EXPRESSION OF INTEREST Correctional Facilities

The Government of the Northwest Territories intends to construct a new North Slave Correctional Facility complex in Yellowknife and a correctional facility in Inuvik.

The Yellowknife complex will consist of two separate facilities for males, a 146 bed adult facility and a 24 bed young offender facility. The separation between the two facilities must meet the intent of the Young Offenders Act.

The Inuvik facility will consist of a 12 bed female young offender facility.

The new facilities shall be designed on a podular approach, consistent with GNWT Corrections philosophy of direct supervision of inmates. All facilities will be designed to accept future expansion.

The areas of the facilities are as follows:

- Adult Male Facility 5,000 sq. meters net or 6,700 sq. meters gross
- Young Male Offender Facility 1,000 sq. meters net or 1,700 meters gross

Young Female Offender Facility - 844 sq. meters net or 1,355 meters gross

The GNWT invites all registered architectural designers with extensive experience in designing correctional facilities to submit proposals to the GNWT Department of Public Works & Services in Yellowknife. The proposals shall include the project teams, per diem cost by team member, past relevant experience of the company and specific experience in designing podular direct supervision correctional facilities.

The review committee will review all proposals and prepare a list for use by Northern Consultants of qualified sub-consultants to work with in designing the North Slave Correctional Facilities.
