Our staff support your efforts to obtain funding for treatment facilities for the youth of the NWT. Having to deal daily with students who are involved with substance abuse, we recognize the absolute need for a youth treatment centre for Yellowknife itself, much less one for the entire NWT.

Many students have been "sentenced" to school when they should have been directed to a treatment centre. Their needs cannot be met in a school setting because of the severity of their problems. The other program which needs addressing is the situation into which they must return. Many family situations do not lend themselves to successful rehabilitation upon the release from treatment centres.
