

Re, The Architect's Act

Dear Member,



Architecturatiz

The NWT Architectural Society has drafted an Act and has circulated it to the allied design professionals, the NWT Construction Association and the Committee of Canadian Architectural Councils for comment. The comments have been received and we have a package ready to submit to the Department of Justice for final drafting. In short, we have done all the ground work. Now it is up to you to see that this Act makes it to the house for passage, the well being of your constituents depends on it.

You may ask yourself, why do we need an Act <u>immediately?</u> Because:

i) The new objective based National Building Code scheduled to be introduced in 2001 will put greater responsibility into the hands of "Architects" Without an Architects Act, the NWT has no "Architects" (Design professionals qualified to make crucial decisions on the interpretation and implementation of the building code)

- ii) It has taken the NWT Architectural Society more than 10 years and three Governments to get to this stage of legislative development. If the Territories split prior to the passage of an Architects' Act, both Territories will be without legislation to regulate the practice of Architecture. This will be detrimental to the North especially in light of the building boom that is expected in the new Territory.
- iii) Architects are the only one of the profession dealing with health and safety that are not sanctioned by an Act in the NWT Legislature to practice.

As previously mentioned, the NWT Architectural Society has done the ground work, we will be self funded, all we require is your support. Please contact me, should you require background or clarification on any of the issues I have raised
