NWT JOBS IN DEMAND: 20-Year Forecast

What are "Jobs in Demand"?

We hear this term a lot when people are looking for a job or considering a new career pathway. So, what does *Jobs in Demand* mean?

Jobs in demand is a phrase that is used to describe a process that statisticians and people in forecasting supply demand look at. The methodology used to determine forecasted supply or jobs that will be in high demand with NWT employers is based on the forecasted **replacement** of people currently in jobs due to historic migration and retirement/death patterns, as well as forecast modeling based on historic economic and industry **expansion**, including historic Gross Domestic Product models. These indicators provide the basis for forecasted **Job Openings** or forecasted **Jobs in Demand**.

Occupations are grouped together by skill level which is determined by a general set of skills, education, experience, knowledge, and competencies required to perform the duties within the job. These occupation groupings have been developed by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) called the National Occupation Classification (NOC) code that is used universally across Canada, to categorize occupations by skill level.

GNWT's <u>Department of Education</u>, <u>Culture and Employment (ECE)</u> uses the NOC code when discussing NWT's <u>Jobs in Demand</u>.

ECE is linking the **NWT Top 110 Forecasted Jobs in Demand** to the National <u>Job Bank</u>'s job profiles. This will assist NWT residents in understanding jobs and the required skills, education, experience, knowledge, and competencies required to secure that job.

This document reflects median wages and not average wages. Median wages represent the middle wage in a list of all wages, while average wages are calculated by adding up all the wages and dividing by the total number of people. Median wages are less affected by extreme values, while the average wage can be influenced by a few very high or very low wages.
