Dear Mr. Minister,

We have just learned that the Federal Government has made an offer to the provinces and territories to extend the Canada Infrastructure Works Program to cover the 1997 construction year.

The past Canadian Infrastructure Program was a successful cooperative venture among the three tiers of Government (Federal, Territorial, Municipal). A large part of the program's success could be attributed to the willingness of municipalities and Aboriginal groups who achieve consensus on community priorities.
