Environmental Health Officers <u>Investigate complaints of mould</u>, growth in public places and in rental housing where a landlord has failed to take corrective action. Mould growth, regardless of type or colour, must be removed once the moisture is eliminated. Moisture control is the answer to mould control: no moisture=no mould growth.

Hi Lisa,

I did go over the Lanky Court Apartments, but I did not find the pest control operator or get an opportunity to view the common areas of the building.

In this context, the significant public health concern is a potential misapplication of a pesticide. I've requested information from the pest control operator and will confirm that the operator has a valid pesticide business permit as required by the NT <u>Pesticide Regulations</u>. Once I have the requested information, I'll review the pesticide's safety data to evaluate the landlord's notice to tenants for appropriate human exposure prevention recommendations.

Regarding the mould-affected apartment, my understanding is that the landlord is actively undertaking repairs. The DHSS Environmental Health Unit does not undertake "environmental assessments for mould"; rather, if there is visible mould on interior spaces, then these recommendations should be followed: https://www.canada.ca/en/health-canada/services/air-quality/indoor-air-contaminants/reduce-humidity-moisture-mould.html.
